## EXECUTIVE OVERVIEW

Season 2012/2013 presented a wide range of challenges for the Branch and its Clubs. Changes in legislation, policies, rules and procedures, a need to meet community standards and expectations from both an organisational aspect and a service provider in public safety dictated the framework from which Point Danger Branch operated for the season.

In order to ensure the ongoing success of the Branch and its affiliated clubs Point Danger identified a framework of priorities to meet the challenges of the 2012/2013 season.

### OUR PRIORITIES

- ≠ Providing a governance structure that would assist the Branch and the Clubs to meet commitments to training, corporate governance and beach safety.
- ≠ Assist in providing functional business guidance for Surf Club management.
- ≠ Identify opportunities and strategic partners that may benefit the Branch, Clubs and members alike
- ≠ Facilitate the change management process supporting Clubs and members in meeting the challenges associated with changing business practices.

### OUR ENABLING STRATEGIES

- ≠ Providing assistance to Clubs in reviewing all relevant policies. Point Danger Branch acted as a conduit between SLSQ and the clubs to refine processes relating to new training requirements and later conducted workshops specific to this topic. The Branch conducted full audits of governance for two clubs throughout the season and maintained an overview of operation deployments impacting on beach safety.
- ≠ During the season this office provided assistance to clubs in relation to management of fiscal policy including financial forecasting, reconciliation of expenditure and management of allocated funds. On two occasions this was done on a full time basis for a period.
- ≠ Throughout the year the Branch maintained a commitment to the following partnerships Sizzler Oceans 38, Goldline, Gold Coast Titans, Sport and Recreation, GCCC, Queensland Government.
- ≠ During the period under review, this office, aside from maintaining a commitment to required meetings, also facilitated a two day workshop for Club Administrators. During this time contemporary management practices relating to Surf Life Saving were addressed and a number of key note speakers attended and presented.

Surf Life Saving prides itself on being an iconic organisation that leads the way in aquatic rescue, resuscitation and surf safety and awareness. More importantly, we help build and support a community awareness of these issues to ensure safety on our beaches and waterways. The foundation of this is our incredible membership who so readily give up their time towards the betterment of the association and its ideals.

On the beaches this season, our volunteer lifesavers serviced 456,051 visitors, performing 215 rescues during the 56,700 patrol hours performed.

These are incredible statistics that contribute towards the SLSQ vision of *“zero preventable deaths or injuries on Queensland beaches”*.

The eyes of the country were on Point Danger Branch this season with some large events hosted by our clubs including Coolangatta Gold and the Australian Championships. As always, our clubs and members volunteered their time for these events to assist in making them a success.

Each year the Branch identifies priorities to work towards in line with the strategic plan, with our clubs and members we have maintained our firm resolve to action these priorities and assist our clubs in responding to the ever changing needs of the contemporary life saving environment

## **SIGNIFICANT ACHIEVEMENTS**

- ≠ Our clubs performed 847 preventative actions on the beach and provided water safety advice (people warned) to a further 10,156 people.
- ≠ This season the Branch has focused on additional funding to support our many activities and operations with an increase in sponsorship through the introduction of a new partnership with Goldlinq.
- ≠ Increase in grant funding gained by the Branch from SLSQ/DCS, Gambling Community Benefit Fund and Sport and Recreation.
- ≠ Introduction of structured training for administrators to assist in professional development (done in consultation with Adult Community Education).
- ≠ Continuity in the courses and awards offered to clubs and members. Awards gained were 4,141 in total
- ≠ Achieved a financial surplus of \$6,400.00
- ≠ The finalisation of our 5<sup>th</sup> year of running the Sizzler Oceans 38 Premiership Series on behalf of Point Danger, South Coast and Sunshine Coast Branch
- ≠ The Honourable John Paul Langbroek MP (Minister for Education) and The Honourable Jann Stuckey MP (Minister for Tourism, Major Events, Small Business and the Commonwealth Games) were key note speakers at our annual Trainer and Assessor Proficiency Workshop.
- ≠ Assistance to clubs in the gaining of grants and funding.
- ≠ Introduction of partnership with Goldlinq for the continuation of school talks.

## **ESTABLISHMENT OF KEY PARTNERSHIPS**

SLSQ Point Danger Branch continues its work towards establishing and maintaining relationships with other community and corporate organisations on the Gold Coast. We recognise the significance of establishing and maintaining these partnerships for the benefit of the Branch and its membership.

## **GOLD COAST TITANS**

During the season the Branch was successful in continuing their relationship with the Gold Coast Titans which achieved the following results

- ≠ Social opportunities and discounted tickets for members and families through the Supporters Clubs.
- ≠ Support of local club events through the provision of players for sportsmans lunches, nipper presentations and annual dinners.
- ≠ Use of the Titans Jumping Castle at events
- ≠ Lifesaving themed day during a home game.

This relationship will continue in season 2013/2014 with continued support of clubs through the Titans Community Program, however the nature of this program will change slightly in line with internal structure changes at the Gold Coast Titans.

## **GOLDLINQ**

In season 2012/2013 Point Danger Branch was successful in initiating, planning and overseeing a new strategic partnership with Goldlinq (Light Rail Consortium). We embarked on this partnership to assist both Point Danger and South Coast Branches in the delivery of school talks that focus on Surf Awareness and safety. The Point Danger Branch Development Officers run a number of school talks each season across the whole Gold Coast and Northern NSW. This partnership has achieved

- ≠ Ability to be able to print information booklets for each school student that we visit as well as providing the same book to our nippers.
- ≠ Continuation of school talks across the Gold Coast
- ≠ Naming Rights to the Under 14 Junior Lifesaver of the Year award for both Branches including the provision of a new competition board for each winner.
- ≠ Funding of key life saving message posters for schools including Rip Currents, Sun Safety and Flags Awareness

## **DELIVERY OF CORE SERVICE**

SLSQ Point Danger Branch continues towards their commitment of ensuring the safety of the beach going public whilst they are benefitting from the use of our beaches. The clubs of SLSQ Point Danger Branch have dedicated themselves towards this goal with investment into the ongoing development of volunteer members. This is further partnered with increased availability of equipment for both training and patrols.

The Branch has assisted the clubs this season in gaining grant funding through the SLSQ/DCS Sustainability and More Beaches Under Guard funding – completing successful grant applications for TH&C SLSC, North Kirra SLSC, Bilinga SLSC and Tallebudgera SLSC.

## **SURF SPORTS**

For the 5<sup>th</sup> season, Point Danger Branch continues to run the Sizzler Oceans 38 Premiership Series on behalf of the three southern Branches. Our role is focused on the logistic, administrative and financial management of this event. The profit from this series allows for our Branch and others to continue to fund essential lifesaving services and initiatives. Season 2013/2014 will be the 6<sup>th</sup> season for the Sizzler sponsorship and the Branch will again take forward negotiations for the continuation of this event on behalf of the southern Branches.

The Point Danger Branch Representative Team program and management continues to improve each year. Our role in the administration and operations of the Interbranch carnival was maintained with Point Danger Branch writing a “How To” guide for each host Branch and SLSQ to refer to each season during the running of this event.

In consultation with our clubs the Branch changed the format of the Senior Branch Championships. This included a decrease of events, grouping of masters events, deletion of surf boats and changing the event to one day. This was successful and will be repeated again in 2013/2014.

Junior Surf Sports in the Branch continues in a positive nature with our clubs assisting greatly with the running of the many carnivals that we host. Mother Nature certainly tested us this season but with the assistance of club personnel and officials we were able to successfully run all events. Each of our clubs was represented at both Branch and State level.

## **MANAGEMENT OF FISCAL POLICY**

The Branch continues to overview its budget in line with strategic planning and at the end of the 2012/2013 financial year the Branch achieved an operating surplus of \$6,400.00. It should be noted that due to a large adjustment to the depreciation schedule the financials show a \$31,685 deficit.

Our funding arrangement with the Gold Coast City Council has continued and this funding has also assisted the clubs and the Branch in the purchase and maintenance of essential life saving equipment. The financial security continues to strengthen each year with proactive programs, sponsorship, grant applications and in kind support from companies.

## CORPORATE AND OPERATIONAL GOVERNANCE

The Branch continues its longstanding commitment to governance, providing a number of workshops for all the portfolios of the Branch, continuation of reviews on log books, awards and patrol rosters and the inclusion of policies for both the Branch and Clubs.

Our future focus in this area will be largely focused on “red tape reduction” which will involve streamlining systems to ensure that our clubs and members are able to volunteer their time without expending too much on upgrades and paperwork. A number of systems at the Branch level currently support this, however a timely review will be carried out towards improvement and efficiency.

## STRATEGIC PLAN

The Branch has continued its focus on enacting outcomes from the strategic plan. We are now at the end of the current plan and are working on steps toward the provision of another plan for the Branch and Clubs. This will include consultation with key stakeholders.

