EXECUTIVE OVERVIEW

PRESIDENTS MESSAGE

During 2015/2016 SLSQ Point Danger Branch as an emergency service provider to the southern end of the Gold Coast, faced many challenges and realised some truly great achievements in the last twelve months. Importantly, the Branch and Clubs were successful in maintaining an exemplary record in aquatic safety as it related to our beaches.



In this period, the Branch and Clubs demonstrated a proactive commitment towards surf lifesaving supported by a strong focus on providing a professional life saving service underpinned by the courage, fairness and pride displayed by our members. This, combined with our ethic in working with members of the community, proved to be the pillars of success from which Point Danger Branch achieved an outstanding surf lifesaving season. I thank all Clubs and members for their continued efforts and for engaging with the communities, educating beach users and enforcing the principals of surf lifesaving.

In closing, I remain extremely proud of the ongoing efforts and I thank each of our clubs and members for your loyalty, courage and commitment to the duties you undertake and for the way in which you have represented Point Danger Branch.

SIGNIFICANT ACHIEVEMENTS

Continuation of Annual Calendar

To compliment and support the Branch's strategic plan, a performance framework, supporting our operational direction for the season was developed. As a result, the Branch produced a functioning calendar highlighting our priorities for the twelve-month period.

The season saw a number of additions made to the calendar such as specific dates relating to officials and carnival nomination due dates, High Performance Squad calendar commitments, and Team X-Treme youth program dates. Additionally, this Branch maintained a firm commitment to SLSQ Training and Education Department in the provision of emergency care training (ECT) and other specialist courses required by the clubs and members including Beach Management, Observers and Officials courses.

The result of which saw thirty-nine (39) courses on the annual calendar. Fifteen (15) of these were for emergency care awards. In total 2047 senior awards were gained across the Branch (an increase of 548 on season 14/15).

PDB Membership

In maintaining a strategic view on surf lifesaving services provided by Point Danger, this season saw members of the Branch organising and rendering assistance to some of our smaller, but equally important clubs by providing additional patrols once a month. Members performing this service were active members of the Branch in contrast to being attached to a particular club. The rationale behind this initiative highlighted the supportive and contemporary approach to lifesaving services provided by Branch members and this office. This was also linked to one of our priorities in supporting 'at risk' clubs.

Point Danger Branch now boasts a membership of twenty-five (25) members who patrol, officiate, hold positions and significantly contribute to surf lifesaving. The success of this initiative cannot be understated as we move forward and provide a more united, flexible and responsive approach to surf lifesaving.

Resources for Clubs

In acknowledging and supporting our future leaders in lifesaving, this office maintained a commitment as a 'support service' to its clubs. As such the Branch authored a number of procedural manuals and documents designed to assist office bearers and members who had accepted senior roles within our organisation. This included, but was not exclusive to a Club Captains Guide, Proficiency Resource Book, Confidentiality Agreement template and Supporters Club Sub Lease template documents. Season 2016/2017 will see additional resources made available for clubs and office bearers including a Junior Activity Resource book, Youth Workbook and Age Managers Resource Kits. Additionally, the Branch was also requested to provide guidance and direction to staff at the Gold Coast Regional Office (GCRO) administration staff in relation to developing a "systems based" approach to support their office administration. With this in mind a number of meetings were held and administrative support provided to the GCRO.

ICT Innovation

Point Danger Branch, not only maintained a contemporary approach to operational surf lifesaving, but also were mindful of effective strategies and what was seen as 'best practice' in public and private sector management. As such this office supported a 'red tape reduction' program for the Branch. This minimised certain processes that had become somewhat cumbersome.

Success of the program was evidenced by the Branch developing an online induction for Child Youth Risk Management (the completion of which is a legislative requirement) for members. Previously, this has been completed by in class tutorial. This office has successfully progressed this method of service delivery to our members with such success resulting in the initiative being adapted in other areas of surf lifesaving. It is envisaged that similar types of this initiative will be piloted by this Branch and addressed in our strategic administrative framework as we will continue to support to our members in what is a challenging environment steeped compliance and risk aversion.



In season 2016/2017 the Branch will be introducing an online Officials sign on program. This will allow us to streamline sign ons and have necessary reports to assist in the tracking of Official's activities each season.

Youth Development

Youth Development has been a focus of the Branch for a number of seasons with the introduction and continuing success of Team X-Treme – education and development program. In response to the needs of the youth membership the Branch has initiated a Youth Panel and new program – Youth WAYS.

Further, the Branch has also provided funding to the clubs (through the SLSQ Youth Funding) for the provision of Certificate 4 courses for youth members which will assist the clubs in training and education.

MANAGEMENT OF FISCAL POLICY

It was acknowledged from the outset by senior managers of this office that meeting the demands of providing an effective emergency service in the 2015/2016 financial year was going to be financially challenging. That being said the Branch is pleased to announce that Point Danger Branch, again completed the season in a very secure financial position.

Importantly, this achievement in financial management was completed without compromise to core business and service delivery. Moreover, it was achieved as the Branch strongly advanced its priorities and successes in operational surf lifesaving activities. To this end, the Point Danger Branch Executive Committee acknowledges the support of office bearers, volunteers and professional staff committed to the success of Point Danger.

In support of the exceptional work done 'internally' on this issue Point Danger Branch was relentless in its pursuit of seeking and obtaining supportive funding wherever possible. This resulted in numerous grants being applied for and received to increase the equipment and facilities available for our members and clubs. Subsequently, we have applied for and been successful for major support funding such as:

- ≡ SLSQ/QFES Grant
- ≡ Queensland Sport & Recreation Grant

This, combined with the continued support from the City of Gold Coast with an annual donation of \$65000.00, assists the Branch and its clubs greatly with the purchase and maintenance of life saving equipment.

In addition to this, this branch acknowledges a donation of \$25000.00 from SLSQ to assist in funding youth development activities within the Branch. A number of grants have been applied for the coming season for building renovation, surf sports equipment, ICT and youth.

CORPORATE AND OPERATIONAL GOVERNANCE

In high risk emergency management such as surf lifesaving, a strong governance framework is needed to maintain compliance to organisational standards, and most importantly community expectations.

Governance primarily relates to the guidelines by which an organisation operates and provides the underlying framework with which a committee or club makes decisions and takes action for a shared purpose.

Point Danger Branch, in not only maintaining success based on attaining sustainable desired outcomes, introduced a structured governance model ensuring a professional approach to our core business.

In order to provide a robust governance framework conducive to emergency management, the Branch introduced workshops, operational guidelines and programs to assist our members and clubs.

Important critical factors influencing the governance framework were:

- ≡ Ensuring a systematic approach to the completion of required compliance deliverables such as CYRM, Patrol Gap Calculator, Compliance Reviews
- ≡ Whole of Club/Branch Policy outlining the rationale and requirements of the policy whereby IP Usage Policy, Confidentiality Agreements and Long Term Officials Review were introduced
- ≡ Red tape reduction strategy thus minimising the burden of any bureaucratic process.

Governance initiatives introduced for this period also included : regular reviews on patrols logs, committees, awards, blue cards and AGM Notices and Minutes.

FUTURE CHALLENGES

To continue to provide an effective contemporary lifesaving service requires constant adaptation, innovation and enthusiasm.

With this in mind the following strategies have been identified as directional milestones for the ensuing season that will make sure we continue to build on the success of surf lifesaving within the Point Danger Branch :

- ≡ A structured review of 'current state analyses' outlining the present status of lifesaving services provided by Point Danger Branch and their linkage to our current priorities
- ≡ A review of critical challenges experienced during the last season and develop strategies that will assist in identifying and future proofing the office on issues and challenges to be addressed as we move forward

Upon completion of this review this office will develop a 'concept of operations' which will articulate the operational and administrative framework that will support Point Danger in the year ahead.



This office has already acknowledged certain areas that will be addressed as we move forward:

- ≡ Identifying the Branch's stage of development and adjusting our leadership style to support futuristic development
- ≡ Formulating and communicating the purpose, direction and goals of our office to key stakeholders
- ≡ Evaluating our office's culture and action strategies to develop a high performing team
- ≡ Involve our office in problem solving with a view to supporting all affiliated clubs.



Our ultimate aim as a Branch is to ensure the future viability of our clubs through :

- ≡ Inspiring successful leadership at club, branch and state level
- ≡ Developing club sustainability
- ≡ Developing a supportive and professional framework for key volunteers as they embrace innovation and leadership
- ≡ Provide motivation for operational life savers as they strive to meet the demands of service delivery and core business

The Branch's focus will be on the above strategies through interactive, supportive programs and systems, and the provision of informational and developmental workshops.

Another key focus will be on the four (4) areas of governance to further assist the clubs :

- ≡ Legislative requirements such as Blue Card/CYRM compliance
- ≡ Operational Competency
- ≡ Managing Ethical Dilemmas
- ≡ Administration of Club Legal Requirements

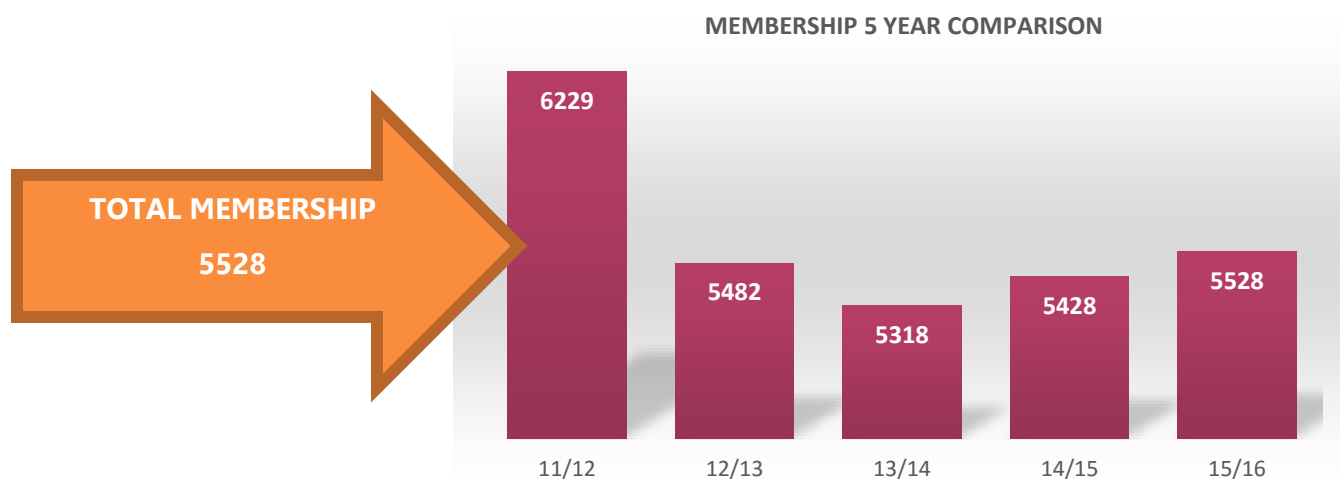

MEMBERSHIP

OVERALL MEMBERSHIP

For the second consecutive season, Point Danger Branch has experienced an increase in overall membership. Season 2015/2016 finished with 5528 members – a 1.84% increase in total (100 members overall).

