

EXECUTIVE OVERVIEW

PRESIDENTS MESSAGE

It is with pleasure that I present to you the 93rd Annual Report for SLSQ Point Danger Branch. Season 2016/2017 has capitalised on the hard work and careful planning of previous years and for the third consecutive season the members have improved on past performances. Beach patrols performed 205 rescues throughout the season and provided a safe environment for the more than 500,000 beach goers who attended our beaches. Our volunteers do a remarkable job and I thank each and every one of you for the time, energy and passion you bring to our Clubs.

Membership has grown throughout the year and this season has provided the highest overall membership number that we have enjoyed in the last 5 years and I am confident that we can continue this trend into the future. As you read through this report please take the time to reflect on the hard work and planning provided by our Clubs and members in delivering such impressive results. I also take this opportunity to thank all Branch office bearers for their diligence, enthusiasm and assistance over the past 12 months, this has been my fourth year as President and I consider myself very fortunate to have been so ably supported by such a great group of Lifesavers.

Thanks, must also go to Kerrie Barnes and our other staff members, Carole, Rachael and Courtney for their tireless work in maintaining the schedules and services that provide the backbone of the Branch operations. Were it not for Kerrie and her dedication to our Clubs and members I believe that Point Danger would be hard pressed to achieve such excellent results. Thank you to our Patrons, Sponsors and Supporters for your wonderful efforts in helping Point Danger Branch provide service and support to our Clubs who in turn provide such an invaluable service to our community.

SIGNIFICANT ACHIEVEMENTS

Building Renovations

Over the last decade the Branch has spent considerable time, monies and resources on renovating the building inclusive of new flooring, bathrooms, kitchen and external painting. This season the focus was on the gear and equipment shed - funding was sourced through the SLSQ/QFES Sustainability Funding program to purchase and install custom made shelving and storage solutions.

With this stage of the renovations completed – the final major item to be addressed was the replacement of the office roof. Grant funding of \$24000.00 has been approved for this project and the roof has been replaced in the off season.

Life Members Newsletter/Photos

Our Life Members are the guardians of the Branch and this season a new initiative was created – a Life Members Newsletter. This is sent out quarterly and provides a snap shot of the Branch and its activities. It is important to the Branch to engage our Life Members and ensure that they are kept appraised of the Branch and its clubs. Their knowledge and advice is essential to the wellbeing of the Branch.

We have also spent considerable time researching and gathering photos to ensure that we can honour our Life Members by placing

frames to be displayed in the office. Another project of the Branch has been to find all annual reports from our 93 year history and we are proud to report that we now have them – as such we have been able to confirm the year that each Life Member gained his distinction.



Statistical Analysis

This season the Branch completed more work on regular and systematic statistical analysis of its activities inclusive of awards (broken down monthly, quarterly and annually), membership, course completion and surf sports participation. Our clubs are provided with monthly reports outlining their award and membership statistics which allows them to track their season and identify gaps. In season 2017/2018 we will be working on a master statistical spreadsheet that will showcase all required items in one document for reference and historical data.

Further, the Branch has created a recording sheet for Rescue and Patrol Statistics in line with the new program - LIMSOC. This tracks the rescues, first aid, marine stings, beach visitations and preventative actions of the clubs and volunteers for each patrolling month. Comparable records will be kept going forward in line with the new system.

Operational Assistance Kit (Online)

The online Operational Assistance Kit (OAK) is a new initiative from SLSQ Point Danger Branch to provide assistance to clubs and members. The OAK is an online tool to access often used and asked for items for day to day operational needs of the clubs and members. With the increased number of platforms used by SLSQ and SLSA – the need to access information in a timely manner was required.

We sought club feedback from Administrators & Clubs to determine which items they were using regularly and as such we have downloaded the most asked for and used items for easier access. Areas of Assistance are

CYRM/Junior Review

As reported in the 2015/2016 Annual Report, SLSQ Point Danger Branch developed a Child Youth Risk Management online induction tool. This was met with great success and allowed more people to be inducted then in previous seasons. Its success within the Branch caused SLSQ to request its use across the state. In total 2635 members across the State participated in this induction (1191 from Point Danger Branch). Changes have been made in the off season (at the cost of PDB) and we will continue to oversee this and provide monthly reports to SLSQ.