## CHALLENGES FOR 2013/2014

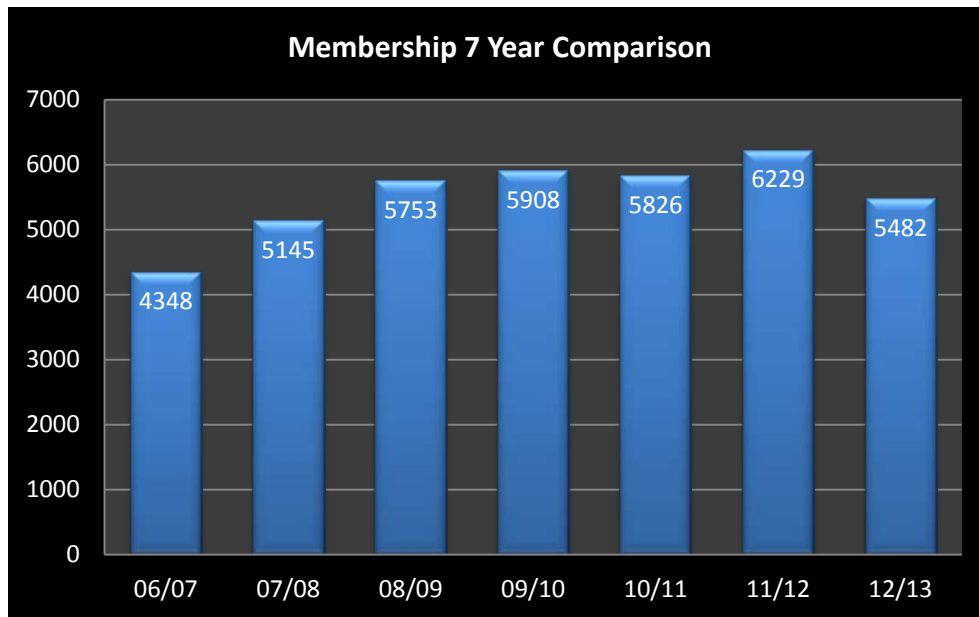
Futuristically the Branch and its Clubs have a number of challenges that need to be addressed.

- ≠ **Constitutions** : One of the major challenges will be the upgrade of constitutions for affiliated clubs in line with the much anticipated Model Constitution that SLSQ will be releasing in August. This will ensure a higher level of compliance with legislation for all clubs.
- ≠ **Administrative Training** : Training for the administrative staff commenced in season 2012/2013 with the introduction of monthly training courses to assist in the ongoing development and support of staff. This will continue in season 2013/2014
- ≠ **Policy** : The Branch has been proactive in writing policies for its internal operations and also assisting the clubs in this respect. This will be continued in the future with policy on Workcover, Social Media, Training and Assessing and Officiating planned.
- ≠ **Use of IT for Trainers and Assessors** : a number of courses will be available on line and there are a number of upgrades required for our trainers and assessors in this respect. The Branch will be facilitating a number of workshops to assist members in this transition.
- ≠ **Rate of Change** : The consistent changes in legislation that effect our organisation will be one of our greater hurdles to overcome. Proactive measures will be implemented towards this end.
- ≠ **90<sup>th</sup> Anniversary** : This will be the Branches 90<sup>th</sup> Anniversary season of Surf Life Saving. Recognition of members and clubs will be paramount.

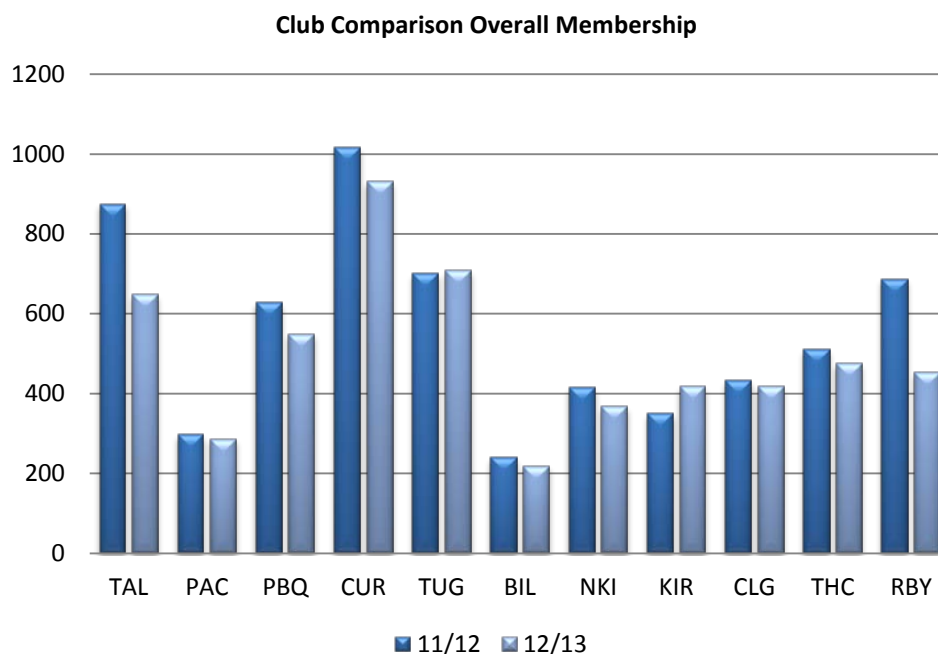


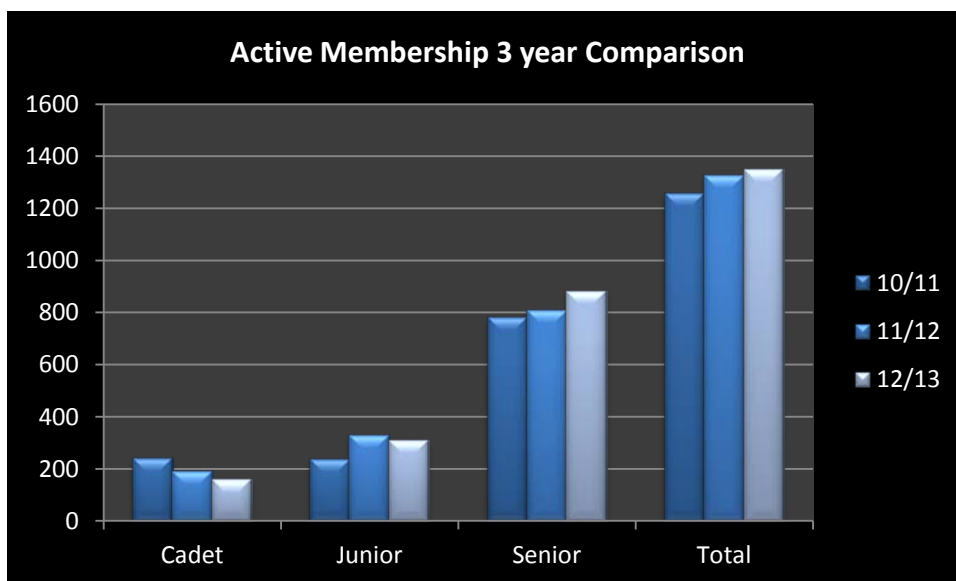
## MEMBERSHIP

We have shown a slight decrease in membership this season. This is in line with an overall decrease of membership across the State. The overall membership in season 2012/2013 was 5,482 - this is a total decrease of 747 members from season 2011/2012 (6,229).



Two clubs in the Branch have shown a slight increase in membership – Tugun SLSC increased their membership from 701 to 707 members and Kirra SLSC increased membership from 350 to 418 members. This is the second season that Tugun has posted an increase in membership. All other clubs have shown a decrease in membership. The biggest loss in membership was showcased by Rainbow Bay SLSC with a loss of 234 members overall.



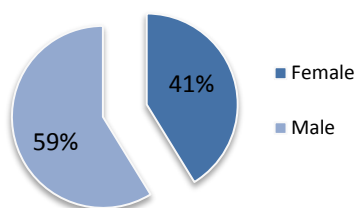


Whilst the Branch has experienced an overall decrease in membership, the active membership has increased overall with an increase of 25 members on last season. Overall there was an increase of 77 members in the Active Seniors. The Active Cadet and Active Junior categories have shown a decrease (31 and 21 members respectively).

There have been some changes to the other active categories that assist and support our patrolling members.

- ≠ Long Service Membership has increased from 277 to 288 members (+11)
- ≠ Reserve Active Membership has increased from 7 to 17 members (+10)
- ≠ Award Membership has decreased from 72 to 48 members (-24)

### Gender Comparison



The statistics as they relate to the gender of our membership remains the same with male members making up 59% of the total membership. In total there are 3,222 male members and 2,260 female members across the Branch.

However the overall female membership in the Senior Membership categories is only 36.99% (1,319 of the total senior membership 3,565). In the nipper membership the genders are more equal with 49% female (941) and 51% male (976).



## LIFESAVING SERVICES

Lifesaving Services in Point Danger Branch have continued in season in 2012/2013 with dedication and commitment to the safety of the beach going public. Our affiliated clubs and members have been conscientious in their efforts in maintaining our vision of ensuring that Point Danger Branch beaches are a safe, secure and enjoyable environment for members and visitors alike.