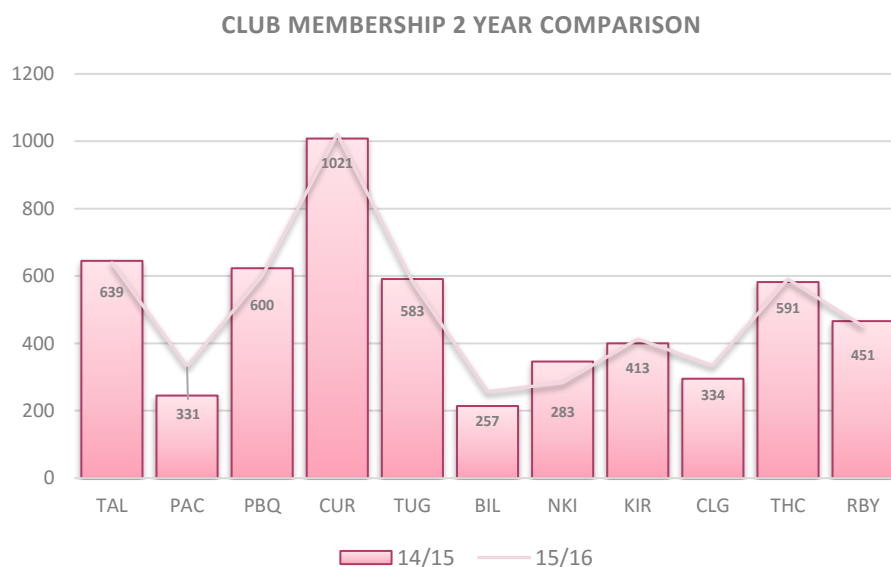
A comparison of the last five (5) seasons has shown that the membership peaked in 2011/2012 at 6229 followed by two (2) seasons of decline in membership (2012/2013 and 2013/2014). Season 2014/2015 and 2015/2016 have shown increases each season.



(*) it should be noted that SLSQ membership stats differ to ours – SLSQ removes dual members from stats, whilst PDB leaves them in as they are operational at dual clubs

CLUB MEMBERSHIP

Six (6) affiliated clubs have experienced an increase in membership. The largest increase in membership was recorded at Pacific SLSC with an increase of 86 members (35.10%). Currumbin SLSC, Bilinga SLSC, Kirra SLSC and TH&C SLSC have shown concurrent gains over the last two (2) seasons.



Five (5) clubs posted a decrease throughout the season with the largest decrease noted at North Kirra SLSC (-66 members). North Kirra SLSC and Rainbow Bay SLSC have shown concurrent decreases over the last two (2) seasons.

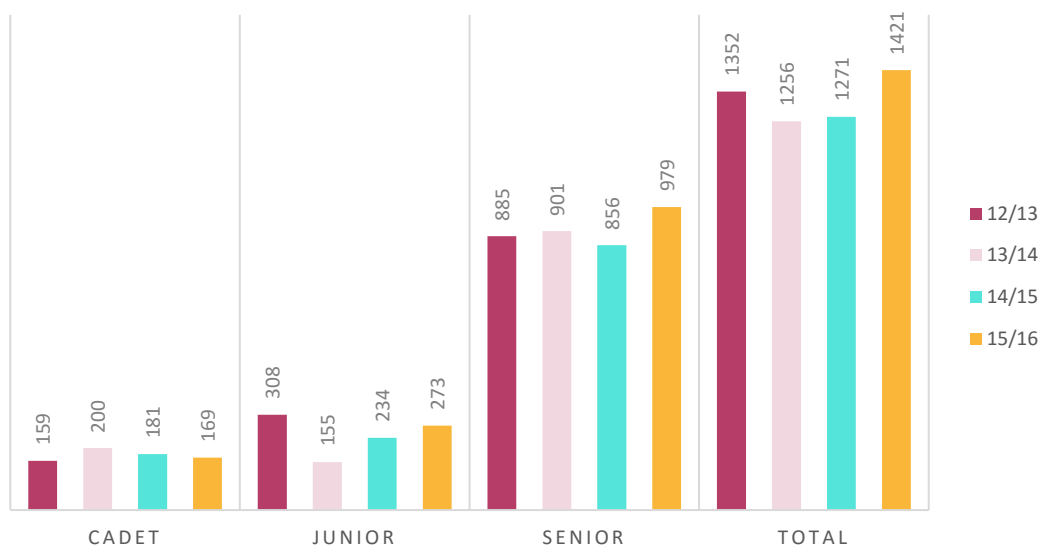
ACTIVE MEMBERSHIP

For the second consecutive season Point Danger Branch has experienced an increase in Active Membership. In season 2015/2016, the Active Junior and Senior membership categories have experienced an increase. The Active Cadet category experienced a slight decrease (-12). Overall the increase was 11.80% in active membership across the Branch (150 members in total).

Supporting Active Membership categories such as Active Reserve, Award and Long Service have also experienced an increase.

ACTIVE MEMBERSHIP COMPARISON

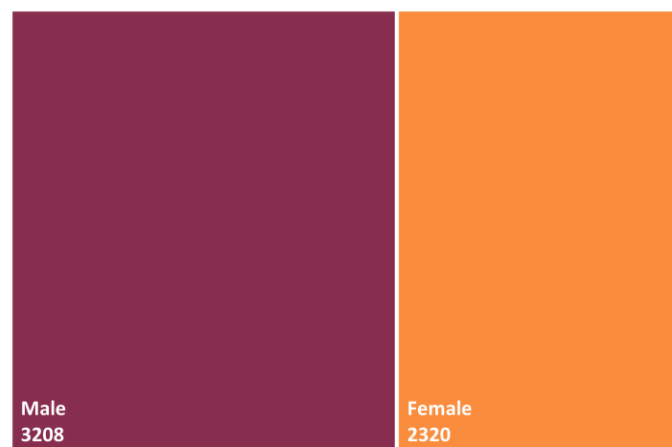


MEMBERSHIP BY GENDER

Gender comparisons over recent seasons have indicated that overall male members outnumber female members.

As per last season male members make up 52% of the membership with female making up 48%.

Females showcase higher numbers in two categories only – Cadet and Associate.



OPERATIONS

Operational Life Saving continues to be our biggest challenge each season with eleven (11) beaches and 14kms of coastline to keep safe. Again, the clubs and members have finished the season with no lives lost between the flags on Point Danger Branch beaches.

The dedication and commitment of our clubs and members in maintaining the safety of the beaches and the beach going public is second to none. From the operational management, equipment purchases and maintenance to the logistics and administration of the patrolling rosters, the clubs have finalised the season well.

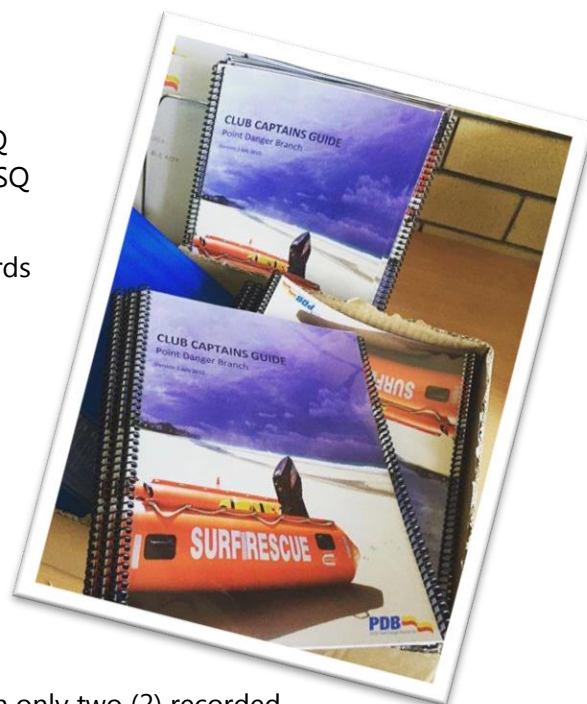
PATROL SERVICE CONTRACTS & PATROL OPERATIONS MANUAL

Season 2015/2016 commenced with all clubs signing the SLSQ Patrol Service Contract in line with the requirements of the SLSQ Patrol Operations Manual.

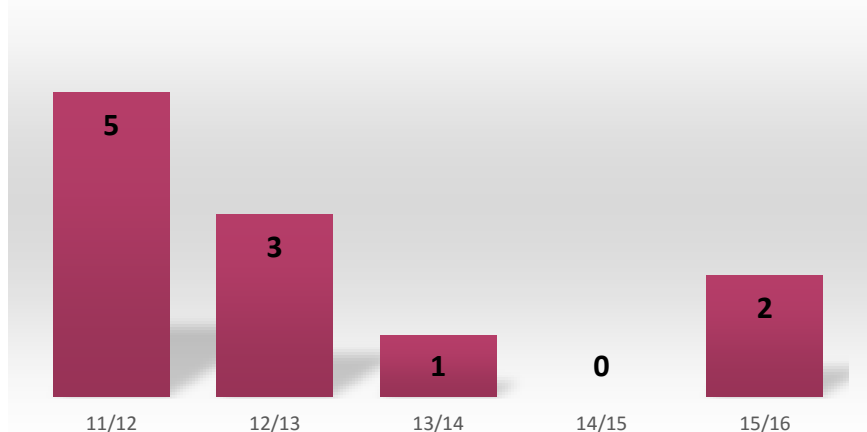
The SLSQ Patrol Operations Manual sets the minimum standards for the volunteers and clubs patrolling the beaches. The Clubs and Branch together sign the Patrol Service Contract which is endorsed by the SLSQ Life Saving Committee. This document holds all parties accountable for the requirements – both human and non-human that are necessary on patrols.

To assist our Club Captains in their role the Branch compiled a Club Captains Guide which outlines the necessary requirement of their role including position description, duties, planning for the season and support networks.

Patrol Breaches have been kept to a minimum this season with only two (2) recorded breaches. The Branch has a set system in managing breaches throughout the season and this includes an approved Branch policy liaison with the club, set protocols in relation to corrective behavior and correspondence to SLSQ when a result has been reached.

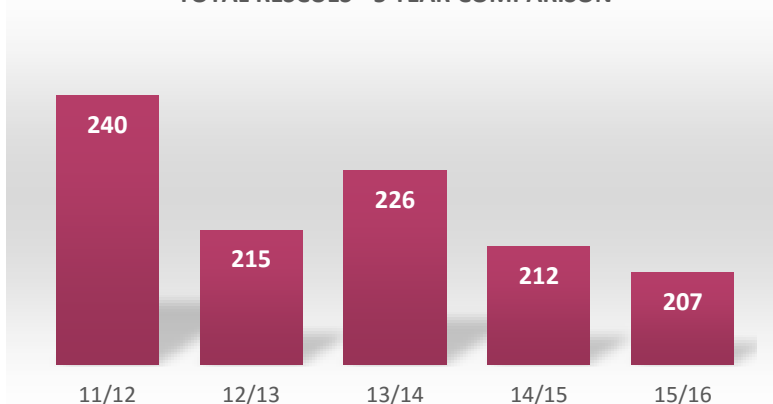
Rescues & Visitations

Season 2015/2016 saw a slight decrease in recorded rescues from last season (-2.3%). This is the lowest rate of recorded rescues in the past six (6) seasons – finishing the season with 207 rescues and a total of 529514 visitations (105853 swimmers inside flags, 31554 swimmers outside flags, 81115 craft users and 310992 on the beach).