Point Danger Branch has also created a Junior Committee Review that showcases the clubs Junior Committee and Age Managers and awards/inductions they do/do not have and outlines necessary action items for the clubs to address. This initiative has again been replicated by SLSQ and developed for other clubs across the state to use

MANAGEMENT OF FISCAL POLICY

The management of the Branch budget continues to be a challenge – with limited income sources and everincreasing costs and programs. This season we have seen a deficit of \$23873.00 which can be attributed to a decrease in income through Oceans 38 and other sources and an increase in purchases of new equipment and building renovations. Further the Branch has expended a substantial amount of money on the CYRM Induction that is now used by the all Clubs/Branches in the state.

Through the continued support of the City of Gold Coast – the Branch has been able to maintain operations and support the clubs in the purchase and maintenance of life saving equipment. Further, the Branch was successful in gaining funding through many grants that have contributed to the development of programs, renovation of the building and purchase of necessary equipment. Annually the Branch receives funding from QFES and SLSQ as a part of regional support. This funding contributes greatly to the operations of the Branch allowing base expenses to be covered. The Branch continues to seek external funding sources through grant applications, sponsorship, donations and targeted fundraising activities. This season the Branch has been successful in these endeavours to assist in supplementing our activities and will continue these strategies in future seasons.

CORPORATE AND OPERATIONAL GOVERNANCE

In season 2015/2016 the Branch embarked on some governance specific programs to ensure compliance to required deliverables at club and Branch levels. Work is continuing on these items to ensure that supportive initiatives are provided to the clubs to assist in their day to day operations. To this end we have some future challenges in the coming season.

Point Danger Branch has a clear mandate "... to support the affiliated clubs and members of Point Danger". As such we keep our strategy simple – the creation of a calendar and systems that are centric to the clubs and their operations. Our goal is always to ensure that our members and clubs are able to wade through external driven bureaucracy with our help and guidance to ensure they reach their necessary goals and deliverables with ease.




In season 2017/2018 – the focus of Point Danger Branch will be "Engagement-Communication-Feedback-Acknowledgement". Ensuring that we are engaged with our clubs and members, recognizing items or issues that need to be addressed and implementing the best systems to do so. The key to this will be effective communication at all levels teamed with innovation and necessary feedback and we will be encouraging our clubs to adopt a similar strategy.

MEMBERSHIP

OVERALL MEMBERSHIP

For the third consecutive season, Point Danger Branch has posted an increase in overall membership. The season finished with 5747 members – a 3.96% increase on season 2015/2016 (5528 members).

An analysis of the last five (5) seasons indicates that season 2016/2017 has the highest overall membership in this period.



CLUB MEMBERSHIP


Eight clubs have experienced an increase in membership, with three experiencing a decrease.

Coolangatta SLSC has experienced the largest membership increase (+32.93%). Four Clubs have shown concurrent gains over the last three seasons – Pacific SLSC, Kirra SLSC, Coolangatta SLSC and TH&C SLSC

The largest decrease was noted at Rainbow Bay SLSC (-15.52%).

Tallebudgera, Palm Beach and Tugun have shown gains since 2015/2016 and are at their highest membership in three years.


CLUB MEMBERSHIP 2 YEAR COMPARISON



Point Danger Branch continues to maintain its own membership (currently at 22) who assist the Branch as office bearers, patrol members and officials.

ACTIVE MEMBERSHIP

Active Membership in Point Danger Branch has increased again this season (for the third consecutive season). The Branch Executive Committee monitors these numbers throughout the season to identify any gaps at club level. Further we send regular reminders to the clubs to ensure they update membership categories after members have gained awards. The Branch also provides monthly reports to the clubs. The Branch bases its statistical analysis on the main Active categories – Cadet, Junior and Senior. Season 16/17 saw a 7.52% increase in Active Membership across the Branch – with a decrease of 15.38% in Active Cadets and an increase of 30.05% in Active Juniors and 5.31% in Active Seniors.



Our active membership is not only confined to the above categories – there are a number of supporting categories that also patrol (see below). It should also be noted that Life Members still participate in patrols – 24.74% of the Life Members of the Clubs have actively patrolled this season.



MEMBERSHIP BY GENDER

This season has seen an increase in both genders – Male (+2.34% and Female (+5.94%) compared to season 2015/2016.