### PATROL AGREEMENTS

Our Clubs continue to committ to service delivery with the signing and submission of annual patrol agreements. These agreements outline the service that the clubs intend to provide on the beaches inclusive of patrol strength, equipment and patrol times and dates.

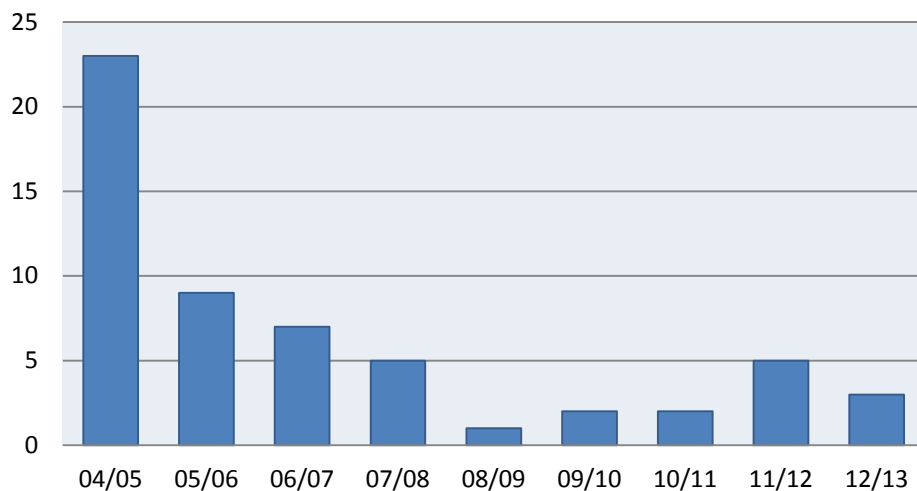
In season 2012/2013 Point Danger Branch strove to clarify its procedures as they relate to Patrol Breaches and as such a comprehensive policy document was completed and approved by the Branch Council. This document assists the clubs in ensuring adherence to patrol agreements and understanding the necessary consequences if these agreements are breached. Whilst there have been three issues this season, we are happy to report that this is a decrease from season 2011/2012.

We are continually working with our clubs towards compliance. At the request of Club Presidents, this season the Branch introduced a Patrol Captains workshop for all Club Patrol Captains. This allowed the Branch and SLSQ to inform the Patrol Captains directly about necessary requirements and any changes that affect patrols. This initiative proved worthy and will continue in coming seasons. All Patrol Captains were provided with red peak caps embroidered with "Patrol Captain"

Our commitment to regular reviews on patrol logs, patrol rosters and ATV/4WD awards will continue. These reviews assist our clubs greatly in identifying any issues with members particularly focusing on blue cards and awards for patrol members.

## LIFE SAVING FUNDING

The Clubs of Point Danger Branch have again taken advantage of the funding program from SLSQ/DCS. This funding relates largely to sustaining current levels of service and in some instances assists clubs to increase their patrolling commitment i.e. roving patrols, secondary patrol areas.

With funding received, the Branch purchased an ART manikin which is also available for clubs to use for their ART courses.

Collectively the Clubs and the Branch gained \$86,824.00 in funding. This was a slight increase on season 2011/2012 of \$414.00.

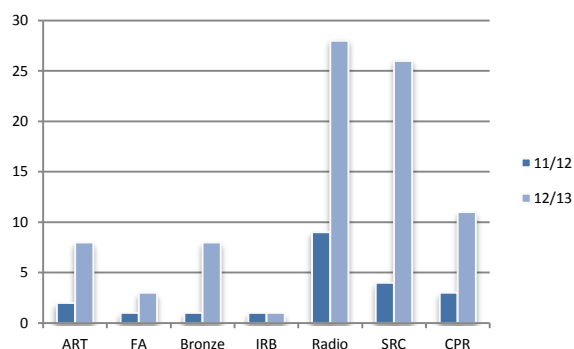

## TRAINERS AND ASSESSORS

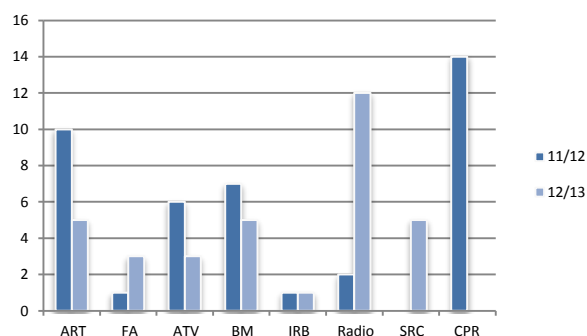
The Branch has continued its work towards gaining more Trainers and Assessors, with consistent changes to these awards this has been a challenge but we have worked with our members and clubs towards a positive outcome and have a number of new and probationary Trainers and Assessors in all areas. Last season the Branch commenced workshops in relation to the Delivery and Assessment of courses to ensure that our members were aware of and using the resources available to them when training courses.

One of the Branch Development Officers has upskilled and the Branch is now able to run trainers and assessors courses at Branch level. This initiative has assisted the Branch in increasing the courses and training available to members. At present between the Branch and SLSQ run courses, 7 members attended the Assessors Course with 2 finalising their accreditation and 19 members attended the Trainers Course with 12 completing their accreditation (noting members have 12 months to complete).

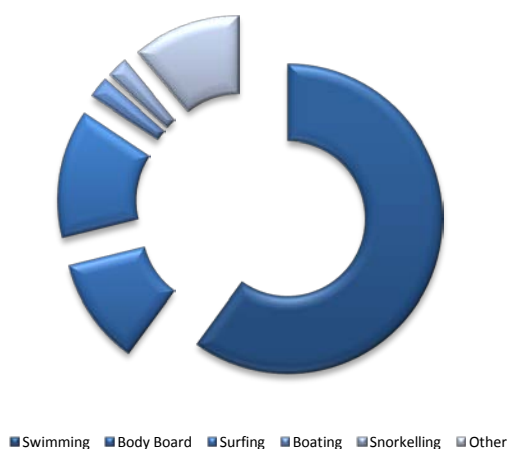


## PATROL STATISTICS

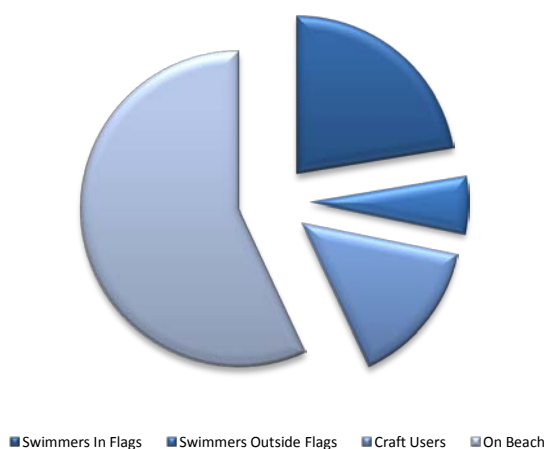
Over the last three seasons there has been a steady decrease in the required number of rescues from 280 (10/11), 240 (11/12) to 215 (12/13). Again the Inflatable Rescue Boat (IRB) was the most popular form of rescue equipment used by our Clubs with 32.09% of all rescues being performed using this piece of equipment.

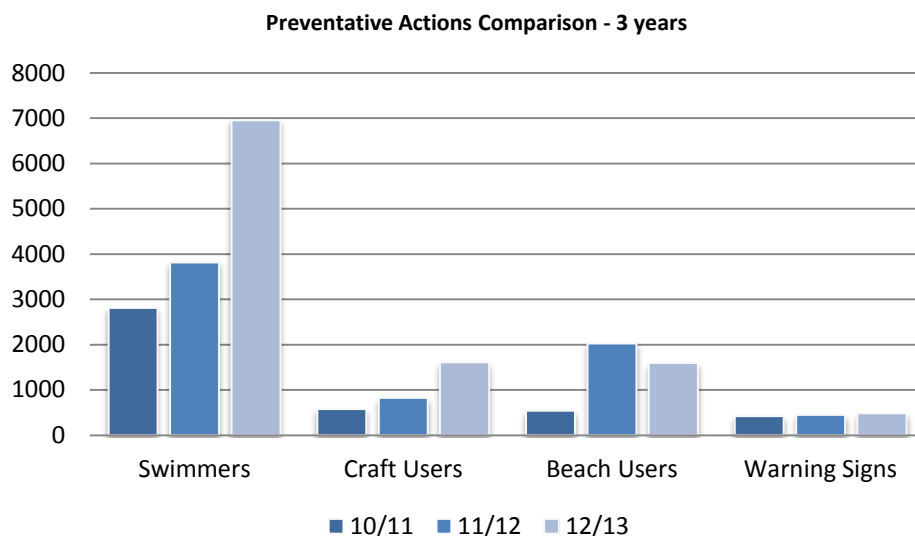
Activity When Needing Rescuing



Beach Visitations



Preventative actions and warning beach goers are essential in our patrolling activities and ensure that the rate of rescues remain low. There have been some slight changes in the recording of statistics via the new computer program (surfguard) which has allowed us more of a glimpse into the on beach activities of our lifesavers and the challenges that they face.