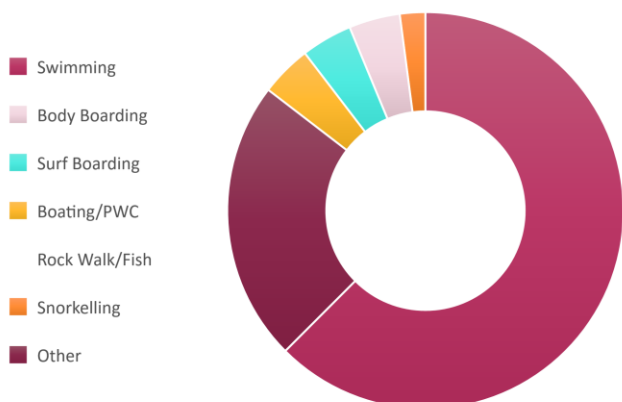
This season, the Rescue Tube has been utilised as the most popular piece of rescue equipment with 31.41% of total rescues. Surf Boats have also been recorded as performing rescues – completing 0.96% of total rescues (2).

TOTAL RESCUES - 5 YEAR COMPARISON



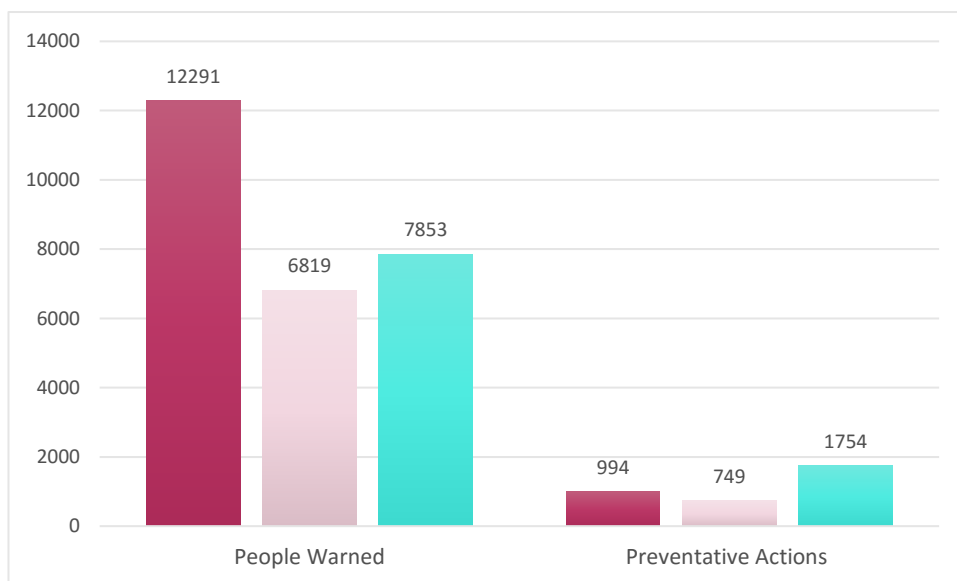
ACTIVITY AT TIME OF RESCUE



Preventative Actions & Warnings

Preventative Actions and Warnings are an integral component of the volunteer patrol and with an increase in actions and warnings the rate of rescues have decreased. Preventative Actions are used to correct behaviours of the bathing public, change the area of patrols or generally provide warnings to ensure that an incident is averted.

Season 2015/2016 saw an increase in Preventative Actions of 134.17% (+1005) from season 2014/2015. This included 610 warnings signs erected. People warned continues to be at a high level with an increase of 1034 warnings given throughout the season.

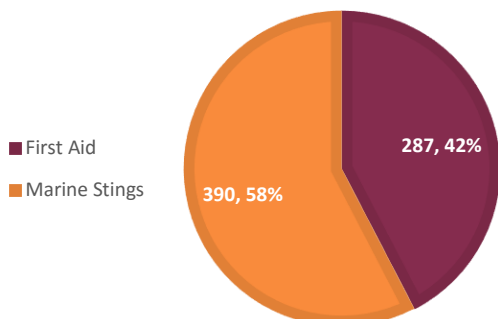


First Aid Treatments & Marine Stings

This season saw an increase of 36.01% in first aid cases throughout the season.

Overall 287 first aid cases were treated by the clubs.

Of 838 Marine Stingers sighted only 390 stings were recorded. This is a substantial decrease from season 2014/2015 of 698 stings.



QFES/SLSQ SUSTAINABILITY FUNDING

As in previous seasons, the Branch clubs have proactively applied for the QFES/SLSQ Sustainability Funding. Through the continued support of the QLD Government and SLSQ, the clubs have the opportunity to gain funds to assist with the provision of life saving services and equipment.

10 of the 11 clubs applied to the program and gained \$42966.86 in funds (a decrease of \$8833.14 from season 2014/2015).

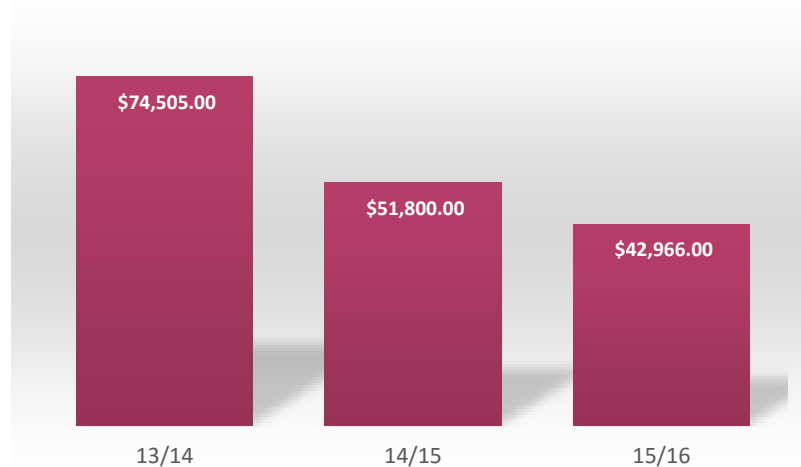

PATROL CLUB OF THE YEAR

The Point Danger Branch Patrol Club of the Year Award was introduced (in its current format) in 2006/2007. The benefits in conducting a Patrol Club of the Year competition are many, with some of the main benefits having been identified as being:

- ≡ The advancement of lifesaving skills
- ≡ Promoting patrolling efficiency
- ≡ Using the competition as an identification tool that can detect areas of patrolling that may need improving and reviewing
- ≡ Building morale and club strength
- ≡ Keeping patrols active

Recognising the winner of this award is paramount, through the support of Jann Stuckey MP (Member for Currumbin) the winner has been presented with a rescue board.



Changes were made to the award for season 2015/2016 to streamline the requirements of the clubs and encourage programs with surf lifesaving. These changes included

- ≡ Inclusion of Oxy Viva Service
- ≡ Completion of Patrol Gap Calculator
- ≡ Provision of club patrol rosters to the Branch
- ≡ Points awarded to each club that entered the Surf Rescue Championships
- ≡ Points awarded to each club that nominates members in the U18, 18-25 and Life Saver of the Year categories

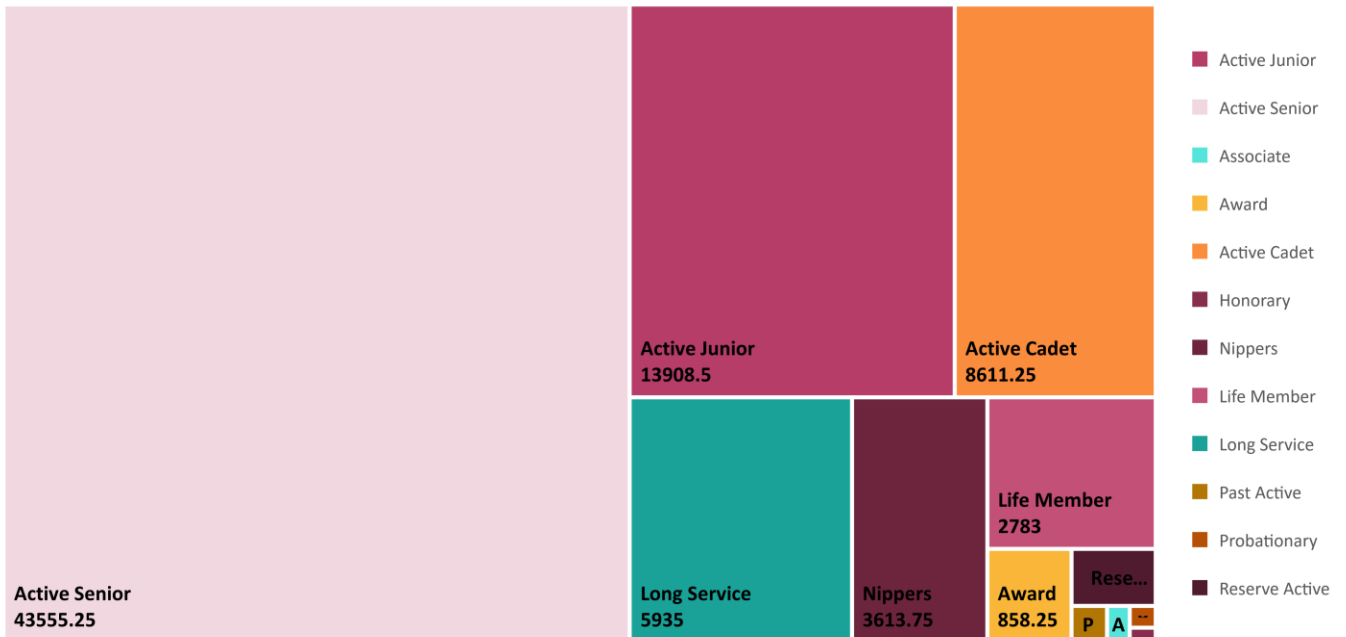

PATROL HOURS

This season 80124 Patrol Hours were collectively performed by our active members and clubs. This was a significant increase on season 2014/2015 of 23256 hours – it should be noted that this season clubs patrolled an extra weekend in line with the Labour Day Public Holiday.

Active Senior Members (1421 in total) patrolled the highest number of hours – 43555.25 and Honorary members patrolled the least amount at 42 hours.

TRAINING & EDUCATION

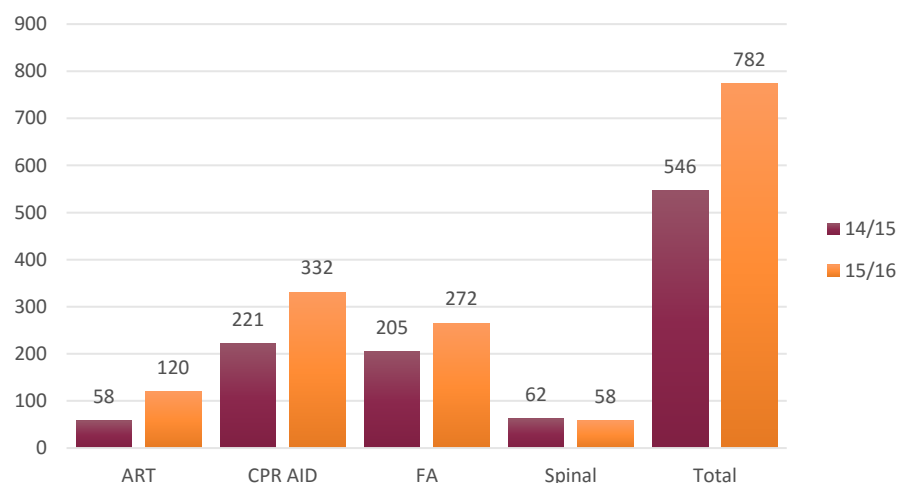
The Branch continues to provide opportunities for members to participate in specialist training within the Branch, ensuring that the Branch calendar includes Emergency Care, Basic Beach Management and Observers Courses for members to access and gain skills in.

