EXECUTIVE OVERVIEW

SIGNIFICANT ACHIEVEMENTS

- **Continuation of Team X-Treme**

Four years ago Point Danger Branch determined that it was necessary to create a youth program that focused on educational opportunities, leadership skills and integration/introduction to other facets of life saving external to beach patrols and surf sports. As a result of this Team X-Treme was born. In the first 3 years the program was run by the funded Development Officers. At the end of 2013/2014 this funding ceased. The Branch determined that the program was still relevant to the Clubs and members and was achieving goals related to its initial implementation. As such, the Branch hired a former Team X-Treme graduate to coordinate the program and ensure its future survival. Full statistics are available in the Youth Development Report.

- **Partnership with RAP Police to provide Emergency Response lectures to Youth**

As a lifesaving entity it is essential that we maintain working relationships with other emergency response agencies to ensure currency in response techniques and knowledge of the operations that may assist Surf Life Saving in performing essential lifesaving services. This season we were fortunate to have Queensland Police Officers from the Gold Coast based Rapid Action Patrol Squad to speak to the Team X-Treme participants about multi agency responses in emergency situations. Team X-Treme also featured in an episode of the nationally syndicated TV show Gold Coast Cops.

- **Fundraising for Youth Account**

To continue our dedication to the development of Youth in the Branch, the Executive Committee has committed to assist the Branch Youth in raising funds to assist in subsidising their many activities. It is envisaged that this funding will assist clubs to send members, leaders and mentors to camps to ensure that all members, regardless of financial status have the opportunity to attend programs to assist in their development as life savers.

- **Continuation of Oceans 38 as a major funding initiative**

At the close of the 2013/2014 season the six year partnership with Sizzler came to an end. It was determined by the Branch in conjunction with Oceans 38 partner South Coast Branch, that the event was viable and despite a lack of sponsor, Sunshine Coast Branch withdrawing from the group and SLSQ running Ocean Assault which clashed with some of the scheduled events a decision was made to keep the Oceans 38 event alive. A new sponsor was gained –



BEKO and two events were run on the Gold Coast in January and February 2015.

Significantly, although the sponsorship had decreased, expenditure was streamlined which allowed the following goals to be reached:

- \$5900 in prize money distributed to members
- \$2000 in host fees distributed to clubs
- \$8000 in donations distributed to each Branch
- \$1000 in donations given to Gold Coast Youth
- Retention of long standing event partner – Staminade

- **Celebration of 90th Anniversary**

Point Danger Branch stands proudly as the first and oldest Branch in Queensland and was proud to celebrate its 90th Anniversary with a celebration involving current members, Life Members and dignitaries. Our history is one of honour, dedication, enthusiasm and strong advocacy for clubs and members. This is a heritage that we are proud of and intend to carry on, on behalf of our clubs, members, Life Members and of course, the men and women who built this Branch to what it is today.

- **Building Renovations**

Over the last decade the Branch Executive has slowly renovated the Branch Headquarters to ensure a modern, functioning space for the administrative activities to be carried out. We were fortunate enough this season to gain \$33000.00 in funding from the Gambling Community Benefit Fund to renovate the ground floor. This included :

- Rendered/Painted walls
- Male bathroom refurbishment
- New blinds
- New windows
- New cupboards for storage and archive purposes

There are only minor items to be actioned within the building in our Minor Works Program throughout the coming season. Major items required will be a replacement to the roof – grants are being applied for at present. This will ensure that every part of the Branch office has been renovated and/or rebuilt over the last decade.

- **Implementation of inaugural High Performance Squad**

In recent seasons the idea of a PDB High Performance Squad had been considered – this season with the generous financial support of Ricoh we have been able to implement the squad. All members of the PDB Representative Team are automatically included into the squad and invitations are sent to members of the clubs. In consultation with the Club Coaches, Selection Committee and Team Management the squad is chosen. This season 90+ members have joined the squad and participated in various sessions including pool rescue, sprints and water skills are available to develop surf sports skills.

DELIVERY OF CORE LIFE SAVING SERVICE

Maintenance of effective and efficient lifesaving services takes an amazing amount of work by the volunteers. The clubs have to ensure that members are registered, proficient and skilled in more than one award and properly outfitted before they patrol the beach. It is a monumental effort to staff a beach with volunteers for 7 ½ months per year as well as running surf sports, nipper and youth programs. Statistically the clubs have performed well throughout the season with 212 rescues performed, 1249 first aid cases, and 740 preventative actions and 6819 people warned.

This season saw assistance for Bilinga SLSC patrols by members of Point Danger Branch. This assisted the club in maintaining the provisions of their Patrol Agreement throughout the season. Full details of life saving statistics can be found under Operations – Life Saving Service.

MANAGEMENT OF FISCAL POLICY

The Branch has maintained their budget this season with few unexpected expenses which has allowed the Branch to consolidate their financial position for the future. We are currently in the 2nd year of the 3 year funding agreement with the City of Gold Coast. This allows us to ensure a set amount of funds per annum and pass on half of these funds to clubs for the purchase and/or maintenance of essential lifesaving equipment.

We also had an increase in sponsorship this season with some new sponsors for the Branch Representative Team which assists in offsetting the costs of the team. Further the Branch has been lucky enough to have some sponsors who also provide in-kind support for the Branch and its activities.

Our major grant funding for the season was from Gambling Community Benefit Fund for building renovations. Whilst the Branch has been saving money towards the renovations, this will now be retained as the grant covered the costs of the renovation. Grants are being applied for regularly to assist in funding the activities of the Branch.

CORPORATE AND OPERATIONAL GOVERNANCE

Corporate and Operational Governance continues to be a priority for the Branch with the creation and continuation of programs, policies and procedures to assist the clubs, members and Branch in maintaining compliance and adherence to related regulations and legislations.

It is the intention of the Branch to take this area further and enhance the training and development of senior club management and office bearers by providing executive leadership training (ELT). During this process we will look at contemporary management and leadership strongly focusing on strategy and performance.

Part of this program is the creation of internal Branch Policy's relative to the requirement of the Branch. Current policies that are being worked on include Use of Branch Logo/IP, Use of Social Media and Representative Team/High Performance Squad Policy.

Further work is being carried out will be in relation to Administration Workshops, Presidents Inductions and Office Bearers Inductions. These will be redesigned towards contemporary life saving management and general management inclusive of Organisational Change Management and Probity tools for clubs.

CYRM workshops will continue again this season. Point Danger Branch is the only Branch to run this workshop and this has ensured compliance for the clubs relative to this legislative requirement of the CYRM. We will continue to identify any issues that our clubs have with compliance to any strategy and provide the necessary support to assist them.

Point Danger Branch will continue to focus on relative IT strategies that can assist the clubs and Branch in decreasing red tape and slowly becoming a paperless office where possible. Updates to the website and Branch social media have commenced and will assist in this process going forward.

Strategy and performance by way of executive leadership has been considered the way forward for Point Danger Branch.

STRATEGIC PLAN

We are at the end of the current strategic plan and preparations are being made toward the creation of a new plan for the Branch and its clubs to go forward (this includes applying for a grant to cover the cost of the plan). Consultation with key stakeholders will be paramount to the new plan to ensure that the goals of the Branch reflect that of its clubs and members. The current strategic plan is split into two areas – (1) direct outcomes for the Branch as an entity and (2) outcomes for the affiliated clubs.

FUTURE CHALLENGES

- **Adoption of Systems Approach to provide Support**

The Branch will be investigating and implementing strategies to assist our clubs, members and senior managers in their day to day operations. This will include the increased use of technology based applications for better customer service including online Team Managers Declarations, online club Officials Nominations (to compliment the individual officials online nominations) and use of social media to increase communication to members and the community. To this end we will be researching training opportunities for Branch and Club staff in social media.