The weather throughout the season necessitated in the closure of our beaches at various times due to inclement weather conditions, storms and dangerous surf.

First Aid treatments have nearly doubled this season from 622 (11/12) to 1,204 (12/13) with most changes occurring in relation to marine stings 349 (11/12) increased to 956 (12/13). Other injuries have remained consistent with slight increases in Minor Cuts/Abrasions and decreases in spinal injuries and shock.

## TRAINING AND EDUCATION

Our continuing commitment to increase training opportunities for members and clubs has been maintained this season. The Branch ran over thirty courses throughout the year to assist in upskilling our members. These courses also introduced probationary Trainers and Assessors to new skills.



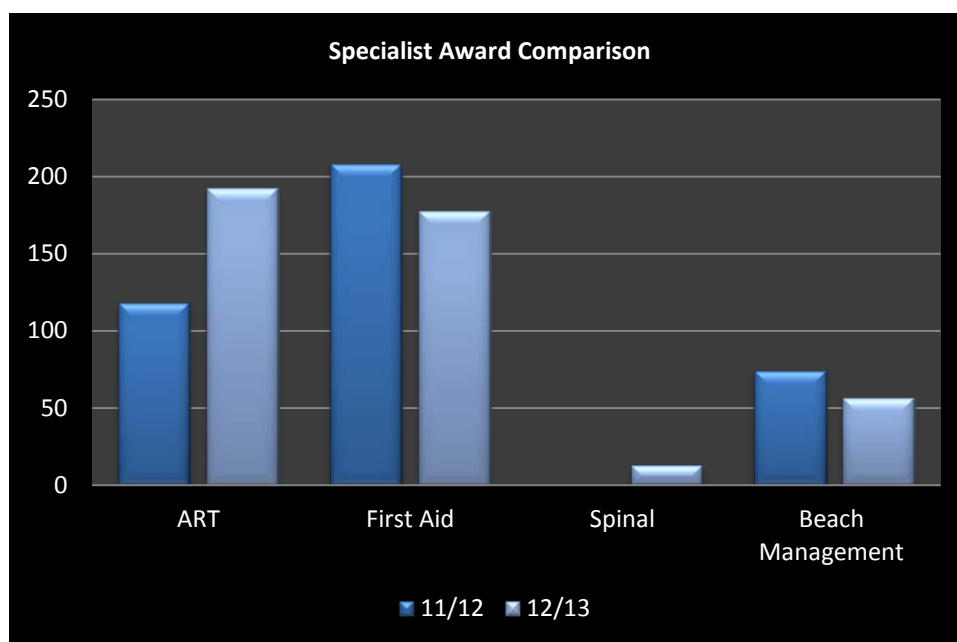
Further, we have been liaising with Adult Community Education (ACE) to be able to provide an opportunity for our members to gain a full Certificate 4 in Workplace, Training and Assessment. This initiative will allow members to RPL some of their current qualifications towards this accreditation and as such minimise costs.

One of the major changes in training and education that will effect our clubs and members is the need for all Trainers and Assessors to hold the current TAE Units of Competency as they relate to their relevant training and assessing awards. This will necessitate an upgrade course for a lot of members to ensure compliance with the SLSQ RTO status. SLSQ Point Danger Branch has been proactive in this regard with our staff being trained to deliver the upgrades and assist the members in remaining current.

Season 2012/2013 saw the introduction of the Spinal Management Certificate . Point Danger Branch ran three courses specific to current trainers and assessors. These members were taught the new skill and then asked to go forward and train club members. Further, the Beach Management course has changed dramatically with units of competency now attached. Our current Beach Management

Facilitators have the option to upgrade to the new qualification so that they can continue to teach this on behalf of the Branch and at Club level. Point Danger Branch has been proactive in providing feedback to SLSQ and SLSA on this course and has participated in a workshop to this end.

The Branches main focus in course delivery relates to “specialist” awards such as Advanced Resuscitation Techniques (ART), Apply First Aid, Spinal Management and Beach Management. We have seen an increase in ART awards (+ 38.54%) and Spinal Management Awards this season, and a slight decrease in the First Aid and Beach Management awards.



Our clubs have continued to induct members with the necessary vehicle awards – ATV, Tractor and 4WD. It is a continuing compliance issue that clubs must address as members are not permitted to drive any of the vehicles without completion of inductions first. This season has seen a large decrease in the number of vehicle related awards gained but noting the statistics from last season, it seems that the clubs have been training their members as needed. Once gained, these awards do not require proficiencys, only a current drivers licence to ensure they remain current.

This season has seen a slight decrease in awards gained by the collective membership. This is in line with the decrease in membership numbers. This is the first time in 6 seasons that there has been a decrease in total awards gained.

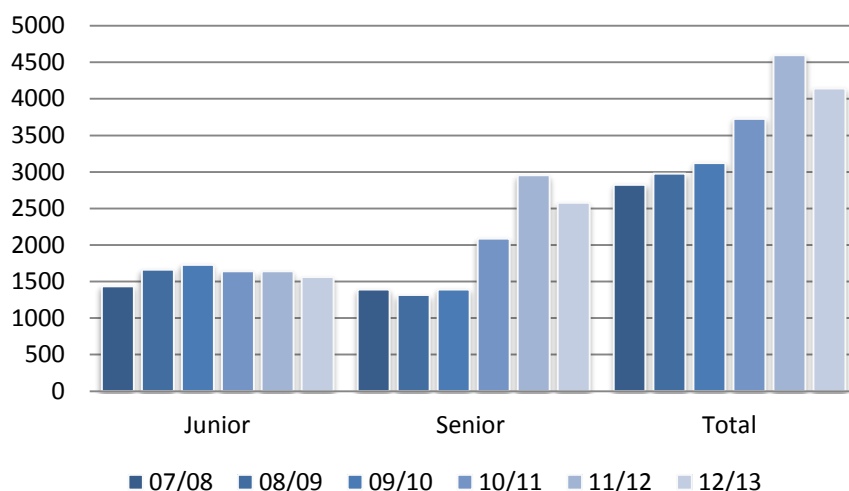
In season 2011/2012 2954 awards were gained by the senior membership compared with 2,577 in season 2012/2013 (-377).

Nipper awards continued well with 1564 awards gained overall compared to 1,642 last season (overall a decrease of 78 awards).

IRB Crewman	This award remains equal with last season with 108 awards gained in both season 11/12 and 12/13.
Silver Medallion IRB Drivers	A slight decrease in IRB drivers has occurred this season with 12 less drivers accredited. However a number of members have recently gained the necessary marine licence and are now eligible for the award.
Radio Operators Certificate	This is a popular award as it can be gained from 14 onwards. Overall 250 members gained this award (-143 from season 2011/2012)
Surf Rescue Certificate	This award is for both senior and junior members. It remains similar to last season with an increase of 1 person gaining the award

The Branch will continue to oversee major awards, the 2013/2014 season calendar we will see the Branch host 30+ courses for members and clubs in varying awards. Our major goal for the coming season will be to ensure that the clubs have an increased number of trainers for the specialist awards i.e. ART and Spinal Management so they can be self sufficient in training members for their patrolling needs.



## SURF SPORTS

Point Danger Branch continued this season with a full Surf Sports Calendar. Despite the inclement weather conditions we were fortunate to be able to hold all of our scheduled events except for one (Oceans 38 Round #3) and only had to move one venue (PD Senior Championships). There are some significant changes to the running of surf sports events at present. All competitors are now required to wear Hi Vis singlets in fluoro pink, additional reporting and risk management documentation is required and changes to the carnival entry and administration system will see some changes to the running of events with some greater reliance on computers and internet connections.

### POINT DANGER BRANCH CHAMPIONSHIPS

This season in consultation with the clubs, the Branch made some changes to the format of the Senior Championships. In past years this event has been run in conjunction with South Coast Branch as the Gold Coast City Titles. This season the Branch decided to run their own event and to make further changes to the events offered to ensure that the clubs and members could enjoy a one day event.

Masters age groups were changed to Female Masters and Male Masters (Under 35 and Over 35), Surf Boats, R&R and March Past were all removed from the event and only the main disciplines were offered. The feedback from clubs was largely positive and for the coming season some slight changes will be made to further ensure the smooth running of this event.

Due to weather conditions and beach erosion at Currumbin SLSC the event was required to be moved to North Kirra SLSC. Both clubs worked well and the event was a success.