Further, the Branch has worked extensively with the Clubs, Trainers and Assessors to ensure that the system within the Branch to administer and oversee the educational courses at club level is supportive of the clubs. To this end the Branch has a database that tracks all courses held at club level, the Branch also provides a paperwork packet prior to the course and a follow up email the day prior to assessment. As a result of this system the Branch error rate is very low. Noting that in 109 courses there were six (6) recorded errors (5.50%)

EMERGENCY CARE AWARDS

In season 2014/2015 SLSQ proposed a change to the delivery of Emergency Care awards – this involved emergency care courses being run by SLSQ. In season 2015/2016 Point Danger Branch together with SLSQ Training and Education Department maintained the normal calendar of available courses to members and held seven (7) ART courses and six (6) First Aid Courses.

ECT AWARDS - 2 YEAR COMPARISON



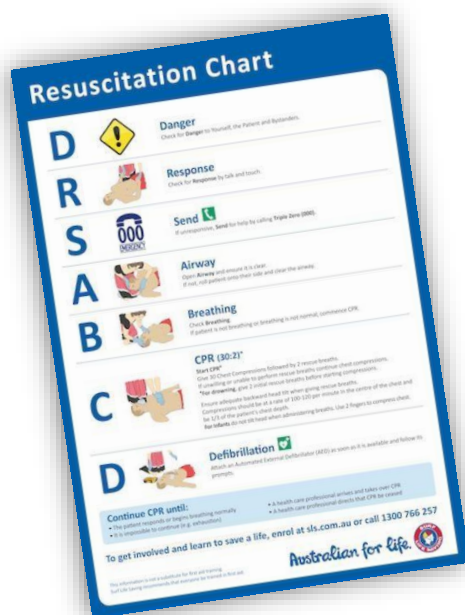
Clubs were also able to host their own courses through liaison with SLSQ. From season 2014/2015 to 2015/2016 an additional 236 Emergency Care awards were gained by members (43.22% increase).

The only award to showcase a decrease was Spinal Management. It should be noted that 4 courses in 2015/2016 were cancelled due to new recommendations from the Australia Resuscitation Council indicating that stiff neck collars should no longer be used.

ART, CPR and First Aid awards all experienced increases in the number of awards gained:

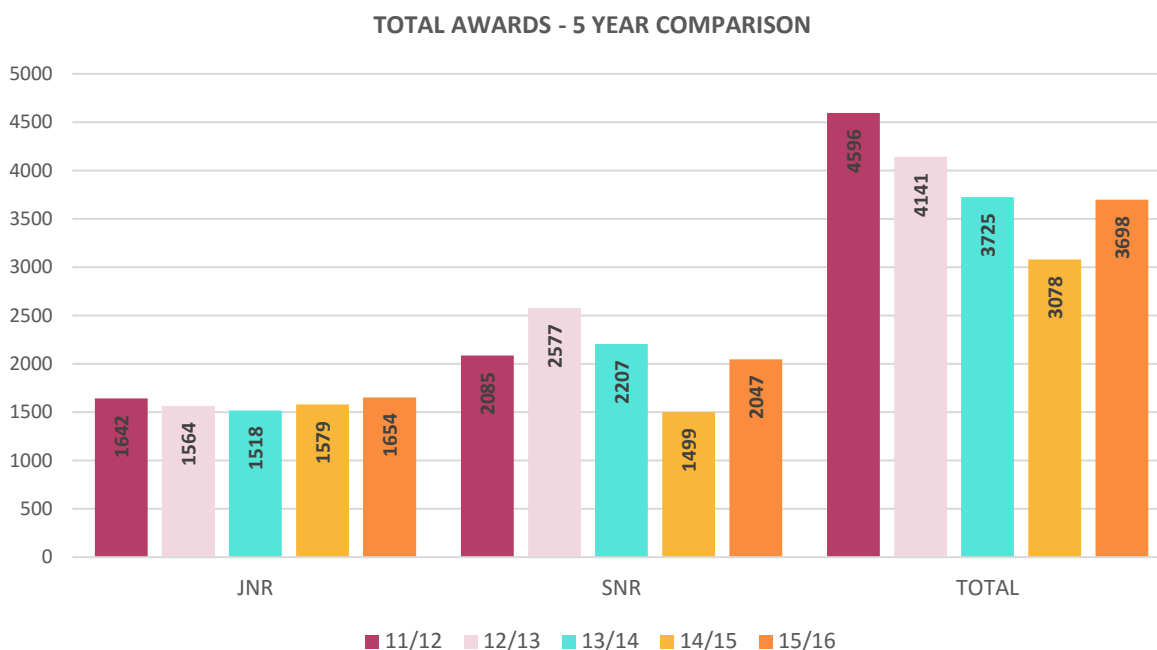
- ≡ ART – increase of 62 awards (106.89% increase)
- ≡ CPR – increase of 111 awards (50.22% increase)
- ≡ First Aid – increase of 67 awards (32.68% increase)

With the introduction of SLSQ running these awards – this has saved the clubs money for course costs (ECT courses are free). In the five (5) years prior to 2014/2015 and 2015/2016 season, the clubs collectively spent \$31525.30 on ECT courses – money that they have now saved and can redirect towards other operations.



LIFE SAVING AWARDS

This season has seen an increase of senior awards (inclusive of ECT awards) gained from season 2014/2015 from 1499 to 2047 (36.56% increase). Our commitment to Training and Education through the provision of an extensive calendar, administrative systems and support has assisted the clubs in meeting the required demand for new awards.



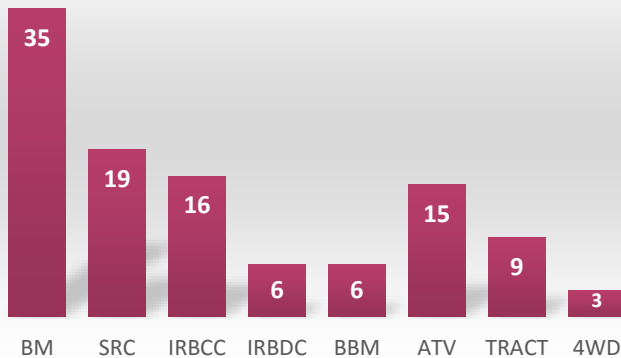
Within the twelve-month period the clubs have run a number of club based courses – predominately in Bronze, Surf Rescue, Radio, IRB Crewman and Driver awards. Eight (8) of the eleven (11) clubs have experienced an increase in awards gained – noting that the largest increase was reported at Coolangatta SLSC (200% increase from 116 to 348 awards). Three clubs posted decreases throughout the season with the largest decrease at North Kirra SLSC (35.91% decrease).

An analysis of the club based awards indicate the following :

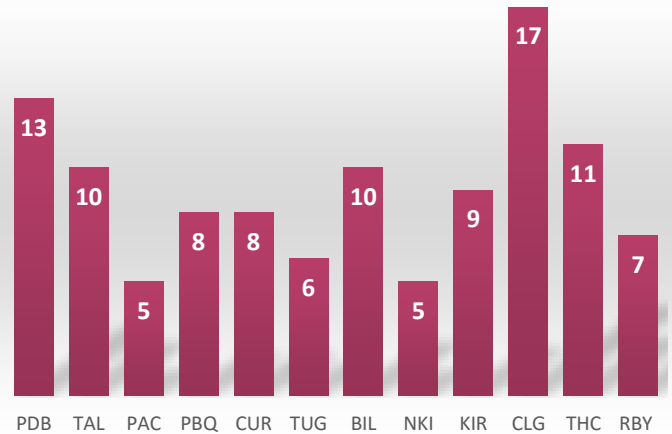

Throughout the season 109 courses were run across the Branch – both by the clubs and the Branch. Bronze Medallion was the most popular course with 35 courses being held from May 2015 – April 2016 and 4WD Induction the lowest number of courses – 3.

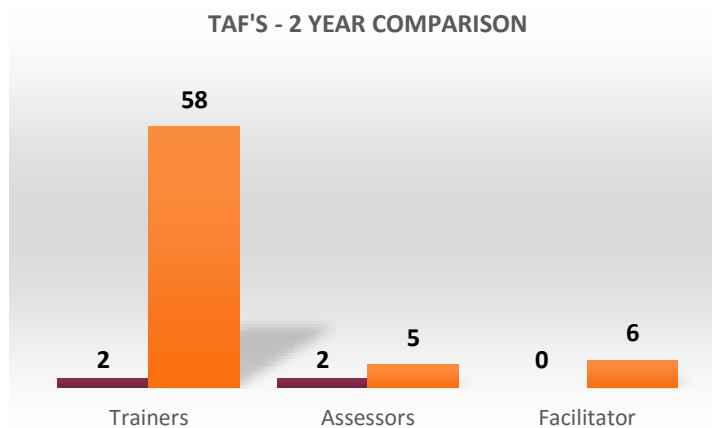

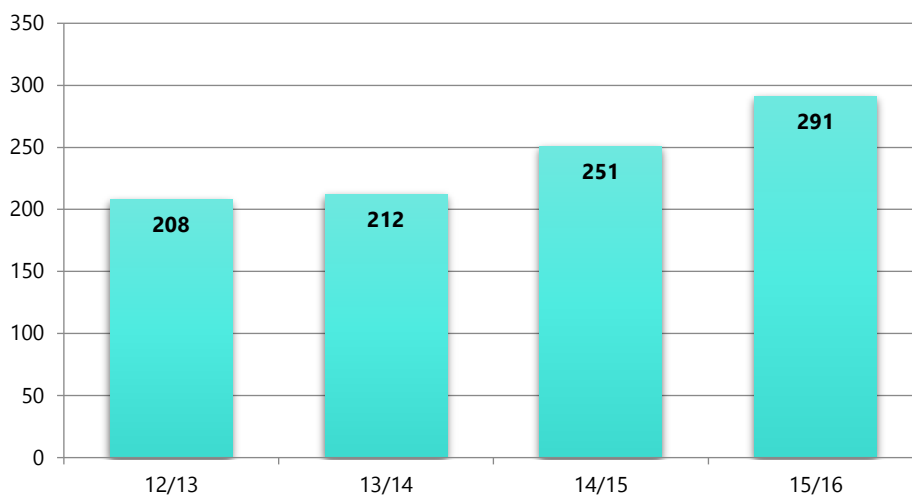
PDB SENIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