- **Maintain Ongoing Commitment to Developing Youth**

The Branch youth program Team X-Treme has provided much needed support to clubs and members over a 4 year period – assisting in the development and up skilling of youth members. Resources will continue to be directed towards this program. Further, the Branch will implement funding strategies to ensure continued available funding for youth development activities within the Branch.

- **Continue to Provide contemporary and effective strategies in beach safety**

The Branch continues to be committed to the up skilling and training of its members. This is provided through a comprehensive training and development calendar that is distributed to all clubs and made available to members to provide additional opportunities for members to gain essential lifesaving skills.

- **Ongoing Compliance Strategy's**

Strategy's to assist the clubs to remain compliant is an area at the forefront of the Branch's future strategy. Existing programs such as CYRM workshops, Junior Information Nights will continue. New programs inclusive of new office bearer's inductions and Presidents briefings will commence. Coupled with HR management, these strategies should assist the clubs greatly in ensuring compliance. Streamlining of existing Branch documentation will be carried out.

- **Managing Internal Organisational Change**

Working with key stakeholders, clubs and members on adapting to change including their transition process through any organisational changes that may occur futuristically. This will include leading the clubs through an understanding and appreciation of change management and assisting them in developing tools and techniques to manage change – ensuring a focus on stakeholder needs and contemporary management issues



MEMBERSHIP

Overall Membership

This season has seen a 2.06% increase in overall membership across the Branch from 5318 in season 13/14 to 5428 in season 14/15 - an overall increase of 110 members in total. This is a positive step forward for the Branch and its clubs. Prior to this the Branch had experienced 2 seasons of decline in membership.

Our highest membership peaked in 11/12 at 6229, this occurred in line with a national advertising and membership recruitment campaign.

Club Membership

Seven of the eleven affiliated clubs have experienced an increase in membership throughout the season compared with only 4 clubs last season posting an increase. The largest increase in membership was experienced by Currumbin SLSC (+93 members), closely followed by Palm Beach SLSC (+75 members). Palm Beach SLSC and TH&C SLSC have shown concurrent gains in the last two seasons.

Four clubs have posted a decrease this season with the largest decrease noted at Coolangatta SLSC (-76 members). Pacific SLSC and Coolangatta SLSC have shown concurrent decreases in membership over the last two seasons.



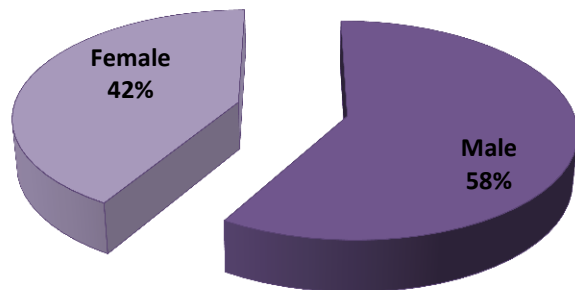
Active Membership

SLSQ Point Danger Branch experienced an overall increase in Active Membership in season 2014/2015 compared to a decrease in season 2013/2014. Two Membership categories experienced a decrease – Active Cadet (-19) and Active Senior (-45). The Active Junior category increased by 79 members overall. As such the overall increase in active membership was 15.

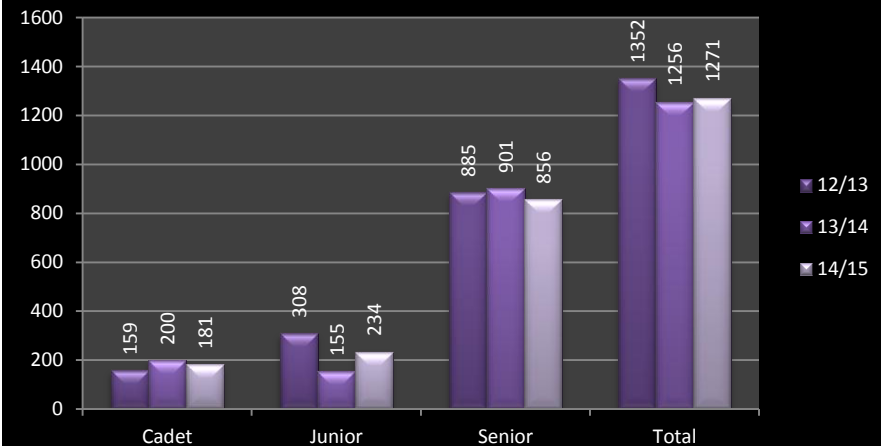
Supporting active categories have also experienced changes in membership numbers. There has been a significant increase in Award Membership from 35 in 13/14 to 85 in 14/15. Long Service Membership has decreased for the first time in 3 years with a decrease of 13 members. Reserve Active membership has increased by 2 members.

Membership by Gender

Gender comparisons over the last three seasons have noted that Male Members outnumber the Female membership. Statistically the comparison from last season to the current season has not changed with 42% membership Female and 58% Male. Cadet Members show an equality of genders with 50% in each gender.

OPERATIONS - LIFE SAVING SERVICE

In the completion of the 2014/2015 season of life saving, it was pleasing to note that again, no lives were lost between the flags. The volunteer life savers of Point Danger Branch have again patrolled the beaches with dedication and eagerness and have worked to upskill themselves and fellow members in essential lifesaving skills and awards. Our continued presence on the beaches of the southern Gold Coast has kept the bathing and beach going public safe.

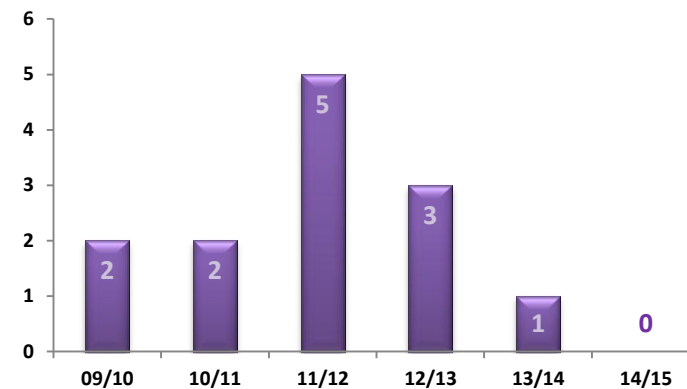
The logistics and administration behind the volunteer patrols is comprehensive with many specialist volunteers contributing to the clubs to ensure the members are trained, proficient, rostered and provided with the necessary resources to ensure effective patrols are carried out throughout the season.

PATROL AGREEMENTS and PATROL OPERATIONS MANUAL

The SLSQ Patrol Operations Manual sets the minimum standards for the volunteers and clubs patrolling the beaches. Each season the clubs and members study this document to keep abreast of the necessary processes, changes to policy/procedure and any compliance requirements needed. The Clubs and Branch together sign a Patrol Service Contract which is endorsed by the SLSQ Life Saving Committee. This document holds all parties accountable for the requirements – both human and non-human that are necessary on patrols.

Point Danger Branch also uses this document and its requirements to track any breaches of policy and procedure as it relates to performing volunteer patrols. Whilst breaches are rare – they are actioned immediately to ensure compliance for the clubs. It is pleasing to note that the number of breaches has been maintained at a low level in recent seasons and zero have been recorded in 2014/2015.