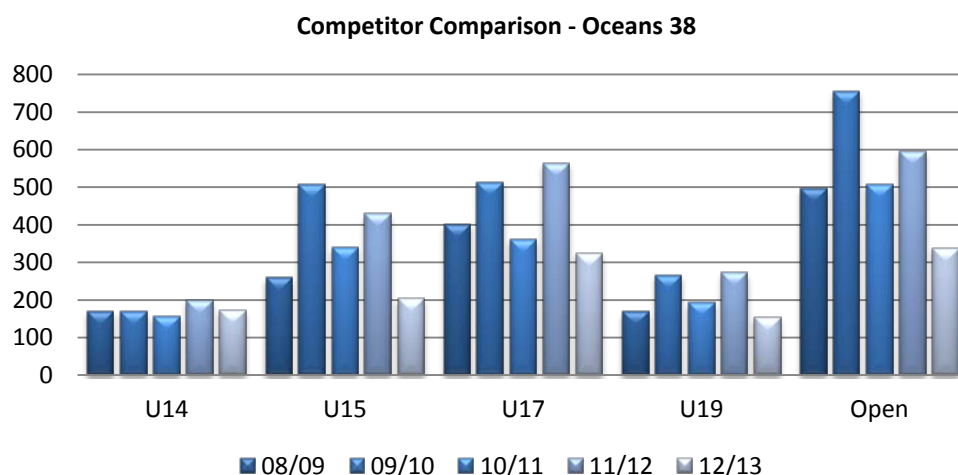
### SIZZLER OCEANS 38 PREMIERSHIP SERIES

Season 2012/2013 was the 5<sup>th</sup> season of this series and it still remains as the only carnival series in Queensland with prize money for Clubs. This is the second year that the Sunshine Coast Branch has been a part of this partnership and the hosting of an event on the Sunshine Coast has proven to be successful. Due to weather conditions we were unable to host the final round at Tugun, however all final pointscores and prize money was able to be calculated based on the two rounds run.



In season 2013/2014 changes will be made to the event with the beach events being taken out (they will form the Fastest Man on Sand series run by SLSQ). This will allow us to increase team events offered and focus on water competition. The relationship with the ASRL has continued with the number of competitors increasing each season in the Surf Boat part of the competition.

The following table indicates competitor comparison for the event over its five year history. Please note that there are no competitors listed for round 3 of this season due to the cancellation of the event.



## INTERBRANCH CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Interbranch Championships are changing regularly with modifications in events and available opportunities for the competitors. The event is now used as a major selection carnival for the Queensland State Team. In recent years, the Branches of South East Queensland have taken turns in running/hosting the event however, negotiations with SLSQ will now see them take over the logistics and administration of this event, leaving the Branches to concentrate on their teams. Point Danger Branch has written a "How To Guide" on the running of the Interbranch Carnival as this Branch was instrumental in the administration of the event when it reappeared on the carnival calendar 5 years ago.

This season the Branch will be looking at hosting some off season pool development clinics to further our competitors training and skills in the pool rescue part of the competition. This was identified as a weak point for the team and is being addressed as a matter of priority.

Some long term members of the Branch Team competed in their last event (due to change in age group in the coming season). Our thanks to Mitchell Littler, Sam Dick and Leah Jones for their dedication to the team over the last 5 seasons.

The team was again supported by local businesses – RU4 Real Adventures, Cannibal, Goldling, Ask Huey and Wise Management Solutions. This generous support assists the Branch in outfitting its competitors, officials and Management Team.

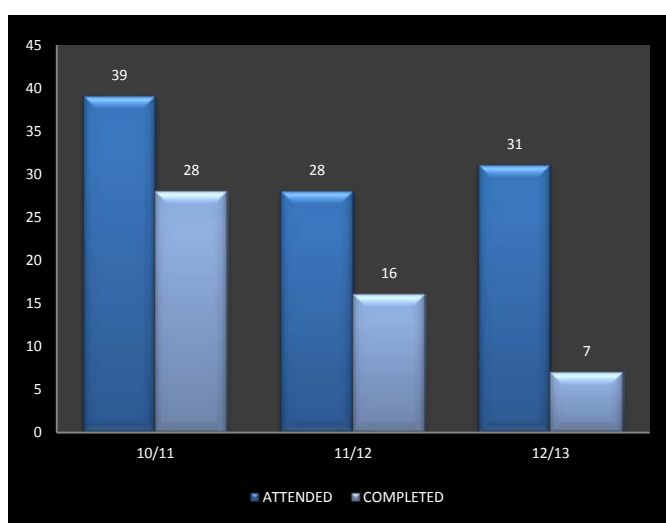

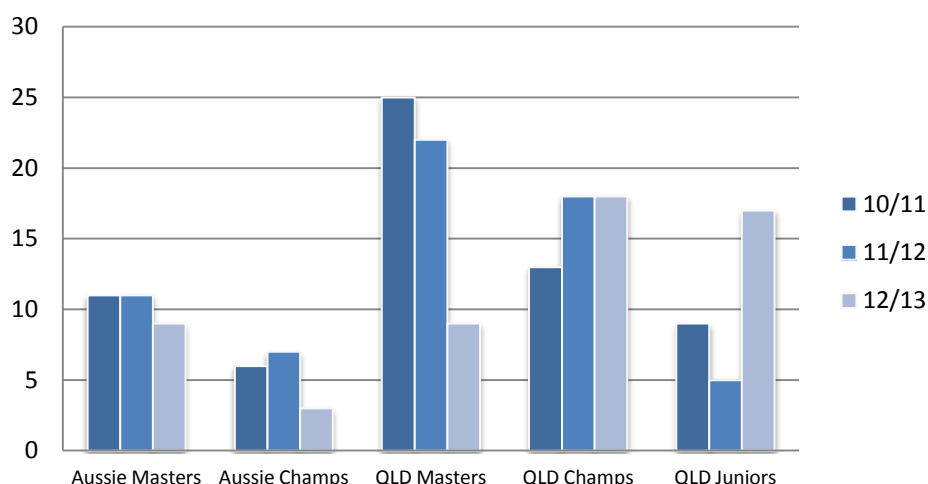

## JUNIOR ACTIVITIES

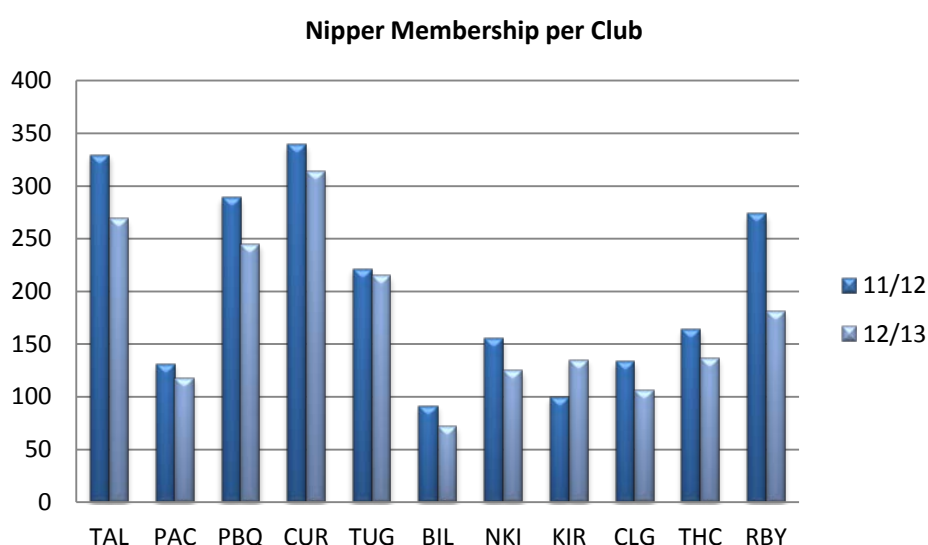
Junior Activities in Point Danger Branch continues to gain strength with clubs actively participating in activities to increase membership and ensure that current members have a great experience whilst they are involved in Nippers.

The Board of Junior Activities continues its role within the Branch structure, contributing guidance and recommendations as needed. The Branch Junior Information Night continues as an annual event and this has now been replicated across the State and other Branches. It is a great forum to inform the Clubs of all the necessary information for the coming season.

The Branch has continued its support of Junior Activity education through the provision of CPR courses for the Under 13 age group. These courses are run through the September and Christmas school holidays and assist the clubs in ensuring that their members gain this award and can continue their nipper activities and surf sports pursuits.

### MEMBERSHIP

This season there has been a decrease in total membership across SLSQ and Point Danger Branch is also showing decreased membership in most areas including nippers. At the close of season 2011/2012 the Branch had 2,227 nippers. At the end of season 2012/2013 we have finished with 1917 nippers (an overall decrease of 310 nippers across the Branch).