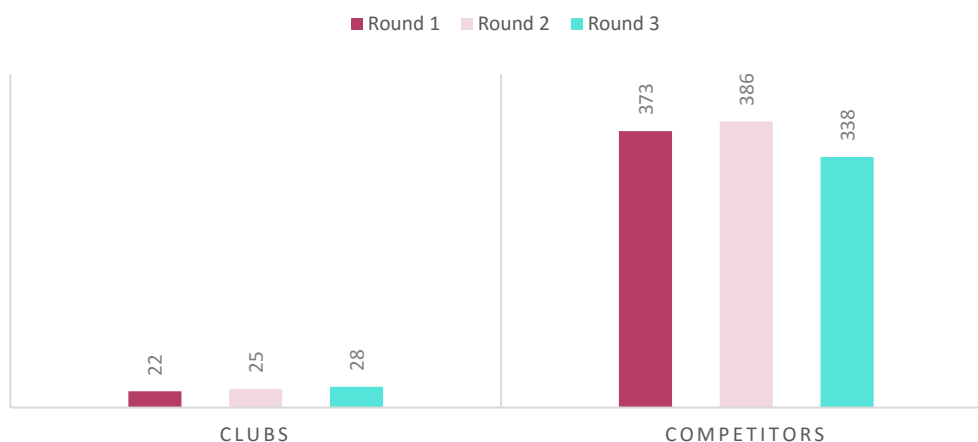

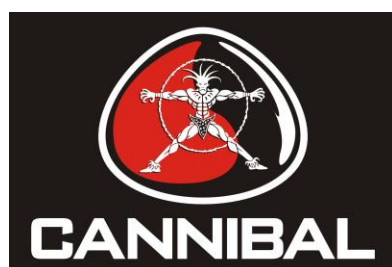

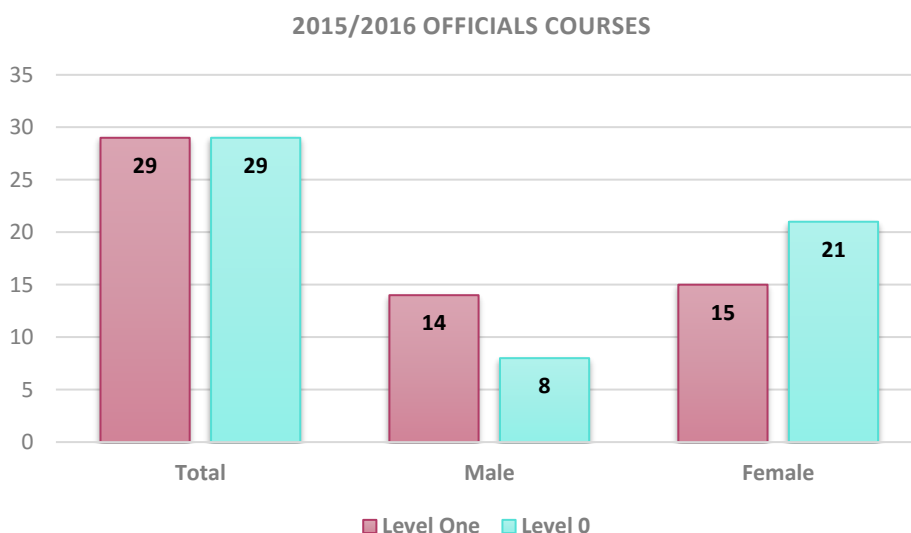

OFFICIALS

Surf Sports officials are the key to the effective running of all surf sports events. These volunteers help carnivals to run in an organised and efficient way. There are many different tasks that are required to be completed at a carnival, such as marshalling competitors, starting races, recording results, setting the courses and more. The Branch is dedicated to the development of new and existing Officials and in season 2015/2016 two (2) Level One courses and three (3) Level 0 courses were held.

In total 58 members attended the courses (29 Level One and 29 Level 0). To date 48.27% of Level 1 and 41.37% of Level 0 have completed the course.

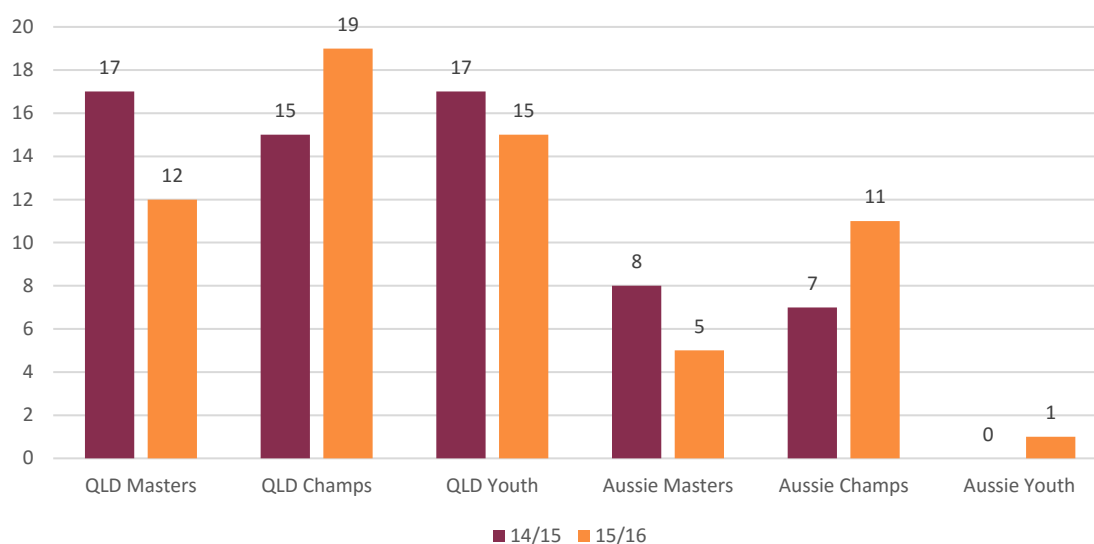
SURF SPORTS FUNDING

Children's confidence is developed by learning valuable skills including surf awareness, safety and surf knowledge, having fun with new friends and participating in surf sports.

This season the clubs Junior Activities programs have been led with enthusiasm and expertise with an army of support personnel including Age Managers, Coaches, Officials, Team Managers and general helpers.

To assist the clubs throughout the season the Branch hosts a Junior Information Night, Child Youth Risk Management (CYRM) Induction and Observers Courses to support the development of members and office bearers.

MEMBERSHIP

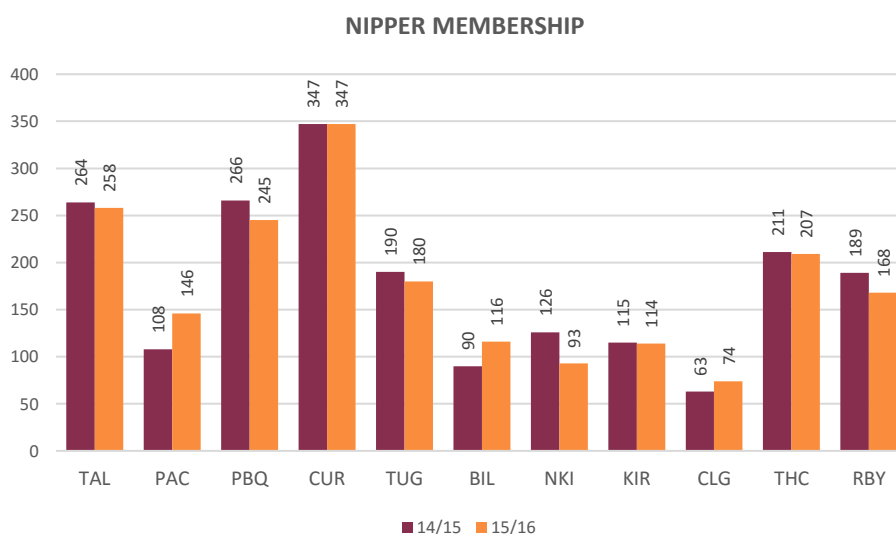
Season 2015/2016 has shown a slight decrease of Nipper Membership from 1969 (2014/2015) to 1948 (2015/2016) – a decrease of 21 members overall (1.066%). Three clubs experienced an increase over the season.

JUNIOR EDUCATION

Our main aim at Junior Activities is to teach and develop future life savers, to this end each nipper participates in an education program. The program is designed to ensure nippers have fun at the beach while participating in lessons that will provide them with a pathway as a fully rounded participant in lifesaving and surf sports.

In season 2015/2016 1649 nipper awards were gained (-54 on last season). The Under 14 nippers gain a Surf Rescue Certificate as part of their transition to the "senior" ranks – in season 2015/2016 93 Under 14 nippers gained this award.

AGE MANAGERS

Age Managers are an integral part of the management of Nipper activities each week and are largely responsible for the education of our littlest members. To this end Age Managers must complete the Age Managers Course (and also must hold either an SRC, Bronze Medallion or Observers Certificate).

The Branch continues to monitor the Age Managers at each club with the provision of monthly updates to the Board of Junior Activities on those who have completed the online theoretical course and reminders to the members on items that need to be completed to gain the accreditation.

In season 2015/2016 - 46 members gained the Age Awards Accreditation (an increase of 22 on season 2014/2015).

JUNIOR ACTIVITIES ACCREDITATION OFFICER (JAAO)

The JAAO role was introduced in season 2014/2015 as an additional support mechanism for Junior Activities – the JAAO are able to sign off junior preliminary assessments and age awards. This role is specific to junior activities and ensures that the load on existing Assessors is lessened.

This season eighteen (18) members gained this accreditation. In total 45 members across the Branch hold this award.

This season some minor changes will be made with clubs required to endorse their JAAO's each season so they retain their proficiency.



OBSERVERS

For Age Managers who don't hold the SRC or Bronze Medallion this award is mandatory. The Branch ran courses on behalf of the clubs to ensure that members were compliant to this requirement. As a result of this 57 members have gained the award. In season 2016/2017 this course will be on-line to make gaining the award easier for members. However, the Branch will host two courses to ensure that all members can access to courses.

JUNIOR SURF SPORTS

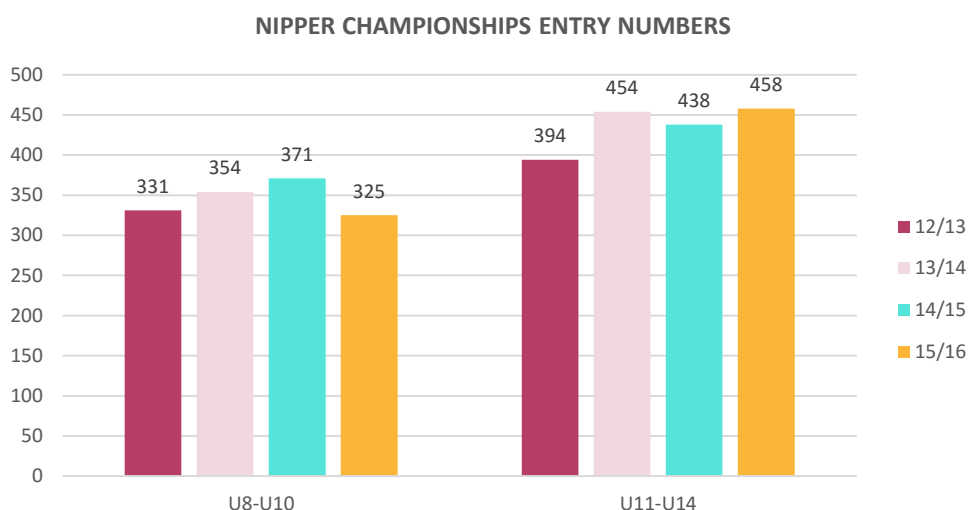
Another big summer of junior Surf Sports was achieved in season 2015/2016 with the Branch running four (4) events for the Nippers. On top of this the Branch also introduced the inaugural High Performance squad and also had the annual Representative team (both of which included Under 13 and Under 14 age groups).