There is a slight shift in the ratio of Male to Females compared to last season. Male members make up 57.07% of the total membership with female making up 42.93%.

Females showcase a higher number is three categories – Award, Associate and Cadet.



OPERATIONS

Operational lifesaving continues to be our biggest challenge – ensuring that the beach and patrols are staffed, not only with adequate numbers but with the necessary skill set. The Clubs and members continue to work diligently to ensure that as volunteers we prevent, respond to and report on rescues. To achieve this, the Branch regularly conducts member development initiatives to give all members the opportunity to increase their skill level to ensure that high quality, innovative, progressive and responsive lifesaving services are provided.

PATROL SERVICE CONTRACTS AND PATROL OPERATIONS MANUAL

The eleven clubs of SLSQ Point Danger Branch began the season with endorsed Patrol Service Contracts. The contracts, in conjunction with the Patrol Operations Manual set the benchmarks for patrols for the coming season. Some changes were made to the Patrol Operations Manual in relation to IRB Operations, Marine Incident Reporting and general operations.

This season was particularly successful with no recorded patrol breaches — a great effort by all clubs and patrolling members. Any issues that arose were addressed before escalating to a breach.

PATROL GAP CALCULATOR

For many years, the Branch has completed patrol roster audits for the clubs — in recent years SLSQ has adopted our process and developed it into the program now called 'Patrol Gap Calculator" which is used across the state to identify gaps in patrols (awards, numbers on patrols, blue cards etc). Point Danger is the only Branch that has completed this in totality for the last two seasons. As such the Branch and Clubs have been instrumental in the provision of feedback to SLSQ to further develop this program.

The use of the Patrol Gap Calculator has been influential to the Branch's activities this season.



Feedback is provided to each club per patrol group indicating action items that need to be addressed. As a result, we have had an increase in specifically targeted awards where gaps were identified.

LIMSOC

This season SLSQ introduced a new online program to capture real time patrol and rescue statistics (previously this was done via a log book and entered in after patrols). This allows for a more accurate reporting of statistics. At present the Branch does not have access to this system and we are reliant on SLSQ for monthly reports – we are working to ensure that this is changed for season 2017/2018.

Through liaison with the Regional Life Saving Services Coordinator we have been provided with the necessary reports. As such we have been able to provide the clubs with monthly and annual reports of beach related statistics.


PATROL STATISTICS

Visitations

In season 2016/2017 we saw a slight decrease on beach visitations from season 2015/2016 (529 514 to 504 533) – an overall decrease of 4.71%.

The statistics showcased an overall decrease in swimmers between flags (-.05%), craft users (-20.8%) and people on beach (-2.94%).

Disappointingly, there was an increase in Swimmers outside the Flags of 21.92% on season 2015/2016.



Rescues


205 rescues were performed across the Branch in season 2016/2017. This is a slight decrease (0.96%) on season 2015/2016. The Branch has spent considerable time analysing the statistics as they relate to the equipment used, time of year, area, activity at the time of rescue and the rescues per club.

The Rescue Board was the most popular piece of rescue equipment (37.07% of total rescues) used in season 2016/2017. April was the busiest time of year for rescues with 26.34% of total rescues performed. May showcased the smallest amount of rescues - 0.48% (noting that clubs patrol only 3 days in May).

80% of rescues were performed outside of the flagged area, though noting that 48.29% of these were within 100m of the patrolling area. As such it seems that eternal vigilance and reiteration of the "swim between the flags" message is needed.

Tallebudgera SLSC performed the highest rate of rescues in season 2016/2017 with 17.56% of total rescues performed there. Close behind this was Coolangatta SLSC (16.09%) and Pacific SLSC (15.61%). Our lowest rate of rescues was at North Kirra SLSC recording only one rescue for the season.


At the time of rescue the three most popular activities that members of the public were participating in were swimming (65.36%), surfing (10.24%) and body board (6.83%).



Preventative Actions & Warnings

The clubs and patrolling members have been proactive in preventative patrolling measures which have contributed to another decrease in recorded rescues. The recording of the preventions and warnings has become easier with the addition of LIMSOC and as such there has been a spike in actions completed in season 2016/2017.

Point Danger Branch clubs have recorded a 283.13% increase in people warned and a 9.18% increase in preventative actions.