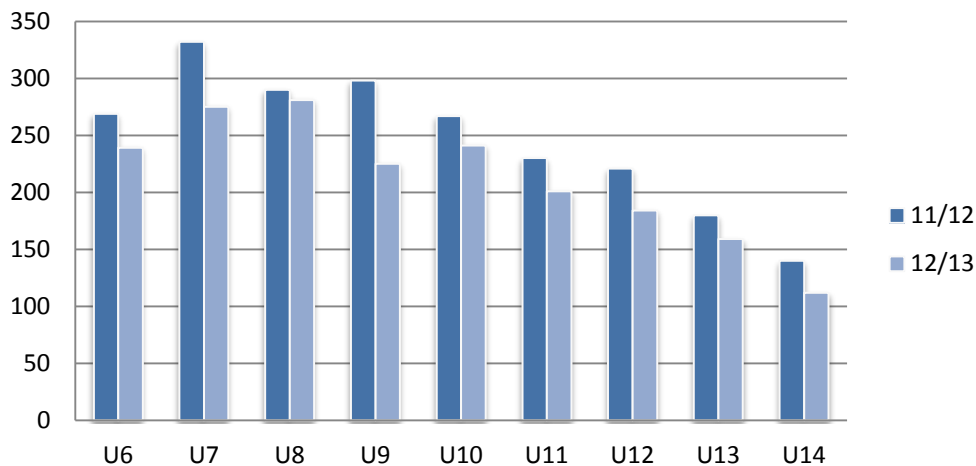
The only club to showcase an increase in membership for season 2012/2013 is Kirra SLSC (increase of 35 members overall). All other clubs have shown a decrease in membership with the largest decrease at Rain Bay SLSC (- 93 members).

In the off season the Branch will be showcasing Surf Life Saving at the Annual Childrens Expo, an event which attracts 10,000+ visitors. We will be providing information to the attendees on our clubs and their activities in the hope of recruiting more members to join our clubs.

Nippers has 9 age groups ranging from Under 5 to Under 14. The largest decrease in age groups occurred in the Under 9 age group with an overall decrease of 73 members. The Under 8 age group showcased the smallest decrease of 8 members.

## JUNIOR AGE AWARDS

Our focus in recent seasons was to ensure that clubs have access to the necessary training courses for their nipper staff i.e. Age Managers and Officials. To this end, Point Danger Branch runs 5 – 7 Age Managers courses per season to ensure that our members are suitably qualified to lead out littlest members. These courses are being held earlier in the season so nippers can commence with the necessary amount of support personnel.

In season 2012/2013 we held five (5) courses with 52 members attending these courses and a further 7 doing the course online. 38 members have completed all components of the course including the on beach assessment and have been issued the accreditation. We are continuing to identify members who can become Course Presenters and assist in presenting this course to clubs. The Branch also assisted SLSQ in training Little Life Saver coordinators in this award. The clubs of Point Danger Branch achieved the following this season

Our U8-U10 Teams Carnival continues to be an educational carnival for new Officials, Team Managers and competitors. The format of the carnival has not changed in recent years and ensures that all kids have the opportunity to have a go at all required disciplines for their age groups.

Little Dudes is still the largest U8-U10 carnival on the Gold Coast with both Point Danger and South Coast Branch Clubs participating. The overall attendance at this event averages 600 – 700 competitors per year. This event focuses on individual events only which gives the competitors a chance to test their skills whilst allowing us to keep the carnival within required timeframes.

## DEVELOPMENT OFFICERS

Point Danger Branch is at the end of the 2<sup>nd</sup> year of funding in relation to our Sport and Recreation Grant for the Development Officers. The Development Officers continue to oversee the annual programs that have been created to support our clubs and members.

### SCHOOL TALKS

This season we have been fortunate enough to have a corporate sponsor – Goldline assist us with the School Talks program. This support has enabled us to print posters and colour booklets to give to each school and school student respectively. The booklets were also made available to all Nippers in both Point Danger and South Coast Branch.

The project has two main objectives (a) to promote Surf Life Saving and its Clubs towards the recruitment of members and (b) to promote surf awareness and surf safety to coast based school children to ensure their safety when visiting the beach. The program includes

- ≠ Marine Stinger Information
- ≠ Sun Safety Information
- ≠ Waves and Rips
- ≠ Who to go to for help
- ≠ How to become a Nipper

In the 2012/2013 season the Branch Development Officers have visited 12 schools and spoken to 4,461 students. This program will continue in season 2013/2014 with a number of schools booked in for the summer season.

### TEAM X-TREME DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

In season 2011/2012 the Branch commenced a Youth Development Program aimed at empowering and educating youth members towards being future leaders at club level whilst also showcasing the other facets of Surf Life Saving e.g. Operations Support. At the end of season 2012/2013 the Branch has run 2 full programs under this banner and is currently in the middle of the third round of this program.

In season 2012/2013 – 34 members joined this program and collectively gained 97 awards. The current program which commenced at the end of season 2012/2013 and will finish in 2013/2014 has 30 members enrolled and they have commenced training in a number of awards already.

The members who enrol in this program are able to return to their clubs with an increased level of skill in essential lifesaving techniques. The awards gained in 12/13 are as follows

Five (5) courses were held over the September and December School Holidays and 60 members were trained successfully to gain their accreditation. Probationary Trainers assisted in these courses towards gaining their full accreditation.

Planning for this program has commenced and 6 courses are scheduled for season 2013/2014.

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## VALE – EARLE SMITH AM

Earle John Smith AM was truly a legend of Surf Life Saving. His many achievements over his 70+ year membership are certainly second to none.

Earle joined Kirra SLSC in 1942 and gained his Bronze in the same year. He remained a member of Kirra SLSC for 70 years. In this time he held a number of positions including Registrar, Club Captain, Chief Instructor and Deputy President. He was a member of the 1947 Australian Champion R&R Team and later went on to coach a number of teams. For his dedication to Kirra SLSC, Earle was granted Life Membership.

Earle's commitment to life saving also went on to SLSQ Point Danger Branch. He was a member of the Board of Examiners/Board of Life Saving for 64 years and held positions of District Supervisor, Deputy Superintendent, Superintendent, President and Patron. Earle was granted Life Membership of SLSQ Point Danger Branch. He was the long term District Supervisor of Currumbin SLSC and was named as a Life Governor of Currumbin for his long term commitment to the club.

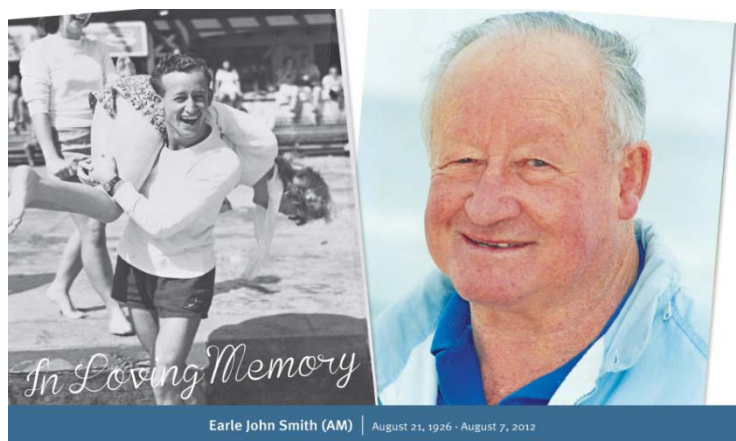
At a State level, Earle held some high level positions including Deputy Superintendent (Instruction and Examination) and later Superintendent. Earle also served as Deputy President of SLSQ for 5 years and was a State Councillor for 7 years. Earle is a Life Member of SLSQ.

As if his commitment in Queensland was not enough, Earle took on many positions at Surf Life Saving Australia. He was the Gear and Equipment Research Development Officer for 10 years and his dedication to safety led him to devise the Angled Ross Safety Belt in 1961 and later, the Inflatable Surf Rescue Belt. As well as dedication to life saving, Earle Smith was a talented Surf Sports Official – performing duties as a Sectional and Carnival Referee at all levels. He was named as Life Member of Surf Life Saving Australia and was later one of the inaugural inductees into the SLSA Hall of Fame in 2004.

In 1961 Earle and 3 other volunteers consented to have their breathing stopped as part of a dramatic demonstration to prove the worth of Expired Air Resuscitation. He was anaesthetised to the point where they had a pulse but no breathing. When the resuscitation method was performed all men were revived. This method was deemed a success and Expired Air Resuscitation became adopted practice for revival by emergency medical staff and Lifesavers Australia wide for the next 40 years.

There was no question that Earle was an outstanding lifesaver, but he was also an extraordinary person – his generosity and support of those around him was outstanding. He personally mentored, coached and assisted many young people in their education and general life. He was a fiercely loyal friend and a strong advocate for life saving – its clubs and members. He always argued for what he thought was right and strove to ensure that the interests of the members were at the core of surf life savings plans.

Earle Smith AM will never be replaced – not as a lifesaver or a friend. He was truly unique, a no nonsense man with a heart of gold. How fortunate we have been to have had him in Surf Life Saving. He is one of the greatest Surf Lifesavers this country has produced. His legacy will live on.





## TALLEBUDGERA SLSC

Tallebudgera beach was fatality free throughout season 2012/2013 which is due to the efforts of all those involved with the club. While patrolling members are the front line, the club has a support network of Administration Staff, Club Sponsors, Old Boys and families all doing their bit to keep the Club running and the beach safe. The patrolling members do however require special mention as the club has had to reduce the patrol groups to nine in line with accreditation requirements which meant that members were patrolling fortnightly instead of the usual three weekly this season.