Six (6) of the participants are former nippers (now in the Under 17 age group) who completed the course through the Team X-Treme program.

Those that graduate from the Level 0 course are encouraged to attend a Level 1 course futuristically.

Level 1 Officials courses have also been well patronised by the nipper clubs with 17 of the 29 members that attended the Level One courses this season being nipper parents.

YOUTH CHAMPIONSHIPS

Youth Championships for the U11-U15 age groups are now held at both a State and Australian Level. The Australian Youth Championships are in their infancy and give clubs and youth members an opportunity to compete against teams from around the Country.

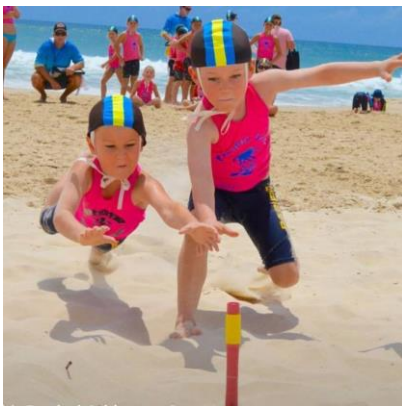
2015/2016 UNDER 14 LIFESAVER OF THE YEAR

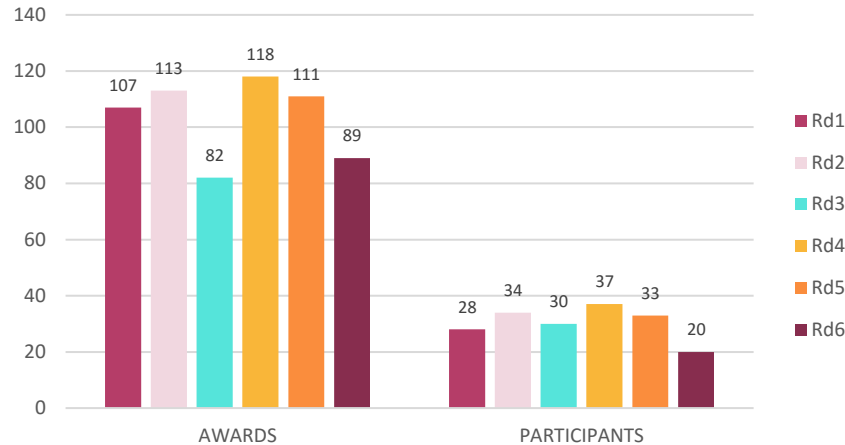

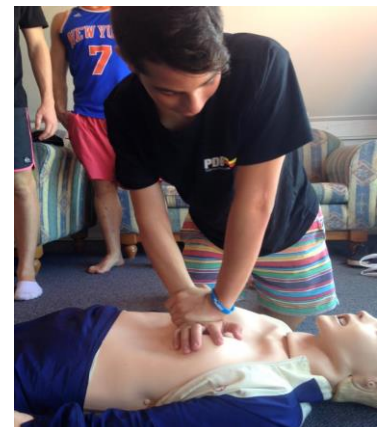
YOUTH WAYS and YOUTH PANEL

VALE – GRAHAM BENNETT

Graham “Bombo” Bennett joined Burleigh Heads SLSC as a Cadet in 1947, then later joined Maroochydore SLSC in 1949 and finally joined North Kirra SLSC in 1952. It was at North Kirra SLSC that Graham found his place in surf lifesaving and from this point his membership prospered.

His contribution to lifesaving at all levels is to be commended. At North Kirra SLSC Graham was Club President from 1957 – 1965 and during this period he introduced four wheel drives to surf lifesaving search and rescue operations from Tugun SLSC – Kirra SLSC.

Graham gained a number of Surf Life Saving awards throughout his life saving career including Bronze Medallion, Advanced Resuscitation, Radio Officer, Training Officers, Assessor Radio and Silver Medallion Radio Controller (one of only a few members to hold this award).



Graham was named a Life Member of North Kirra SLSC.

At Point Danger Branch – Graham served as a Club Delegate, member and Secretary of the Board of Examiners, District Supervisor and Carnival Organiser for the Branch Championships.

Graham was named a Life Member of SLSQ Point Danger Branch in 2009.

Surf Life Saving Queensland was very much in its infancy throughout Grahams career, however he dedicated most time to the State in the capacity of the QLD Board of Examiners, QLD Appeals Committee and Club Delegate.

Graham’s skills were very much in the radio and communication area of life saving and he was instrumental in the introduction of radios to surf sports events. The first time this was achieved was through military land line telephone at the Queensland Championships at North Kirra SLSC in 1966.

He also dedicated time to Surf Life Saving Australia as a Trauma Councilor, Organiser of Australian Titles in 1966 and has been recognised many times for not only his longevity in the association but his dedication, leadership and passion. Awards gained include International Life Saving Citation of Merit and 50 Year Service Badge.

Graham dedicated a lifetime to Surf Lifesaving, he lead by example, mentored, trained and assessed countless fellow members and made lifelong friendships. His son, Tim followed in his footsteps and was also Club President and became a Life Member – the only father and son to achieve this at North Kirra SLSC.

Graham will be remembered by all that met him as a man of unnerving morale aptitude, remarkable leadership skills, passion for his club, enthusiasm for mentoring others and a thirst to be the best and make those around him great too. He will be sadly missed as a lifesaver and friend.

CLUB REPORTS - TALLEBUDGERA SLSC

2016 marks the 70th year since Tallebudgera's formation in 1946. In this year, members have patrolled the beach for 6261 hours, completing 88 rescues for another successful season. The patrolling members of Tallebudgera SLSC are to be congratulated for their efforts.

During the season the Chief Training Officer and other trainers have worked tirelessly to educate existing and new members in lifesaving awards. Tallebudgera SLSC presently has some members showing an interest in completing Trainer's awards.



The following awards were gained at the club during the 2015/16 season:-

14 Surf Rescue Certificates; 27 Bronze Medallions, 10 Advanced Resuscitation Techniques; 14 IRB Crewman Certificate; 27 Radio Operators Awards; 39 Resuscitation Certificates; and 34 First Aid Certificates.

Tallebudgera took delivery of its new ATV at the beginning of the season, which was provided by the Queensland Gambling Community Benefit Fund. One of the biggest additions to the club this season has been the new children's surf lifesaving themed playground which is situated next to the club in Ronnie Long Park. This was completed and opened on the 25th September. Thanks to Councilor Daphne McDonald and GCCC. Since then, there has been an increase in the number of people visiting the park, the club has opened a coffee shop and has built a new timber outdoor deck area for club and public use.

The Tallebudgera club gym has had a small extension completed this year, with some funding assistance from Nerang RSL. Tallebudgera's gym, common room and training room were repainted recently, thanks to the SLSQ Dulux grant with "Colour Code Painting" completing the job. Lastly, renovations to the male showers will commence during the off season.

The Tallebudgera Supporters Club has been travelling well under the management of CEO Paul McGuire. Tallebudgera SLSC has established a good working relationship with the Supporter's Club. At present DA plans have been submitted to Council and are waiting approval for major extensions and renovations that will see more dining and balcony space for the Supporters' Club, and more desperately needed storage area and a first aid room for the Surf Lifesaving Club.

Nipper numbers for the season were 258. Thanks to the efforts of the Junior Activities Committee for another great nipper season. Nippers were again competitive throughout the season under the guidance of the Club Coach Rhett Collier during his second year at the club.

Tallebudgera SLSC would like to take this opportunity to thank Councillor Daphne McDonald (GCCC), Michael Hart MP (State Member for Burleigh) and Karen Andrews MP (Federal Member for McPherson) for supporting Tallebudgera Surf Life Saving Club throughout the year.

Thanks also to the Tallebudgera SLSC Committee and Kim Magee for their support and effort throughout the year. Lastly, I wish to thank Point Danger Branch for their support throughout the year, and especially Kerrie Barnes for her guidance in helping me in my role as president of Tallebudgera SLSC.

CLUB REPORTS - PACIFIC SLSC

It's no exaggeration to describe the performance of Pacific SLSC in all facets of surf lifesaving this season as outstanding. Through a strong and dedicated management team the club continues to set new bench marks and is a credit to all involved.

At the beginning of the season ambitious goals were set including the formalisation of a 5-year strategic plan that focused on connecting with members and community, sustainable growth, governance, recognition of members and club achievements, and formal KPI's in most major areas.



The members of a club are its most valuable resource, and Pacific is fortunate to have such a high calibre of membership, enthusiastic and dedicated to accomplishing club sustainability. We have seen an overall membership increase from 242 to 331 members; nippers grew from 108 to 147, as well as an increase in our active membership to 105 members. These active members completed over 6,000 hours of patrol and water safety, ensuring no lives lost on Pacific Beach.

Through great leadership from the Club Captain and Chief Training Officer, the club continues to establish a high level of award proficiency and beach patrol standards, the club's primary objective.

Pacific's financial position continues to improve. This has been achieved by increased donations, sponsorships, grants and sound fiscal management. As a direct result of the hard work of the Supporters Club the club was able to action one of the largest gear acquisitions and club improvement programs. Major items included new bathrooms, IRB/motor, Tractor, nipper & rescue boards, tubes and manikins.

Continued development of the nippers has provided a valuable impetus to numerous projects, not least of which was the support provided during the Surf Rescue Appeal which netted \$10000.00 and the PDB U8-U10 Teams Carnival held at Pacific. The increased number of young lifesavers coming from nippers has been crucial to the advancement of an integrated club. Pacific nippers achieved representation of 6 members in the Branch Representative team. Achievement at all carnivals including best ever results at the QLD Youth Championships highlighted yet another successful seasons for Junior Activities.

The youth development team continue to promote, retain, and grow this area of Pacific SLSC. This season saw the club send a record number of young members to the Regional & State camps, Team X-Treme and Gold Coast Youth Ball. The clubs' commitment of recognition seen Pacific SLSC win 3 of Point Danger Branch Youth Member of the Month award. Pacific SLSC was also named Runner Up Youth Development Club of the Year. This is the clubs second award in three years for YIPS.

The momentum that the surf sport program has gained, has seen Pacific have its most successful season in over 25 years and resulted in record participation at all levels, as well as medals at all major carnivals including Branch, State, and National level. One of the most pleasing aspects of the surf sport program is the club's resurgence into Champion Life Saver and Patrol Competition.

Pacific's challenge over the next few seasons will be ensuring that we have the resources to not only meet but exceed these demands that come. There is no doubt that Pacific has a very exciting future and the entire club membership has that willingness to succeed whilst still maintaining core family oriented club values that ensure we are a club that promotes something for everyone, delivering on the club mission of a proactive and effective surf lifesaving club leading the way in lifesaving service provision, education, sport, beach and water safety advocacy and community leadership.