Rescues and Visitations

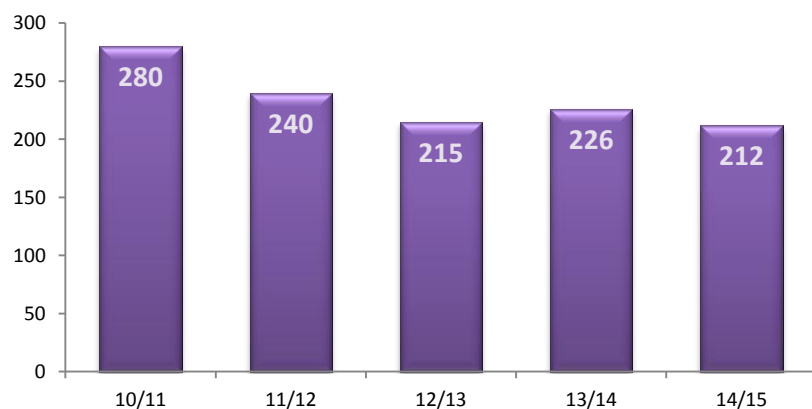
For the second consecutive year the rescue board has been utilised as the most popular piece of rescue equipment with 26.89% of rescues carried out using the board. This is an increase of 3 rescues on the rescue board from 2013/2014. Significantly the IRB has had a substantial decrease in rescues with 47 in 2014/2015 from 69 on 2013/2014. This season we have seen for the first time recorded use of the surf board as a method of rescue equipment with 8 rescues performed.

Estimated attendance at the beaches this season totalled 455443 – this is a decrease of 31775 visitations on season 2013/2014. Interestingly the highest recorded average visitations were at 11am (21.8%) and lowest recorded average was at 2:00pm (0.035%).

We had two major incidents during the season involving required CPR/Defibrillation. Both patients were in the water not breathing and CPR was performed by members at Kirra SLSC/Coolangatta SLSC and TH&C SLSC respectively.

Preventative Actions and Warnings

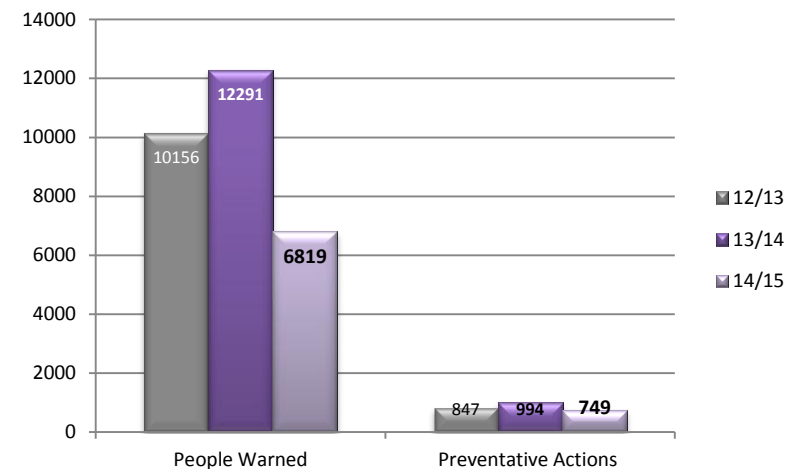
Preventative Actions and Warnings form the most important part of our patrols – preventing accident or injury before they occur. Our aim is always to be proactive instead of reactive. Preventative Actions involve searches, shark alarms, and prevention and warning signs erected. Season 2014/2015 saw the lowest amount of recorded preventative actions over the last 3 seasons with a decrease of 245 from season 2013/2014.

People Warned continues to be a high number each season but again, season 2014/2015 has seen a dramatic decrease of 5472 warnings from last season. The highest category of people warned is swimmers (69.7%) followed by beach users (15.18%) and craft users (15.12%).

First Aid Treatments & Marine Stings

This season saw a dramatic increase in the first aid injuries treated with 1249 first aid actions performed (1038 Marine Stings and 211 first aid treatments). This was an increase of 878 cases from season 13/14. Of the 1249 injuries- Minor Marine Stings formed the largest percentage of treatments (73.89%). Minor Cuts and Abrasions also continue to be a major source of injury at beaches with 147 Cuts/Abrasions treated.

LIFE SAVING FUNDING

Through the continued relationship and support from the QLD Government- Department of Community Services and SLSQ the clubs have a grant program that gives them the opportunity to apply for funding to support their volunteer services. In total the clubs gained \$51800.00 in funding which was a significant decrease on last season by \$22705.00

The Patrol Club of the Year award recognises the overall capability of the patrolling clubs in the many facets that make up volunteer patrols. Points are awarded based on patrol inspections, first aid room inspections and some administrative tasks relative to patrols including submission of statistics, patrol agreements and attendance at Branch meetings and workshops. Points are deducted for any clubs who have a substantiated patrol breach.

The Branch has been fortunate for the last nine (9) years to have State Member for Currumbin – Jann Stuckey MP support this award through the provision of a rescue board for the winning club. This continued support ensures we have an appropriate reward for the winning club and provides incentives for the clubs to win this award.

TRAINING AND EDUCATION

Some substantial changes occurred with training and education in season 2014/2015 with SLSQ taking over the training, assessing and facilitating of Emergency Care awards including ART, First Aid and Spinal Management. Point Danger Branch has, for many years run a comprehensive training calendar for clubs and members to access to gain awards that they may not have been able to gain at their clubs. This decision was met with some apprehension by the Branch, in that we had run a successful program for our clubs for over a decade and this also decreased income from courses run for the Branch. Going forward, the Branch has been liaising with SLSQ Education staff and we have been able to determine our own dates and venues for courses for PDB Members that will be trained by SLSQ staff.

Trainers and Assessors

Increasing the number of Trainers and Assessors at club level is always a priority for the Branch. An appropriate number of Trainers and Assessors across all disciplines are essential for the continued future growth of the clubs. Season 2013/2014 was a significant season for the Branch in relation to Trainers and Assessors – a lot of time was invested in updating all existing trainers and assessors to ensure that they had the correct awards. This season, by comparison has been focused on finalising Certificate 4 updates and processing new Trainers and Assessors – to this end we have gained 2 new IRB Assessors and 2 Bronze Medallion Trainers. Emphasis will again be placed on Trainers and Assessors in the coming season to assist new probationary Trainers and Assessors through their required practical components. It should be noted that with SLSQ overseeing all emergency care training that the Branch no longer has input into the activities of probationary Trainers and Assessors for Emergency Care awards.

As always recognition of the Trainers, Assessors and Facilitators is paramount to the Branch. The members who volunteer their time towards the Education portfolio log hundreds of hours to ensure that fellow members are skilled and proficient in the many awards offered by life saving. 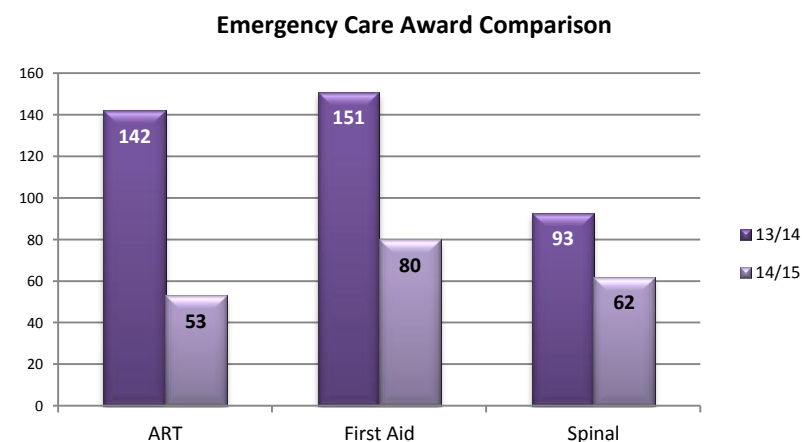
Awards and Accreditations

The Branches commitment to Training and Education through the provision of an annual calendar has continued. The Branch has held over 40 courses for members (inclusive of the courses specific to Team X-Treme) and this commitment will continue into 2015/2016 with 30+ courses scheduled into the new calendar.