Thanks to the Executive and sub Committee's for their time and effort in what is becoming a more demanding responsibility in taking on a management position. Sometimes the 'volunteer' aspect is forgotten. Mal, Kerrie and the team at Branch are not forgotten and thanks are extended.

Surf Sports was a little hit and miss this season with many events cancelled or moved to flat water due to weather conditions. The Tallebudgera boaties had another stellar season until the Australian Championships where the boys and girls became victims of the flat conditions. The Ski Team had more carnivals cancelled than they actually competed in but did well at the Australian Championships with most advancing further than last year, especially all the doubles crews. This season also saw the rise of the Under 15 competitors who had some terrific results all season cumulating with a 5<sup>th</sup> at Aussies in the U15 Male Surf Team, a first for Tallebudgera. These guys are set for some rewarding times in the competition arena.

Club sponsors are also to be congratulated for the support provided this season. The sponsorship dollar is more difficult to attract in these hard times so their contribution is especially appreciated. This would include the Tallebudgera SLS Supporters Club which continues to trade well, which is a credit to the Management Team and Committee.

Highlights of the year would include the successful grant application gained for the Club Bus. The bus was finished off with a great paint job and came in more useful than first envisaged. The willingness of the different sections to take ownership and budget and provide for their own future has also been a highlight this season. Single Administration would appear to have been bedded down this season and has proven to be beneficial for the club.

## PACIFIC SLSC

Season 2012/2013 provided many challenging days with some extreme weather conditions that were experienced over the patrol period and particularly around late January/February, when at times the beach was closed. However, faced with these adversities the volunteer patrolling members patrolled Pacific Beach and its environs and performed the duties and tasks assigned to them. The club always had volunteers to patrol the beach and ensure it was open to the public as required.



The commitment from the volunteer patrolling members enabled the public to be protected, educated, receive first aid treatment and at times be rescued. All patrolling members can be proud of their efforts and commitment. With a total of over 4,000 volunteer patrol hours by the 98 patrolling members Pacific SLSC maintained an excellent standard of lifesaving and diligence.

The month of December was once again the time for House to House collection. As a club Pacific SLSC collected a total of \$6,586.65. This season has seen a formal partnership agreement with the Pacific Supporters Club developed to provide a consistent and clear framework and expectations for the club to work from. The Supporters Club has provided over \$40,000.00 to the SLSC which will go into the clubs general account for acquittal as recommended by the Management Committee. Thank you to the Supporter's Committee who have worked hard in building upon the solid foundations previously set down. The club was also successful in obtaining a grant from the Queensland Government which was used to build the cupboards in the training room.

The Junior Committee has continued their dedication to Nippers. The junior section continues to be busy and active with the Nippers growing and developing into the future lifesavers to patrol at Pacific. The juniors had another successful competitive year culminating in a successful campaign at the Queensland Junior Championships. Congratulations to all concerned.

During the season Life Member Denis Carmody stepped down as Chief Training Officer (CTO). Denis has nurtured and trained so many of the present day lifesavers at Pacific SLSC in a respectful and caring way. Thanks to Denis for his contribution to Pacific and his dedication to the development of others. The role of CTO is perhaps one of the most important development positions at Pacific, without training the club does not have new people to assist on the beach. Over the years Denis has offered members an array of courses to choose from which enabled our members the opportunity to further their skills in Surf Lifesaving and enabled our Members to have available to them Bronze/SRC, Advanced Resuscitation/Defibrillator, IRB Driving/Crewman, ATV and Tractor courses to benefit members of our Club. Thank you for your commitment and dedication in this role and also to those who assist with training.

The season has indeed been successful and one of fun and achievements. The Management and Executive Officers have tirelessly dedicated so much time, energy, enthusiasm and commitment to enable the club to function and grow. Each contributing a skill set and maintaining a portfolio that keeps us functioning and protecting lives on the beach.

It has been an honour to work with a group of such dedicated and loyal members who have given up their time to serve the community and to ensure that Pacific Beach continues to be regarded as one of the safest beaches for all to enjoy. Thank you to Point Danger Branch for their support throughout the season.

## PALM BEACH SLSC

The 2012/13 season has certainly been a challenging one for Palm Beach SLSC. Following the Club's AGM, a number of key committee positions were unfilled including Executive positions. However the positions were filled with a mixture of experienced and new faces taking on the challenge. Unfortunately the club went through the season without key positions being filled including Fundraising Co-ordinator, Property Director and more. A challenge for next season is to recruit new people to fill committee positions and lighten the load for the benefit of the Club overall.



The total membership was 546 with 245 nippers (one of the real strengths of Palm Beach SLSC). In terms of patrols the club had 142 members participate in patrols (including an SRC group from the U14 nippers) providing a total 4,912 patrol hours, an average of 35 per participating member.

This season Palm Beach recorded 34 rescues with no fatalities and 61 incidents including recorded first aid treatment.

The Club had some success with grants over the season including funds being obtained to:

- ≠ Upgrade the First Aid room
- ≠ Purchase a new patrol trailer
- ≠ Upgrade gym facilities
- ≠ Purchase new beach flags & other patrol equipment
- ≠ Acquire new nipper boards & training resources.

Funding sources included the Jupiter's Casino Community Benefit Fund, Gambling Community Benefit Fund, Sport & Recreation QLD and SLSQ Sustainability Fund.

Another successful season was experienced with the nippers program with 245 kids participating. Palm Beach nippers participated well in a range of carnivals including Branch, Queensland Endurance, Board Riding, Queensland Junior Championships, Queensland Championships and Australian Championships. The club acquired a new junior coach to focus on the nippers this season while the regular coach focused on the Under 14 age group and above.

The new Chief Training Officer proved to be a great asset and tireless worker who not only implemented a comprehensive range of training courses including the nipper awards programs, but worked hands on to improve the tidiness and functionality of the training room and most areas of the Surf Club. Thanks to Richard Andrews.

The active members kept the beach safe this season and the Patrol Captains co-ordinated patrols well. The Club Captain performed many additional hours in addition to co-ordinating patrols and undertaking many other committee and other Club tasks, well beyond the scope of the role.

Recently the Club received approval from GCCC for its Development Application to upgrade facilities. The first phase of this project is a substantial upgrade of the Supporters Club facilities which will see a total revamp of the club and increased floor space.

## CURRUMBIN SLSC

From a lifesaving perspective Currumbin was fortunate to have 243 volunteer members patrol the beach throughout the season and with a growing number of Trainers and Assessors the club was able to process 137 new awards. The club was lucky enough to have a stable Committee with not many changes from the previous season, this allowed the club to gain some momentum with regards to the procedures and policies that were implemented last season following some major changes to the Management committee.



Financially, the Club made an investment by purchasing a factory in Currumbin at the start of the season. This was the clubs first major asset purchase and as a club a commitment has been made to working towards creating a sustainable club for future generations to enjoy and prosper. It also solved a storage problem which the club has been facing for a number of years, allowing the club a more secure location to store gear and equipment that was unable to be stored at the Club due to space constraints.

The club was pleased to have taken an active role in the community in 2013, hosting various community group meetings at the Surf and Nippers Club. Currumbin SLSC was awarded the Keep Queensland Beautiful Cleanest Beach Award in 2013 and throughout the season strived to enhance the local environment by working with Griffith University, SLSA and the Palm Beach Shoreline Project on environmental impact and climate change studies and research programs.

On the Surf Sports side of things the club had a successful season winning the Ocean Thunder Surf Boat Series, Point Danger Branch Championships and finishing 3<sup>rd</sup> at the Queensland Junior Championships, 4<sup>th</sup> at the Queensland Championships and 12<sup>th</sup> at the Australian Championships. In one of the highlights of the season, Ironman Jackson Maynard took out Bronze in the Open Ironman event at the Australian Championships. With some very talented coaches and a group of enthusiastic surf sports competitors Currumbin SLSC looks forward to continued success in Surf Sports in the coming season and building on these results.

Currumbin SLSC was delighted to participate in the Point Danger Branch Team X-Treme Program in 2012/2013. 12 club members joined in this program which is a wonderful initiative and a great lifesaving educational program for junior members who aren't necessarily competitors but have a passion for surf lifesaving. As a result the club has what it believes is a future platform for qualified juniors to progress through the ranks and become future patrol captains. In encouraging signs, from an educational perspective the club also had three juniors graduate as Bronze Trainers throughout the season with one member training her first Bronze Course at the start of 2013. Again with youth like this coming through the system the future looks to be in good hands both on and off the beach.

The club hosted the Currumbin Anzac Day Dawn Service. Seventy Lifesavers were involved in the ceremony which included fourteen boats rowing to sea and scattering ashes on behalf of the families of fallen diggers. Currumbin was also host club for the Coolangatta Gold transition, Point Danger Branch U8-10 Teams Carnival and the Point Danger Branch Championships (though due to beach conditions the event was moved to North Kirra with Currumbin still providing the workforce).