In closing thank you to Kerrie and her team at Point Danger Branch for the continued support and all other affiliated clubs, and we look forward to the new season ahead.

CLUB REPORTS - PALM BEACH SLSC

Season 2015/2016 was an enjoyable and successful season for Palm Beach SLSC. The support of the Management Committee and Members was great and contributed to the overall success of the club.

The surf club continues to move forward in leaps and bounds with more people volunteering to take on positions and assist the club. The club has focused on three key elements this season

- One Club
- One Team
- One family

The Red and Yellow of Palm Beach still continues to pride itself on a fatality free season. Patrols have progressed well with no major issues or incidents. An increase in Active Membership has ensured that the patrols have a good mix of “old” heads and new members to ensure the bathing public are safe.

In the competitive ranks of Palm Beach SLSC, participation in the surf sports continues to grow with more members attending training and competing on behalf of the Club. Through dedication, training and a never say die attitude all members from the youngest nipper to the oldest master represents the club in true Palm Beach spirit.

Awards have progressed well this season with new club training officers and increased courses being held. A focus has been on IRB Crewpersons and Drivers.

Youth Development is making a resurgence in Palm Beach SLSC – to this end four (40) members participated in the PDB Team X-Treme program, five (5) members in Gold Coast Youth Camp and two members in the SLSQ Youth Excellence Program.

It has been a pleasure to see the members of Palm Beach SLSC coming together and putting in the effort no matter how big or small to make the surf club what it is. Palm Beach SLSC only continues to grow stronger through the teamwork, camaraderie and dedication of members.



CLUB REPORTS - CURRUMBIN SLSC

This was a year of accelerating momentum for Currumbin SLSC, one in which we saw continued growth and demonstrated the value being created by focus on improving membership services, while investing in volunteers through lifesaving courses, youth development activities, social initiatives and surf sports programs and pathways.

Members are and still remain our highest priority. Throughout the year, and right across the organisation, as a committee and staffing group the club worked hard to find ways to build advocacy, commitment and motivation, by improving how we deliver benefits to the community and our members in order to have a positive impact on their lives.



From a lifesaving perspective the club has never had a better season. Almost full marks across patrol inspections and an increase in awards held by each patrol, strengthening the depth of human resources and enhancing the ability to achieve the clubs core mission of providing essential lifesaving services to visitors of Currumbin Beach. We thank the Point Danger Branch for their Team X-Treme program which is a terrific initiative and allows clubs to harness the skillsets and lifesaving development of youth members who will be the future of patrol teams on the beach in the future.

In the area of surf sports we delivered on the promise to provide the facilities, resources, coaching and pathways for surf sports competitors across the areas of beach, water, boat, pool rescue and more recently the IRB section to allow members to achieve surf sport goals at Currumbin SLSC. Congratulations to the competitors, coaching group and sport management team who collectively in 2015/2016 were named SLSA Pool Rescue Champions, second overall at the 2016 Australian Surf Life Saving Championships and were named the 2016 Australian Championships Handicap Pointscore Winners for the most improved Club in the country in 2015/2016. The Club also had a record four (4) members competing in the Nutri Grain Ironman series and seven (7) crews participate the Ocean Thunder Surfboat series. Eleven (11) members were named in the Queensland State team and Currumbin SLSC members won forty (40) national titles across surf and pool events this season.

Financially, the Supporters Club delivered a record year. Revenues generated from grants and fundraising activities continued to grow and sponsorship levels reached record heights in conjunction with some fantastic partnerships formed with community organisations whose support both new and existing of the Club the club simply couldn't do without. The Club funded a full renovation of the downstairs member's room in the off season and has paid out the loan on the Traders Way facility to ensure that there is a fully owned asset for the members.

I believe Currumbin SLSC is enjoying a period of real success. But rather than measure that success in terms of record net profit from the Supporters Association; or zero deaths on the beach; or a terrific point score result at the Australian Titles – I would prefer to measure this season's success by the health of our tribe. We remain one. We have each other's back. We are more willing to say "*How can I help?*" than "*What do I get?*" And above all, we all take turns to carry this great Club forward, inch by inch and step by step, to make it better.

CLUB REPORTS - TUGUN SLSC

Season 2015/2016 has been a positive season for Tugun SLSC. The season has shown some extremely encouraging signs of great things to come.

Tugun SLSC has shown some good results in the surf sports arena but is somewhat lacking compared to seasons gone by. However, this area is showing signs of improvement as the club has a newly formed committee of past club competitors and officials to address this issue.

Surf Lifesaving has improved again on the previous season with an excellent progress within the training and education area – overall 139 new senior awards were gained – an increase of 42 on season 2014/2015.

The number of members patrolling Tugun beach has shown a healthy increase from 124 members for the 2014/15 season to 154 members for the 2015/16 season.

Our Nippers are growing in numbers and with the added bonus of more nipper parents being involved and gaining awards in Surf Lifesaving. This sort of activity is very encouraging indeed and for the future of this club.

Fundraising this year has had a boost firstly with the holding of a '200 Club', this event raised over \$10,000. We also held a Sportsman's Luncheon which raised over \$19,000. We held raffles throughout the year and when mixed with a few collections this brought in over \$18,000.

The gaining of Grants was good this season, such as :

- ≡ OLGR grant of \$8,000 toward the purchase of a new ATV,
- ≡ Gambling Community Benefits Fund \$26,000 for new nipper boards.
- ≡ Get Going Club \$7,500 for a new nipper trailer.

Negotiations are almost finalised with the Bendigo Bank for a new Tractor.

Surf sports is showing signs of improving with actions being put in place as previously mentioned.

On behalf of Tugun SLSC, I would like to thank Kerrie Barnes from Point Danger Branch for her time and efforts during the season and Surf Lifesaving Queensland for their support also.



CLUB REPORTS - BILINGA SLSC

The season of 2015/2016 has come to a close and Bilinga SLSC can now bear the fruits of the club's hard work with a completely refurbished new deck. The new extension and upgraded facility will increase the club's capability to provide a venue for the corporate sector and function space hire. It will be a catalyst to increase earning capacity. The club has received exceptional reviews on the upgraded facility.

The club would not have achieved the deck upgrade without the support of George Hill (Operations Manager SLSQ), former Councilor Chris Robbins (GCCC) and Jann Stuckey MP (QLD Government). The support and commitment shown to Bilinga SLSC is very much appreciated.

During the season Bilinga SLSC once again performed a commendable service to the community on and off the beach with limited patrolling members. It is measurable that we had no lives lost between the flags and it is due to dedicated vigilance and service of Bilinga Surf Lifesavers.

The club this season facilitated an IRB driver/crewperson and Bronze/SRC courses. As a club, we have full the intention to increase our patrolling numbers and provide the appropriate courses to engage new and existing members and expand our patrol obligation capacity. Next season the club will have a committed Chief Training Officer which has not occurred in the past seasons.

Congratulations to the Junior Activities Committee for the commitment in the development of Junior Lifesavers. The leadership and hard work of the Committee and Age Managers has provided an environment of opportunity to allow the Nippers to excel at all levels within the Branch and State. To this end the club has experienced a membership growth in the nipper area of 28.8% since 2014/2015.

The club this season has again been supported by the Point Danger Branch Patrol Group and Brisbane Lifesaving team. With the assistance provided to Bilinga SLSC it afforded our members some respite due to our small patrol numbers. The club is ever grateful to the two groups for their ongoing support.

Once again the club extends its gratitude to neighbouring clubs - North Kirra and Tugun for the support provided to us in season 2015/2016, we appreciate your assistance in another challenging season.



CLUB REPORTS - NORTH KIRRA SLSC

The 2015/2016 Season has been a year of refocus and consolidation for the Surf Club.

Commencing the season, the club underwent a major renovation at a cost of \$535,000. This is an extraordinary achievement, which was funded entirely from cash. This renovation removed significant amounts of material containing asbestos and replaced substantially all of the roof. We took this opportunity to renovate substantially all of the Supporters Club and replaced many of the walls and ceilings in the Surf Club.



The Junior Activities Committee was at near full strength this season with all age groups having an Age Manager and most having an Assistant Age Manager. Whilst numbers were lower than the previous season, we expect good improvement in the forthcoming season given several key initiatives underway. North Kirra ensures all children, regardless of their skill level have the opportunity to be active participants in the junior program.

Assisting the nipper ranks, the club had a renewed focus on coaching. This season, the club utilised the specialist skills of a beach and water coach. Separately, the R&R Team delivered some outstanding results. Particularly, the team produced numerous gold, silver and bronze medals at Aussies, States and Branch Titles. A number of North Kirra members again joined the Kirra IRB racing team who achieved Aussie Gold last season. This is an exceptional effort.

The Club Captain again capably led patrols and ensured that patrol obligations were met at all times. The role of Club Captain is the most challenging role within the Club and this season was especially demanding given the reduced number of patrolling members. To ensure that patrolling numbers are improved in the forthcoming season, a full education and training roster has already been prepared, complemented by the numerous courses run by PDB.

Following the renovations, the Surf and Supporters' Clubs both remain in a very stable financial position. As noted, the renovations were funded entirely from free cash flow with no loans required. The Supporters Club has a new management team in place which has resulted in significantly improved trading results. The Club continues to run the bar, bistro and gaming operations.

The season ahead is no doubt going to be another busy time. The Committee is very focused on improving the membership in the Junior, Youth and Senior ranks. We are confident that success will be achieved with several key initiatives in place focusing on the fundamentals of surf lifesaving. We are also excited that North Kirra is due to hold both the Senior State Titles and Aussie Titles in early 2017.

On behalf of the Management Committee, we recognise the significant time and effort that is invested by all members to ensure the viable operation of the Club. We perform a vital service on the beach for the benefit of the local community as well as educating junior members on the importance of surf safety. It is only with the continued investment of volunteers that we can continue these invaluable services.

CLUB REPORTS - KIRRA SLSC

The 2015/2016 season has been another successful season for Kirra SLSC. Not only have we reached a major milestone with turning 100 this season, we have continued our growth in all areas of the club and our patrol strength continues to excel.

The Nipper section of the club is continuing to work hard in all areas and their hard work is paying off in spades. The increase in competition has been pleasing to see and this season we have had quite a number of Nippers become patrolling members.

Again this season Kirra SLSC have excelled in the most important area of Lifesaving - Patrols. The club has a dedicated group of patrolling members that provide a first class service to the public and much of this is down to the enormous efforts put in by our Club Captain & Vice Captain ensuring that not only are patrol obligations met but also that our members needs and availability are taken into consideration when putting together a patrol roster. In the 100th year it was outstanding that the members of the club came together to ensure that not only would we have a function fitting of a 100-year celebration but also that it would be at absolutely no cost to the club.

The 2015/2016 season like every season has thrown up plenty of challenges and the club has taken them all within its stride and risen to the occasion every time. This could not be achieved without the support of PDB and the great support staff. Ken and Kerrie have again gone above and beyond to help us and guide us through all areas of managing our club and for that we are extremely grateful. Without the level of support that PDB offers to all of its clubs I have no doubt we would all struggle.