It is essential for the Branch to ensure that every opportunity is available for the Clubs to educate their members in all available awards. This program of training has assisted the members in gaining new awards, the clubs in gaining skilled life savers, additional Trainers and Assessors and ensured that all levels of life saving education is available for all our members.

Emergency Care Awards

Overall in the specialist awards we have seen a decrease (excluding Beach Management with an increase of 1 award). Due to the large amount of awards gained in previous years in these awards, members are requiring proficiency only instead of new awards. However, a focus will continue on the provision of these awards as new members join and proceed through the qualifications required for patrols. Over the last three (3) seasons a total of 287 ART , 408 First Aid, 168 Spinal and 151 Beach Management awards have been gained.



Life Saving Awards

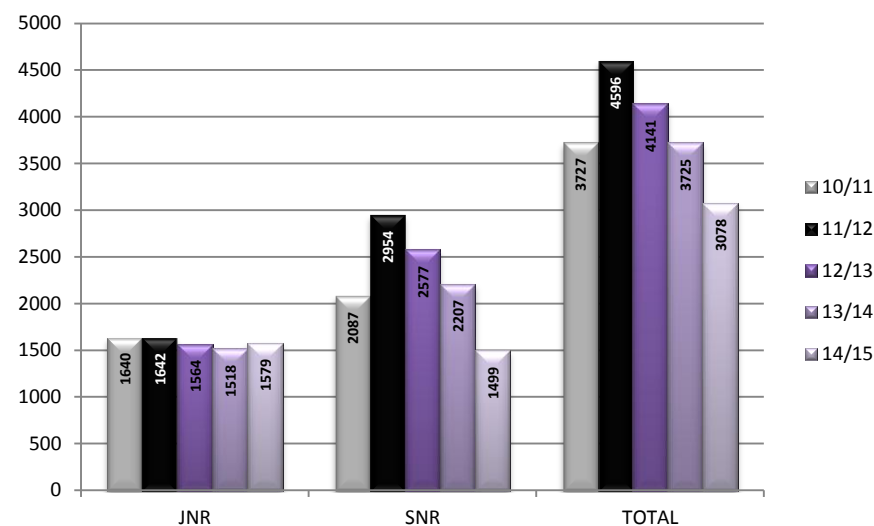
This season has seen an overall decrease of 708 senior awards gained by the Clubs and is the lowest amount recorded in the last five seasons. Tallebudgera and Kirra are the only clubs to show an increase in awards with Kirra posting the greatest increase of 35% overall in senior awards gained.

The decrease of awards can be attributed to the deletion of the CPR award from the Surf Smart Two and Bronze Medallion awards (noting that last season 396 CPR awards were processed).

Inductions for 4WD and ATV awards are also essential for members to complete each year to ensure compliance with the correct driving techniques required for patrols and on beach activities. Once gained these awards remain proficient as long as a member's driver's licence is current also.

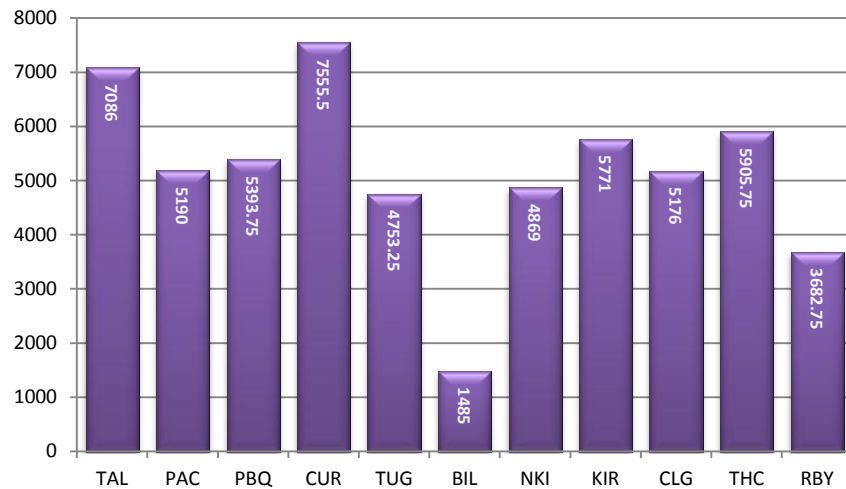

Bronze Medallion	This award has remained at the same level with 214 new Bronze Awards gained in 13/14 and again in 14/15.
IRB Crewman	An increase of 5.8% on season 2013/2014, finishing the season with 91 new awards processed.
IRB Drivers	A strong focus on IRB awards has seen a significant increase of 62% IRB Drivers awards compared to last season. This means an additional 18 people gained this award (total overall is 47).
Radio Operators	This award forms part of the Bronze Medallion and has increased significantly in recent years. This season has seen a slight decrease in awards gained with 220 in total (-104).
Surf Rescue Certificate	SRC is the base award needed for patrols and also forms part of the required learning for the Under 14 Nippers. This season we have processed 154 awards compared to 143 in season 2013/2014 (overall +11 awards).
Gold Medallion	Gold Medallion is now a permanent fixture on the Branch Calendar allowing members the opportunity to gain the highest award lifesaving offers. This season 5 members gained this award.
Beach Management	This award is compulsory award for Patrol Captains and is a lifetime award once gained. Recent seasons has seen a high level of awards gained. This season 48 members have gained the award compared to 47 last season.

PATROL HOURS

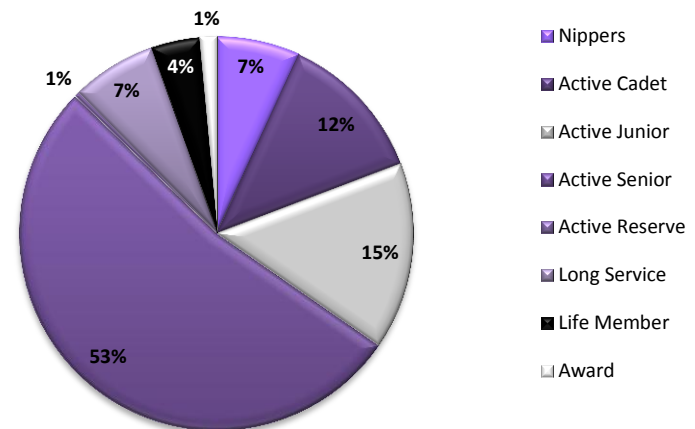

Oceans 38 is now in its 7th season with a new sponsor – BEKO. At the close of the 2013/2014 season we were made aware that Sizzler would not continue in its support of the event. Sunshine Coast Branch also decided to withdraw as a partner of the event and SLSQ staged Ocean Assault which ran on similar dates to Oceans 38. Despite these obstacles, it was determined that the event was viable and would be run throughout the season. As always Point Danger Branch was the key organiser of all administration and logistics for the events (on behalf of the Oceans 38 Groups which comprises PDB and SCB).