PREVENTATIVE ACTIONS - 4 YEAR COMPARISON

First Aid Treatments & Marine Stings

Season 2016/2017 has seen a dramatic increase in marine stings -390 (15/16) to 4388 (16/17). This can be attributed to a general increase in marine stingers across the state and also a better reporting mechanism.

First Aid treatments also experienced an increase throughout the season with an increase from 287 (15/16) to 507 (17/18) – an overall increase of 76.65%. Highest number of treatments were recprded at Rainbow Bay SLSC (47.73%).





LIFE SAVING EXCELLENCE

This season the clubs and members have excelled themselves in ensuring the bathing public have been kept safe. However, rescues have been performed and the efforts of our members have been recognised through the SLSQ Life Saving Excellence Awards. Congratulations to the following members and clubs

QFES/SUSTAINABILITY FUNDING

PATROL CLUB OF THE YEAR

The SLSQ Point Danger Branch Patrol Club of the Year point score and rules had some slight changes made in season 2016/2017 due to the introduction of LIMSOC. Given that statistics are now automatically provided, the Branch have reduced the provision for available points from 30 to 10 points. This is on the basis that the recording of statistical data is a more streamlined process and the submission dates are less relevant.

The Branch maintained the due dates and the 10 points in case the LIMSOC system is non-operational at any point throughout the season and Clubs are required to revert to the manual process. This also included 5 points for on time submission of Patrol Attendance Log Copies (which are now scanned monthly to the Branch)

Part of the Patrol Club of the Year point score includes patrol inspections which are carried out by Club Supervisors. Our thanks to the listed Club Supervisors for giving up their time for this activity. Feedback is provided to the clubs (with any necessary action items) within a week of the inspection.

Season 2016/2017 was the 11th season that the Patrol Club of the Year has been supported by Jann Stuckey MP (Member for Currumbin). Jann's continued support of this award has been instrumental to the Branch over a long period. Winners over the last 11 seasons are






PATROL HOURS

In season 2016/2017 Point Danger Branch patrolling members patrolled 68775.25 (excluding Operations Support Hours). This was a decrease of 11348.75 hours on the previous season.

TH&C SLSC patrolled the most number of hours (7867) with the smallest number at Bilinga (4005.25). Point Danger Branch Members (those who are direct members of the Branch instead of a club) contributed 346.25 hours to patrols throughout the season.

Additional to patrols – our members contributed 4923.75 hours to water safety activities at both club level and at surf sports events.

TRAINING & EDUCATION

Training and education is a key feature in Surf Life Saving and it is essential that the Clubs and Branch work together to provide an opportunity for all members to learn new skills. SLSQ Point Danger Branch has run an extensive calendar of courses for active members. This includes provision of Emergency Care Awards, Beach Management and Observers courses.

This season has also seen some changes in IRB and ART awards and as such the Branch has run several upgrade courses to bring members into line with the current units of competency.

The Patrol Gap Calculator allowed the Branch to identify gaps in awards required by the clubs and as such clubs were provided with action items to fulfill these gaps. Similarly, we have also scheduled courses at set venues to assist clubs and members in gaining specific awards.


Season 2016/2017 has seen a massive increase in awards gained by the club with an overall increase of 46.65% across the twelve operational patrolling awards and a 23.86% increase of total awards. Further, the Branch has also worked extensively on statistical analysis for the clubs with the provision of monthly statistics regarding operational patrolling awards. The Branch tracks awards gained monthly, quarterly and annually so that we can identify gaps, busy periods in the office and any need

for additional courses and resources.

ECT AWARDS 2 YEAR COMPARISON

EMERGENCY CARE AWARDS

In season 2016/2017 the Branch hosted fifteen Emergency Care award courses for our clubs and members – 7 x Advanced Resuscitation Techniques (ART) Courses, 5 x First Aid Courses and 3 x ART Upgrades. Additionally, the clubs also held courses at clubs as required. It should be noted that Spinal Management is currently not available as an award for members – SLSQ are currently reviewing the resources in line with ARC Guidelines.



All awards within the ECT portfolio have shown a dramatic increase with more members taking the opportunity to access free courses and increase their skills. Overall there has been a 26.65% increase in Emergency Care awards gained from season 2015/2016. The largest increase was in ART awards with a 115.83% increase. Our thanks to the SLSQ ECT Staff and Trainers for their assistance in this regard.