In closing I'd like to thank the Management Committee and all of the members of Kirra SLSC for coming together for another successful season. We look forward to another great season ahead.



CLUB REPORTS - COOLANGATTA SLSC

Coolangatta SLSC can proudly boast that there were again no lives lost on our beach throughout the 2015/16 patrolling season. Our dedicated Lifesavers put in a massive 5372 hours patrolling our beach, completed 18 rescues, 584 preventative actions and 22 first aid treatments to keep our beach safe. Considering we had 33,639 visitors on our beach these figures are very impressive.



A major highlight for Coolangatta SLSC was our Bronzies Day combined with the Annual Fallen Lifesavers Memorial Day. Police Commissioner Ian Stewart proudly presented each of the 26 new Bronze Medallion holders with their very own patrol cap that had been embroidered with their initials and award number. At the conclusion of the formal cap presentations, we remembered our own, the Fallen Lifesavers and family members who had passed away this season.

Another highlight for the club was the delivery of our new bus; a generous donation by Club Patrons – Noel and Sue Holmes made the purchase of the bus possible. The bus was delivered to Coolangatta SLSC on our Nippers Christmas party day all wrapped up in Christmas paper and driven in by Santa himself. Our very excited Nippers ripped off the paper to find our brand new bus.

Let us not forget the support Coolangatta SLSC receives from the Supporters Club - the patrolling members really love the patrol meals that are delivered down to every patrol. Since last year's renovations the Supporters Club has been going from strength to strength by winning many awards. In March 2016 the Supporters Club was awarded "Best Dining in Queensland" at the Clubs Queensland Awards for Excellence.

Another fantastic initiative that is run by Coolangatta SLSC is the Bluebottles program. This very popular program is designed to help children and adults with special needs enjoy the beach and surf under the safety and guidance of our Lifesavers.

Coolangatta SLSC is currently running a new membership drive that will hopefully boost our total members in all areas of our club. We have lowered our membership fees substantially for season 2016/2017. A lot of hard work needs to be done to take advantage of these lower fees and build our membership numbers. The club needs to protect its future and attract more members. It is of ultimate importance that we increase membership within the Nipper ranks, that will eventually flow on to all other areas of the club. By bringing new members to our club we will be able to boost our Nipper squads and Senior competitor numbers, this will also enable all age levels to have enough members to compete in team events.

Every committee member has put in many hours of volunteered time working hard to ensure that Coolangatta SLSC is given the best possible management to maintain and grow our club. Thank you to the Office Administrator for all her help and assistance, Thank you also to our Point Danger Branch officers and staff, to Kerrie Barnes and Ken Hunter for all your assistance throughout the year.

CLUB REPORTS - TH&C SLSC

All in all, it's been another successful season for TH&C with the most important statistic being, again, no fatalities on Greenmount Beach.

By and large, the club has had great patrol attendance from patrolling members. However, the club is undoubtedly facing ongoing challenges in resourcing our patrols.

As reported last year, the club is in the midst of renovations and at a General Meeting the members resolved to proceed with Stage Two of the renovation works. The committee is currently finalising finance arrangements for these works with construction expected to commence in the off season.

The club is particularly grateful to the office of Karen Andrews MP (Federal Member for McPherson) for assistance in obtaining funding through the Stronger Communities Program. The club was successful for two separate grants under this program which has enabled the club to fund some minor renovation work. TH&C SLSC also received funding under the Fire and Emergency Services Lifesaving Development Fund.

On the competitive front the club has had some outstanding results. It was great to see Mariah Jones and Nick Myler selected in the QLD State Pool Rescue team and Leah Jones being called into the WA team. Mariah went on to break three Australian records at the Australian Pool Rescue Championships and was selected in the Australian team travelling to Holland and Germany later in the year. Mariah won gold in the Open Female Belt Race and Open Female Surf Race at the State Championships. Adding to the above, the Boardriders finished third overall at the State Championships.

TH&C SLSC nippers have also had a great year competitively. They finished 11th overall at the Gold Coast City Titles and 3rd at the PDB Youth Championships. Congratulations go to Sol Sheining-Cruz and Drew Younger for both taking gold medals in the State Youth Championships in the U13 Male Beach Sprint and the U15 Female 2km Beach Run respectively.

Member numbers for the year have been more or less stable. The club finished the season with a total membership of 591 this year compared to 582 last years. Nipper numbers are at 209 this year, only slightly down from 211 last season. Importantly though, the club has had an increase in Active Cadets and Active Seniors.

Overall, Tweed Heads and Coolangatta SLSC is in a great position and the club are looking forward to bigger and better things next season.



CLUB REPORTS - RAINBOW BAY SLSC

Another successful year has been had at Rainbow Bay SLSC, An increase in both new members and junior members making the step in to the patrolling ranks has lessened the burden on the hard working members. It's not easy with up to 300 board riders at any one time between Greenmount and Snapper Rocks.

Nipper numbers have remained constant once again and the Junior Activities Committee under the guidance of the JAC have ensured that the quality of teaching provided to these future lifesavers is of a high standard without losing the fun side of things as well.

Surf Sports have taken a step forward this year with the introduction of a coach. Whilst off to a shakey start things soon fell into place and it was fantastic to see the large numbers of athletes turning up each day to training. A very worthwhile investment in the future of Rainbow Bay SLSC

Very few changes in the Management Committee has ensured that the direction the club is heading has not waived and all things going to plan 2016/17 season will be a successful season both in competition and patrols. This together with having a fantastic Administrator who keeps us all on our toes is a great start.

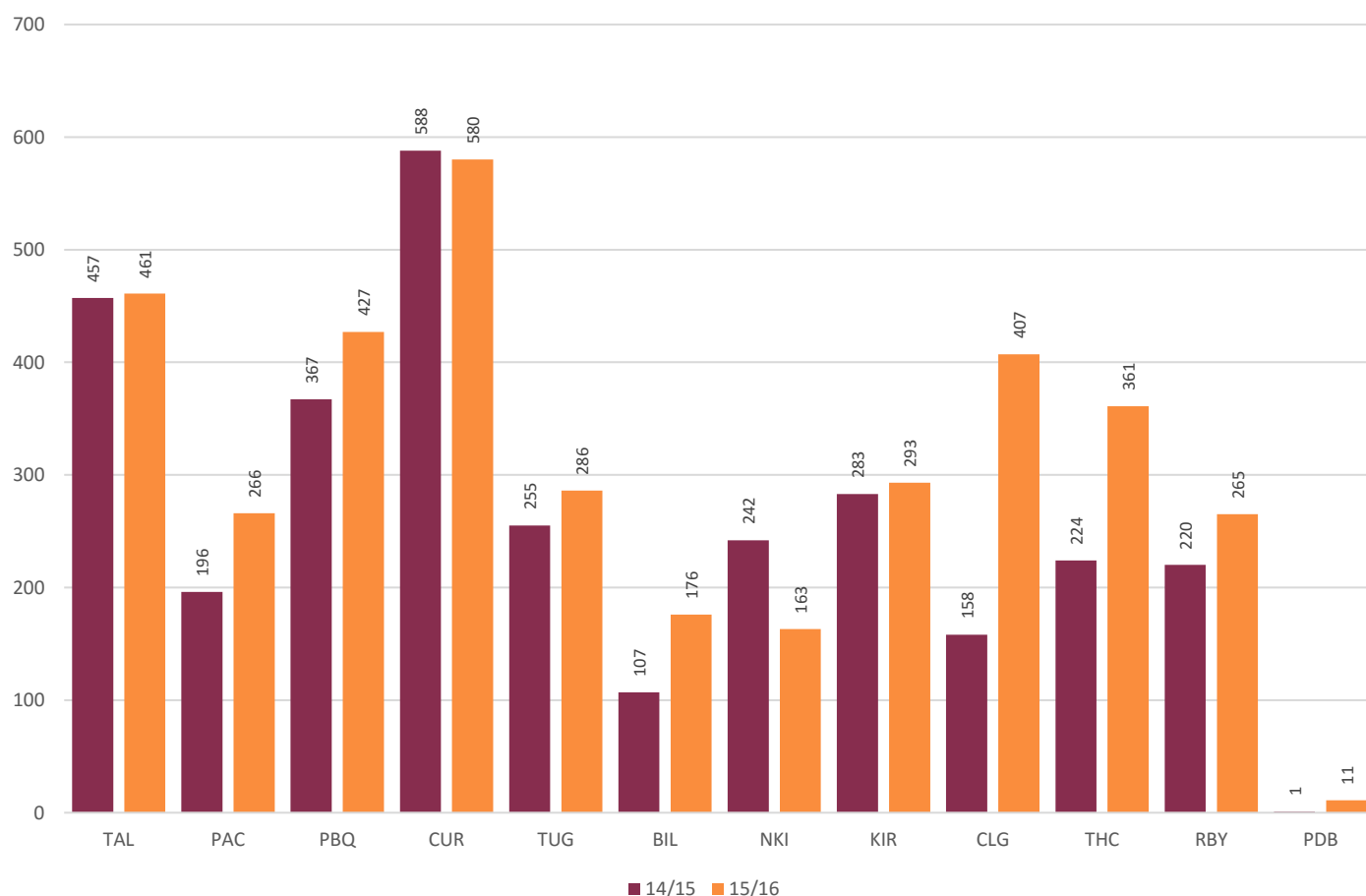




Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The Management Committee prepared the financial statements of the branch on the basis that the branch is a non-reporting entity because there are no users dependant on general purpose financial statements. The financial statements are therefore special purpose financial statements that have been prepared in order to meet the requirements of the constitution, the information needs of the stakeholders and for the basis of preparation of the income tax return.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the significant accounting policies disclosed below, which the Management Committee determined are appropriate to meet the purposes of preparation. Such accounting policies are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs unless otherwise stated in the notes. The accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of the statements are as follows:

(a) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Property, Plant and Equipment are carried at cost or at independent or Management Committee valuation. All assets, excluding freehold land and buildings are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the trust. Increases in the carrying amount arising on revaluation of land and buildings are credited to a revaluation reserve in shareholders' equity. Decreases that offset previous increases of the same asset are charged against fair value reserves directly in equity; all other decreases are charged to the income statement. Each year the difference between depreciation based on the revalued carrying amount of the assets charged to the income statement and depreciation based on the asset's original cost is transferred from the revaluation reserve to retained earnings.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by Management Committee to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the asset's employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted in determining recoverable amounts.

(b) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities on the balance sheet.

(c) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which, for floating rate financial assets, is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Revenue recognised related to the provision of services is determined with reference to the stage of completion of the transaction at the reporting date and where outcome of the contract can be estimated reliably. Stage of completion is determined with reference to the services performed to date as a percentage of total anticipated services to be performed. Where the outcome cannot be estimated reliably, revenue is recognised only to the extent that related expenditure is recoverable.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(d) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Tax Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the balance sheet are shown inclusive of GST.

(e) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the liability for employee entitlements arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related costs.

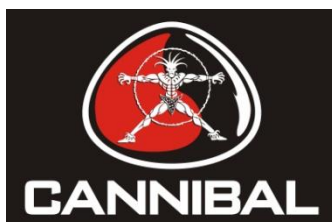
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