This season saw some changes to the events held, inclusion of individual prize money in a dash for cash format and a new sponsor – BEKO Home Appliances. Our sponsorship with BEKO will continue into season 2015/2016 with an increase in sponsorship dollars, and an additional round added. This season the Oceans 38 series achieved the following goals:

POINT DANGER BRANCH SENIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

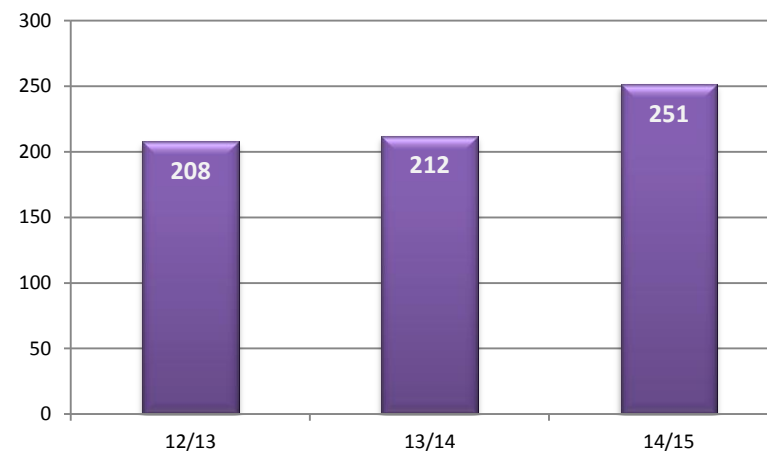

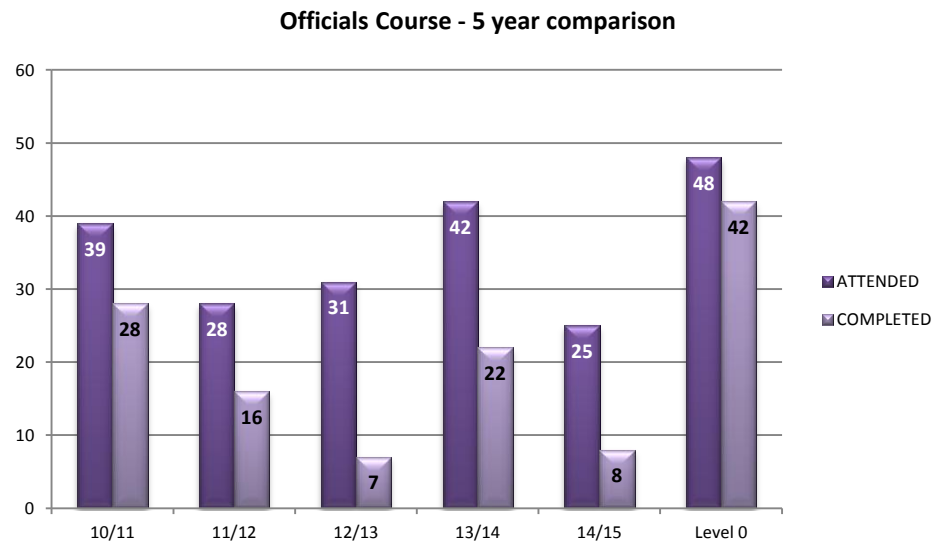

JUNIOR ACTIVITIES

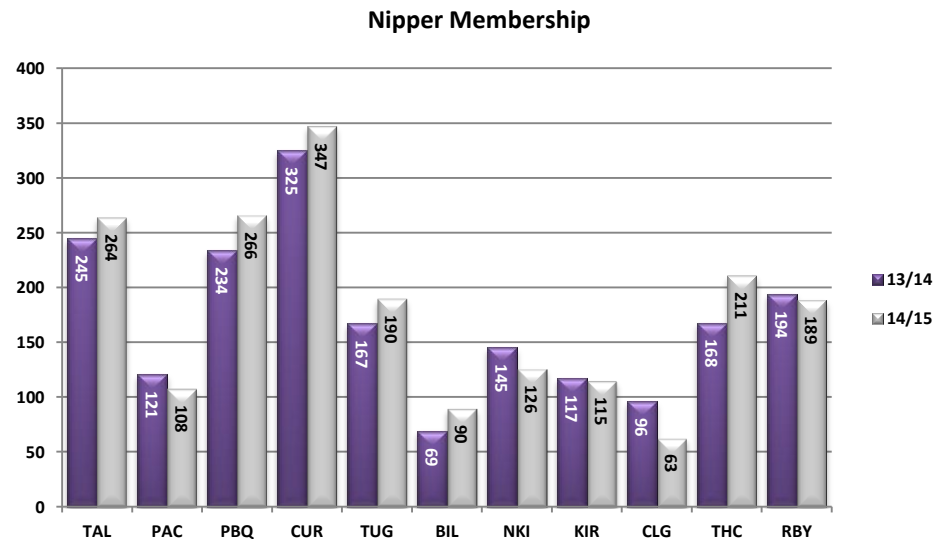
A strong Junior Activities program is the cornerstone to any surf lifesaving club and throughout season 2014/2015 Point Danger Branch nippers have achieved some great results including

- » Increase in membership
- » Increase in Gold Medals at the QLD Youth Championships
- » Participation in the Inaugural Australian Youth Championships
- » Increase in Officials (through the Junior Officiating Program)
- » Compliance to the CYRM requirements

The positive relationship between the Branch and the Nipper clubs will continue this season with the Annual Junior Information Night, Officers Inductions and CYRM workshops planned.

MEMBERSHIP

After a decrease last season, it is pleasing to report that season 2014/2015 has shown an increase in Nipper Membership across the Branch. Season 2014/2015 finished with 1969 nippers overall (4.67% increase on last season). Six of the eleven clubs experienced an increase in membership with the greatest increase showcased by TH&C SLSC (+43 members). Five clubs posted a decrease with the largest experienced at Coolangatta SLSC (-33).



JUNIOR EDUCATION

In season 2014/2015 a total of 1579 Nipper awards were processed and 124 Surf Rescue Certificates for the Under 14 Group. In total 1703 awards were gained in season 2014/2015 (+11 on last season).

AGE MANAGERS

Age Managers courses are now completed online with the practical component completed on the beach and paperwork submitted to the Branch for processing once completed. Overall 24 new Age Managers accreditations were completed this season (this is a decrease of 22 on season 2013/2014). Provisions will be made in the coming season to ensure reminders are sent to clubs and members to ensure all members complete the practical component. Overall this gives the Branch 327 Age Managers Accreditations across the clubs.

LEVEL O OFFICIALS

As stated previously the introduction of the Level O official's course into the Branch Calendar has assisted the club in gaining much needed officials to assist during surf sports events. Level O officials are only permitted to officiate at Junior Surf Sports Events. In total 48 members attended a Level O official's course.



JUNIOR SURF SPORTS

Junior Surf Sports continues to play a major part in the annual calendar – ensuring that we give our littlest life savers the opportunity to compete and learn new skills. The Branch hosted the following events this season for the Nipper Clubs

- » PDB U8-U10 Teams Carnival
- » Little Dudes U8-U10 Carnival
- » PDB U8-U10 Carnival (noting this was cancelled due to adverse weather)
- » PDB U11-U14 Championships

Participation in events continues to be at a high level with all Point Danger Branch clubs represented at the events throughout the season. A slight decrease (-14) this season in participants for the U11-U14 Championships with an increase of 19 entered for the PDB U8-U10 Carnival.

Season 2014/2015 will see some slight changes to the format of carnivals with minor changes to the programs. The Shirley Neumann Champion Competitor will change with the addition of the 1km and 2km Beach runs to the Individual Champion Competitor point score.

U8-U10 Teams will be the first event of the season (as normal) and will include the education of new officials.