The club received a new ATV from Jupiter's Casino Community Benefit Fund throughout the season and would like to formally acknowledge our appreciation of the generosity of Jupiter's Casino and SLSQ for allowing this to happen. Finally, I'd like to thank the Branch Committee and staff for their ongoing support to the clubs and we look forward to another enjoyable and successful season in 2013/2014.



## TUGUN SLSC

It has been another interesting year at Tugun SLSC with numerous highlights and a couple of low lights that actually had silver linings.

The year started off with a lot of promise, host club of an Ocean's 38 carnival, appointed the boat area for the Aussies, good patrol numbers and a Surf Girl Year. The club then ran into a bit of head wind with the storms in January forcing the cancellation of the Oceans 38 Carnival and the subsequent major damage to the Club House and beach which in turn forced the relocation of the boats to North Kirra.

The storm ruined 70% of the poker machines and numerous TV's, computer terminals, servers and fridges. This forced the closure of the Club for only 2 days and then by a lot of hard work, the Supporters Club and team opened with little electricity, no fridges or TV's for the patrons. The team's hard work and the good insurance coverage provided through SLSQ enabled the Club to get back on its trading feet within a week or two. Like many of our sister clubs Tugun relies on gaming income to improve the bottom line of the Surf Club however with many of our machines out of order we took a serious hit during February and March until we took delivery of 27 new machines- Silver Lining 1



The move to North Kirra for the Aussies was also a major blow for the club but SLSA requested Tugun to continue with the workforce. This gave the club an opportunity to "get our toes wet" by doing the workforce only rather than run the whole event. The workforce received rave reviews from the boaties and officials and has given Tugun SLSC the confidence to apply again for the boats when next on our part of the coast. The added bonus was the significant fund raising this contract allowed – Silver Lining 2

Being a Surf Girl year for the club was another huge event and Tugun would sincerely like to thank Jupiter's Summer Surf Girl – Jodi Mitchell and her Committee for the big effort they put in throughout the season to raise another significant amount of money for the Club. The activities were well planned and attended and once again demonstrated the network of non members Tugun has both as helpers and supporters.

Competitively, it was also a good year for the club with the water section workhorse Hugh Dougherty winning silver at the Australian Championships in the Open Board.

The Hunters (Open Female Boat Crew), Under 15 2 person R&R and the much maligned March Past Team all won Gold at the Queensland Championships – well done all.

Speaking of competition, I would like to thank all of those competitors who put the hard yards in at training every week and wave the Tugun flag at as many carnivals as they do.



## BILINGA SLSC

What a huge year for Bilinga SLSC. The Club took delivery of the “Bill Goodwin” IRB, received a grant and took delivery of the 4WD and are making huge inroads towards obtaining a building grant for the extension.

High praise is warranted for the efforts of Point Danger Branch, with Branch Manager Kerrie Barnes and team demonstrating the foresight required to identify Bilinga’s needs. SLSQ saw to the needs of Bilinga also, pushing through recommendations Point Danger Branch identified. Bilinga is strongly indebted to Surf Life Saving Queensland.

Queensland Government Initiatives such as sustainability grants contributed towards Bilinga obtaining an IRB and 4WD. Minister for Tourism, Small Business, Sports and Commonwealth Games and The Honourable Jann Stuckey has been instrumental in pushing for the proposed building grant. Jann’s support is a huge asset and will help us going forward to ensure Bilinga’s needs are met. Thank you Jann for being an excellent Member especially in these tough times.

Karen Andrews, Federal Member for McPherson, has very nobly donated the perpetual shield for “Most Proficient Patrol Team”. Koen Bray was the recipient of the “McPherson Community Achievement Award”, an initiative of Karen Andrews. Koen continues to excel in everything he puts his mind to. His list of surf lifesaving accreditations continues to grow and grow.

Bilinga’s local Council Member, Chris Robbins, continues to represent Bilinga well. Local council has helped the club with regards to the beach, foreshore and GCCC grants, rates assistance, water and sewerage assistance and more recently Bilinga’s public car park upgrade. Thank you Chris, well done and keep up the good work.

Bilinga’s membership is steadily increasing with a number of awards being gained by members. Hopefully several IRB crewmen, drivers and training officers shall be gained going into the 2013/14 season.

Fundraising activities such as the House to House, Coolangatta Airport collections and patronage of the bar/function room are the clubs main sources of income. Bilinga’s supporters and sponsors cannot be thanked enough.

Nippers is very stable with junior members progressing into the senior ranks year by year and more junior members continuing to learn and enjoy activities at Bilinga nippers.

The continuing vigilance and service continues to be rewarded with safe beaches at Bilinga. Thanks go out to Brisbane Life Saving; their donated time has relieved pressure on Bilinga SLSC members and allowed the club to maintain the quality of patrols Bilinga beachgoers deserve. Congratulations to Bilinga members for a job well done and particular thanks to Bilinga’s Management committee for their support and dedication.



## NORTH KIRRA SLSC

Overall, the 2012/ 2013 season was a success with the Club continuing to grow, while ensuring the ongoing improvement in the quality of all programs.

Patrols continued to improve throughout the season following completion of several Bronze courses and other awards, including ART, First Aid and IRB to name only a few. In particular, students from Loganlea State High School completed their Bronze Medallion which added an additional 16 members to the patrol roster. Overall, a total of over 4,380 patrol hours were undertaken by 98 members.

This season, the club undertook a full review of the patrol roster. One of the biggest changes was the addition of a 'buddy patrol' whereby each group 'buddies' up with a Sunday afternoon patrol. This enabled the Club to ensure its patrolling obligations continued to be met, while spreading the workload amongst all members. In addition, the Club was fortunate to receive funds under the DCS Grant to purchase a new patrol tower, laptop and projector for training purposes.



The nipper program continues to go from strength to strength. A full Junior Activities Committee as well as a strong contingent of Age Managers, Assistant Age Managers, Registrars and helpers has enabled the program to excel in recent years. This has resulted in parents and friends increasing their engagement and ensuring the Club keeps its family friendly atmosphere. Furthermore, each age group was given a target to raise \$400 to keep membership fees low and assist in the purchase of new equipment. This challenge was undertaken with pride and some age groups far exceeded their target.

Competition at North Kirra continues to improve with a developing training regime. In the strongest year in recent times, North Kirra sent 22 competitors to the Queensland Junior Championships who produced a commendable result. With ongoing training and development, the club looks forward to all members developing their skills further.

North Kirra also played host to many carnivals, most notably the Australian Championships. This event was well supported by the members, many of whom took a full week off work to assist. The club benefited greatly from this event which was the result of a lot of hard work. In addition to the Australian Championships, North Kirra also hosted the Little Dudes Carnival and the Point Danger Branch Championships whereby we continue to refine our ability to efficiently deliver these events.

North Kirra has had a specific focus on developing its cadet program to ensure the club retains the junior members as they progress to patrolling members. In particular, the club ran two camps which were very well received. In addition, North Kirra SLSC has 5 members in the PDB Team X-Treme program which is a fantastic program and we thank the PDB staff for their time and commitment.





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**Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

The Management Committee prepared the financial statements of the trust on the basis that the trust is a non-reporting entity because there are no users dependant on general purpose financial statements. The financial statements are therefore special purpose financial statements that have been prepared in order to meet the requirements of the trust deed, the information needs of the stakeholders and for the basis of preparation of the income tax return.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the significant accounting policies disclosed below, which the Management Committee determined are appropriate to meet the purposes of preparation. Such accounting policies are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs unless otherwise stated in the notes. The accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of the statements are as follows:

**(a) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)**

Property, Plant and Equipment are carried at cost or at independent or Management Committee valuation. All assets, excluding freehold land and buildings are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the trust. Increases in the carrying amount arising on revaluation of land and buildings are credited to a revaluation reserve in equity. Decreases that offset previous increases of the same asset are charged against fair value reserves directly in equity; all other decreases are charged to the income statement. Each year the difference between depreciation based on the revalued carrying amount of the assets charged to the income statement and depreciation based on the asset's original cost is transferred from the revaluation reserve to retained earnings.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by Management Committee to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the asset's employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted in determining recoverable amounts.

**(b) Cash and Cash Equivalents**

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities on the balance sheet.

**(c) Revenue and Other Income**

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which, for floating rate financial assets, is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Revenue recognised related to the provision of services is determined with reference to the stage of completion of the transaction at the reporting date and where outcome of the contract can be estimated reliably. Stage of completion is determined with reference to the services performed to date as a percentage of total anticipated services to be performed. Where the outcome cannot be estimated reliably, revenue is recognised only to the extent that related expenditure is recoverable.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

**(d) Goods and Services Tax (GST)**

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Tax Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the balance sheet are shown inclusive of GST.

**(e) Employee Benefits**

Provision is made for the liability for employee entitlements arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related costs.