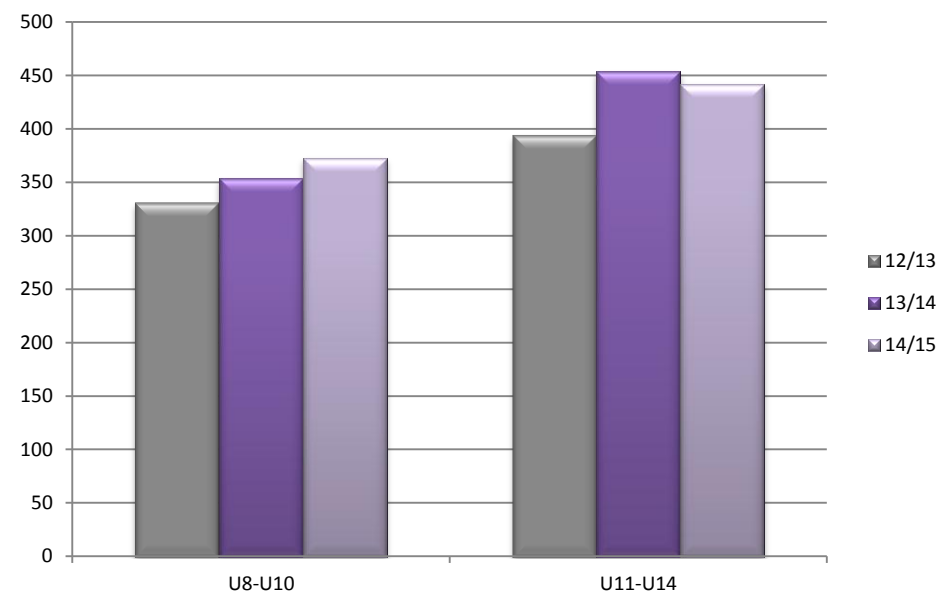
Little Dudes is our second U8-U10 event of the year and focuses on individual events only. This event includes neighbouring Branch – South Coast and gives our nippers to compete outside their own Branch.

This season the PDB U8-U10 Carnival was called off due to adverse weather conditions and due to no other available weekends, we were unable to host this event. However the entries for the season were an increase on season 2013/2014.

PDB U11-U14 Championships is the premier event in the Branch for this age group and is necessary for entry into the restricted events for Junior State. Whilst entries were slightly down this season, competition was fierce and the quality of young athletes is improving each season. Under 15 competitors were included in the March Past and All Age Relay and consideration will be given throughout the off-season to a permanent inclusion of the Under 15 age group into the Youth Championships.

YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

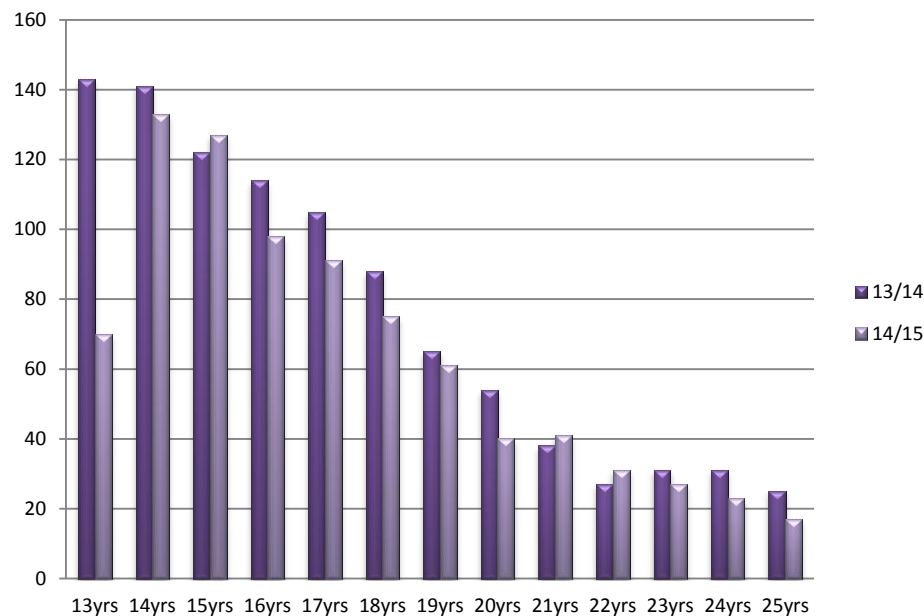
Youth Development continues to prosper with increased activities at a Club and Branch level. Point Danger Branch commenced the season with a Youth Development workshop which was a great success and will be scheduled again for season 2015/2016.

Point Danger Branch continues to combine with South Coast Branch for Gold Coast Youth Development Activities including the Gold Coast Youth Development Camp and the Youth Gala Ball.

Season 2015/2016 will see a focus on fundraising for the Youth Events – this will ensure that Point Danger Branch has a fund that can be utilised to assist members and clubs to attend events and camps.

YOUTH MEMBERSHIP

YOUNG David Babalola wants to become a surf lifesaver like so many other Gold Coast children.

The big difference is he set foot on a beach for the first time only five days ago.

The Babalola family moved from Nigeria to Australia late last year and tried a rescue board at Tallebudgera Creek at the weekend during a family day run by St Vincent de Paul Burleigh Heads and the Surf Life Saving Point Danger branch.

David, 8, loved the adventure so much his father, Mi-

chael, struggled to get him out of the water for lunch.

"I think David wants to be a lifesaver now," Mr Babalola, a disability support worker, said.

"I have never taken my boys to the beach before, but David definitely has a passion and flair for swimming."

Mr Babalola said the day was the first serious chance for his family to get to the beach in their new country.

"My wife and I find it hard to bring my boys to the beach. We would do this more if we could."

The family moved from Nigeria so Mr Babalola's wife could study full-time.

The program, in its eighth year, brings newly settled families from Logan City to experience the Australian beach culture.

Skye Bond, of Surf Life Saving Point Danger, said more than 50 lifesavers wanted to work with the 150 swimmers who took part.

"The young lifesavers get as much out of it as the families do because they love sharing water skills," Ms Bond said.

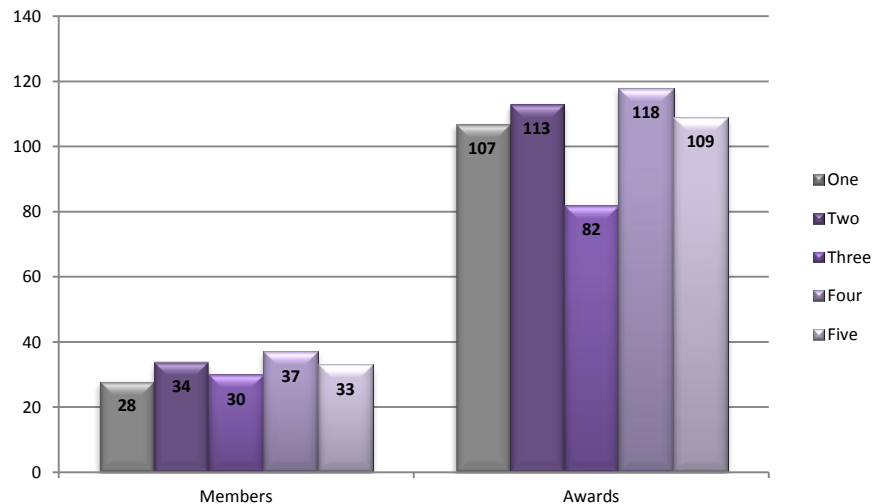

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TEAM X-TREME

The ethos behind Team X-Treme is one of simplicity – putting together youth members in a group environment to learn skills to become better abled life savers. It is this simplicity that has now seen 5 rounds of Team X-Treme completed in 4 seasons with plans currently underway for the 6th round to commence in season 2015/2016.

This season 33 members were enrolled in the program and collectively they gained 109 awards. In total over the 5 rounds – 162 participants have gained 529 awards. Team Xtreme also offers the participants and introduction to other areas in surf lifesaving and as such the members have the opportunity to participate in an Operations Support Day and visit to the Westpac Helicopter Hangar. We were also fortunate this year to have a visit from the QLD Police Rapid Action Patrols Group (featuring on the TV Show – Gold Coast Cops) and an article in the Gold Coast Bulletin.



Team X-Treme ensures young lifesavers no dummies

TEAM X-Treme is doing its bit to ensure the future of surf life saving is brighter than its rescue dummy.

Courtney Taylor from Currumbin Surf Life Saving Club co-ordinates a development program to boost lifesaver numbers in the dwindling 15-18 age range.

"We go out and have a wide range of experiences, have fun and be part of the family," she said. "The guys get out and learn rescue skills on jetskis, IRBs, and even helicopters."

Ms Taylor said participants gained valuable life skills with

leadership roles, rescue techniques and boat courses.

The 19-year-old said the 33 participants in this season's program earned 72 lifesaving awards and courses since Sep-

tember with 50 awards still to complete before the lifesaving season ends this month.

"The skills are useful in day-to-day life," she said.

"I got a thank you call from one of the guys after a CPR course because they said they had to use CPR on the train home from the beach," she said.

Ms Taylor's older brother, Brandon, took part in the first Team X-Treme program in 2011 and said his surf lifesaving qualifications and volunteer work gave him an advantage in becoming an officer in the Australian navy.

"The life experience put me ahead of the other people the same age," he said. "It was an opportunity to learn new skills and demonstrate that I had actually gone out and applied myself," he said.

Mr Taylor said he still maintained strong ties with surf lifesaving. "I keep my qualifications up to date and when I come home I try and take part in patrols when I can," he said.

VALE - ARCH NICHOLSON OAM

Arch Nicholson OAM joined Kirra SLSC as a 15 year old junior in March 1948 and obtained his Qualifying Certificate that same year. He received his Bronze Medallion in October 1949. Arch followed this by obtaining his Instructor's Certificate in 1953 than his Examiner's Certificate three years later.

When he retired as a competitor in December 1959 he continued in surf sports through R&R coaching. Arch coached both Junior and Senior R&R teams over the following 30 years. He retired at the 1991 Australian Championships at Scarborough Western Australia, where those present witnessed the end of a long and distinguished coaching career of an R&R Supremo.

During his long Association with the Kirra Club, Arch served as Vice Captain, Chief Instructor, Registrar, Assistant Secretary, Honorary Secretary, Deputy President, President and Sports & Competition Officer. His last appointment was Secretary of the Supporters Club for three years and more recently as an integral Member of the club's 100 Anniversary Committee.



When considering the amount of time Arch dedicated to Surf Life Saving it was fitting that the Surf Life Saving movement recognised his dedication. Arch has been awarded the following:

After a long illness, and with a touch of irony, Arch passed away at Kirra, in the company of his beloved wife Margaret and his girls Sue and Lisa, at the same time as the Australian Championships were winding up at North Kirra. His only regret would be that he would not be able to attend his beloved Kirra's 100th Anniversary being held on 23rd January 2016. He will be very much missed as a lifesaver and friend.

CLUB REPORTS - TALLEBUDGERA SLSC

Season 2014/2015 was another successful season with no loss of life at Tallebudgera Beach for which all members are to be congratulated.

The Committee once again did a sterling job and met all challenges and then some. While there is a core group of committee members that could be classed as veterans the small mix of newcomers have integrated well which is pleasing as they will be the future of the club.

Like all clubs, patrol numbers continue to be a challenge especially with the correct award requirements. Courses continue to be run at a regular schedule with the Chief Training Officer attending to all courses and paperwork – he is to be congratulated on his efforts. Similarly the Club Captain did a great job with the operational patrols.

Some staffing changes occurred at Tallebudgera SLSC throughout the season, with long standing General Manager Peter LeGros moving into retirement. Peter was an asset to the Surf Club as much he was to the Supporters Club. This saw the arrival of Paul Macguire from the Brisbane Lions Club and Paul has settled in well. The Supporters Club continues to trade well which is a credit to the Board, Management and Staff.

A new Surf Sports coach in Rhett Collie was also appointed this season. Rhett comes with good pedigree and the Tallebudgera competitors have taken to him in his first year and we are pleased to be locking him in for the foreseeable future.

The Gold Coast elected government representatives in Karen Andrews MP (Federal Member for MacPherson), Michael Hart MP (State Member for Burleigh) and Councillor Daphne MacDonald (City of Gold Coast) have supported Tallebudgera SLSC well again and the club looks forward to continued relationships in the coming season.



CLUB REPORTS - PACIFIC SLSC

Members of Pacific SLSC patrolled the beach for 5,177 hours in the 2014/15 season, an increase of 14% from last season. The Pacific SLSC members contributed to all facets of Surf Life Saving Support Services - Jet Ski, Helicopter, Surfcom, Branch and the Jet Boat. Our beach remained free of any major incident. Pleasingly four members under the age of 16 patrolled in excess of 100 hours each, validating our junior program.

During the season Club trainers added 9 new Surf Rescue Certificate members, 8 new Bronze Medallion members to the active ranks. The trainers and assessors continue to commit a significant amount of their time to ensure Pacific SLSC members are well trained.

Pacific SLSC is in a sound financial position. This season a profit of \$17,343 was recorded, a decrease of 66% from the previous season. The decrease was attributed to a number of essential building maintenance projects that were undertaken and a review of fixed asset register e.g. items that longer exist or have been recently replaced were written off and more appropriate depreciation rates were applied to allow for the harsh beach environment. The club still remains debt free.

CLUB REPORTS - CURRUMBIN SLSC

Currumbin SLSC has taken some giant leaps in recent seasons with a number of achievements, which have largely been made possible from initiatives that have been driven by the efforts of hardworking volunteers, the efforts of a united group of subcommittees and a group of forward thinking staff and committee members. The club continues to work towards our strategic and operational plans and deliver the best possible product to our members and our key organisational stakeholders.

Throughout the season Currumbin SLSC received a number of Grants which have allowed the club to put new patrol equipment on the beach and support community and lifesaving education programs. A special thank you to SLSQ Point Danger Branch, SLSQ, Jupiter's Casino, Bendigo Bank and the Gold Coast City Council who made this possible.

This season Currumbin were able to surpass a total club membership of 12,500 (including our Surf Club and Supporters Club members). This membership base allows the club an ever increasing opportunity to expand its product to a large market base to facilitate links across all key pillars of the club that we build our strategic operational foundations on. Most importantly, this season Currumbin was able to run five Bronze Medallion and SRC courses, enabling us to welcome 65 new patrollers to the club and expand our patrolling database by twenty percent. The lifesaving activities and lifesaving operations will continue to remain at the forefront of planning and resource provision moving forward to ensure that Currumbin continues to provide a safe aquatic environment for beach patrons and support the initiatives from governing bodies.

Administratively, the club conducted a full review and update of the Club Constitution and By laws to be endorsed at the 2015 AGM and undertook a full update and restructure of Staff and Volunteer position descriptions, KPI's and overall organisational chart to enhance our operational efficiency.

In the competition arena, Currumbin finished the season as the 2014 National Pool Rescue Champions and arguably the leading Beach and Surf Boat Club in Australia. Four members were crowned World Champions at Rescue 2014 and leading Ironman Jackson Maynard qualified in the 2014/2015 Nutri Grain Ironman Series. As a group the club is proud to call ourselves the Branch U11-U14 Champions, Gold Coast Junior Titles Champions, Senior Branch Champions and on the bigger stage the club recorded its best result at the Australian Championships in the last 16 years - finishing 3rd overall in the Open Competition.

Currumbin SLSC's major focus prior to the start of season 2015/2016 will be an upgrade to the downstairs member's storage facilities and club room, incorporating the upgrade of club amenities and addition of lockers in the downstairs members room. The club has recognised as a representative group that there are still areas for improved performance and indeed will strive for continual improvement in all areas across the Club.



CLUB REPORTS - TUGUN SLSC

2014/15 has been another successful year for the Tugun SLSC. The committee has worked hard with the members to complete one of the most successful seasons in many years culminating with the hosting of the Australian Surf Boat Championships which demonstrated the knowledge and ability of this club to host major events and the level of commitment of Tugun members to see Tugun succeed. The success of this event provided a capital boost to the Club and gave the club an opportunity to introduce prospective members and let them experience the culture of commitment which is uniquely Tugun.

The Committee has worked hard as a cohesive unit to ensure that the Club maintained a solid financial footing and developed further the processes and procedures necessary to ensure the smooth running of an organisation that is multifaceted and which like all clubs has many areas of compliance that need attention.

The patrolling membership this year has seen an increase in participation by the Nipper parents which has assisted greatly in manning Tugun beach. Maintaining an active participative membership in this club as in all volunteer organisations is a constant battle which needs to be at the forefront of club endeavours, and in many ways directly affects many of the decisions that Tugun as a club make on a day to day basis.

Nipper numbers have remained steady this year. The club has established internally several initiatives that are hoped will see the club retain older members and transition them into the senior club over the next few years as they are our future. The junior club has had a successful competitive season and the club have been especially pleased with the improvement and showing in all of our age groups.

Tugun has struggled in growing the skill base of the membership especially in the IRB driver and crewman areas. This is currently being addressed and will be an ongoing focus of the incoming committee in season 2015/2016. The club put through 2 bronze courses, and 14 members gained the SRC.

The commitment and dedication from the Junior Committee in the development of our Junior Lifesavers has been second to none. The Committee has provided necessary leadership and the hardworking team of Age Managers and support personnel provided an environment of fun and an opportunity to allow Bilinga SLSC Nippers to compete at the QLD Youth Championships and being successful in winning State medals.

In 2015/16 the focus is to increase our membership in particular our patrolling numbers. The past season was challenging – the clubs training needs improvement and Bilinga SLSC need to provide a better service on the beach for the community, building a stronger red and gold foundation for the club.

Bilinga SLSC appreciated the continuing support from the Point Danger Branch Patrol Group and Brisbane Lifesaving team without the patrol assistance provided by the two groups the club would have been in a serious situation in providing a presence on the beach.

Gratitude is extended to neighbouring clubs, North Kirra and Tugun for the support provided to Bilinga SLSC in season 2014/15.



CLUB REPORTS - NORTH KIRRA SLSC

The 2014/ 2015 Season has been another successful season for North Kirra. The season formally commenced with the adoption of an updated Club Constitution and continued to excel in all facets, including nippers, patrols, competition and education. The season then concluded with the Aussie Championships being held over 9 full days gaining strong interest from club competitors and generating significant fundraising opportunities.

Nippers grew its competitive strength whilst ensuring the club continued to have a clear focus on essential surf and life skills and remaining a family friendly club. This provides all children, no matter their skill level, to be an active participant in our junior programs.

A full education training roster was again prepared, complemented by the numerous courses run by Point Danger Branch. The Branches assistance this season in training and education has been invaluable. Once again, the PDB Team X-Treme program was very well received by North Kirra members with another 7 members completing the program.

Competition continues to grow at North Kirra with a full training regime run throughout the season. The club is currently working to enhance this program further with a focus on both beach and water activities this coming season. In addition to the 25 competitors at Qld Youth Championships, North Kirra had 12 members participate at the QLD Championships and 16 members at the Aussie Championships. This renovation will replace the roof which and also ensure the complete removal of all asbestos containing materials in the Club. This is an exceptional position to establish as a new base and allows future works to be undertaken in a more cost effective manner.

In closing, thank you to the members of North Kirra and the support provided by the Point Danger Branch and affiliated clubs. We look forward to another successful season ahead.

It was a combined effort with Kirra SLSC and TH&C SLSC arriving to offer assistance.



Competitively Team Cooly did very well considering the size of the team. The legend of the beach flags arena Life Member Phil Wyper won another Australian beach flags title (50 – 54 yrs), and Nick Fawaz won the Masters 40 – 44 years 2k beach run at the QLD State and the Aussies, Masters Qld State 30-34 Male 2km Beach Run - Rohan Scaysbrook, whilst Life Member Phil Hammond steered the Cooli Blues 220 year surf boat crew to victory at the Aussies The Cooli 220 Years Surf Boat crew were Matthew Cleaver, Stephen Mason, Graham Matthews, and Terry Simpson.

Another highlight this season that the club take great pride in commemorating is Fallen Lifesavers Memorial day. This year it was held on Sunday 26 April 2015 and two special guests (who were former enemies in World War 2 - Robert Chester Master OAM a former Lancaster Bomber rear gunner and German Air Force Messerschmitt pilot Werner Leist) were invited. On this day Bronzie Cap presentations were incorporated and presentations of the iconic red and yellow patrol caps which are embroidered with their initials and qualification number. The strong attendance of Nipper and Junior members on this day all proudly dressed in their red and yellow uniforms truly looked magnificent.

The Supporter's Club has again operated financially well as a successful business. During the renovation period it was difficult to trade, however the staff did an excellent job and continued to make a profit under trying circumstances.

The Club was also fortunate to receive a number of grants this season that were used to purchase new equipment. Funds received from the Department of Community Safety/Lifesaving Services Development Fund and the SLSA Beach Safety Equipment Fund was combined to purchase the new Polaris.

The Seventh Day Adventist Op Shop at Murwillumbah donated first aid supplies and training manikins to the value of \$4,000.00 and Defib trainers were purchased from a grant from the Brisbane Airport Corporation. The support received from Surf Life Saving, Government Departments and the community is greatly appreciated.

The re-enactment of the landing at Gallipoli, as part of the Anzac Day centenary, was a big hit and most of us were astounded in how little time it took for our members to be transformed into a professional and well drilled body of men. Well done to all of those who participated in the event.

Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The Management committee prepared the financial statements of the branch on the basis that the branch is a non-reporting entity because there are no users dependant on general purpose financial statements. The financial statements are therefore special purpose financial statements that have been prepared in order to meet the requirements of the constitution, the information needs of the stakeholders and for the basis of preparation of the income tax return.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the significant accounting policies disclosed below, which the Management Committee determined are appropriate to meet the purposes of preparation. Such accounting policies are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs unless otherwise stated in the notes. The accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of the statements are as follows:

(a) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Property, Plant and Equipment are carried at cost or at independent or Management Committee valuation. All assets, excluding freehold land and buildings are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the trust. Increases in the carrying amount arising on revaluation of land and buildings are credited to a revaluation reserve in members' equity. Decreases that offset previous increases of the same asset are charged against fair value reserves directly in equity; all other decreases are charged to the income statement. Each year the difference between depreciation based on the revalued carrying amount of the assets charged to the income statement and depreciation based on the asset's original cost is transferred from the revaluation reserve to retained earnings.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by Management Committee* to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the asset's employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted in determining recoverable amounts.

(b) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities on the balance sheet.

(c) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which, for floating rate financial assets, is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Revenue recognised related to the provision of services is determined with reference to the stage of completion of the transaction at the reporting date and where outcome of the contract can be estimated reliably. Stage of completion is determined with reference to the services performed to date as a percentage of total anticipated services to be performed. Where the outcome cannot be estimated reliably, revenue is recognised only to the extent that related expenditure is recoverable.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(d) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Tax Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the balance sheet are shown inclusive of GST.

(e) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the liability for employee entitlements arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related costs.

(f) Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables, including bank borrowings and distributions payable, are recognised at the nominal transaction value without taking into account the time value of money.