VEHICLE AWARDS

This season, via the statistics provided through the Patrol Gap Calculator, we were able to note that there was an issue at most clubs with lack of Vehicle Inductions. Clubs were asked to address this issue and ensure that all members who used vehicles for any activity at the club had the necessary vehicle inductions.

As a result of this, the clubs have shown a large increase of 95.26% in Vehicle Awards gained – 190 in 2015/2016 compared to 371 in 2016/2017.

OPERATIONAL AWARDS

Point Danger Branch tracks the twelve main operational awards required for patrols inclusive of ECT awards and Vehicle Awards.

Excluding ECT and vehicle awards, we focus on six operational patrolling awards – Bronze Medallion, Radio Operators, IRB Crewman, IRB Drivers, Surf Rescue Certificate and Beach Management.

This season the Branch has seen an increase of 52.41% on season 2015/2016 in the six above listed awards – our biggest increase in recent seasons. The busiest period for processing was the November – January quarter with 38.32% of these awards processed in this period.

Our largest increase was shown in the 4WD Induction with an increase of 340%. Only two operational awards experienced a decrease – Beach Management (-8.06%) and SRC (-6.96%).

COURSES

Throughout the season 153 courses and 25 upgrades were run within the Branch. Bronze Medallion was the most popular course run – making up 28.10% of the total courses held. The Branch tracks all courses held by clubs and records any errors in paperwork in line with the Branch Policy.

The error rate for the courses was 7.86%. A slight increase on season 2015/2016 which can be attributed to a change in resources for IRB Crewman and Driver awards which seen some minor errors by trainers and assessors. These will be addressed in the 2017/2018 Trainer and Assessor Workshops.

CLUB AWARDS

The clubs have completed a hugely successful year in educating their members – with a large increase across all awards. A snapshot of the 12-basic patrolling/operational awards showcases a 46.65% increase. Ten of the 11 clubs showcased an increase in these awards throughout the season.







TRAINERS & ASSESSORS


The Trainers and Assessors of the Branch are instrumental to the educational success of the clubs – performing many duties including training and assessing new members, mentoring new trainers and assessors and assessing junior and senior competencies and skills maintenance requirements – their dedication to this has seen a great increase in awards gained by the members.

This season the Branch focused some time on inducting existing trainers and assessors so that they can perform vehicle inductions for their clubs. Members who wish to train Vehicle Inductions must be a current Training Officer, hold the relevant vehicle award and be inducted with the required resources.

Point Danger Branch has submitted a proposal to SLSQ to introduce a Vehicle Induction Accreditation Officer – which will allow relevant club officers to perform the inductions. This will take the pressure off the trainers/assessors and give more opportunity for members to gain the award.




PDB SENIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

Again, this season the Branch Senior Championships were hindered by adverse weather conditions (large swell and extreme temperatures). As such the water events were cancelled, however the beach events, which were scheduled for Friday night were run with much success and positive feedback. This is the first time the Branch has run the sprints with a night time format and this proved to be a success which will be replicated in season 2017/2018.


OCEANS 38 PREMIERSHIP SERIES

Season 2016/2017 was the 9th season of Oceans 38 Premiership Series with SLSQ Point Danger Branch taking on the responsibility of administration and logistics. Oceans 38 did not have a sponsor on board this season, however with some cost savings and change to a one day event we were able to allocate funding for prize money for the members. Again, Oceans 38 was able to provide funding to clubs for host duties and also to each Branch at the end of the season (\$6000.00 per Branch).

Three (3) carnivals were held across the Gold Coast – Kirra SLSC, Tugun SLSC and Broadbeach SLSC (noting that this event was transferred to Kirra SLSC due to adverse ocean conditions at Broadbeach SLSC).

Competitors numbers were down due to clashes with Summer of Surf and as such we could revert the event to a one day event. Based on positive feedback the one day format will continue in season 2017/2018. in total 1013 competitors attended the event over 3 rounds (-84 on season 2015/2016).

Under 15 competitors made up the largest percentage of competitors across the 3 rounds (34.75%) with Under 19 posting the lowest number (15.99%).



SURF RESCUE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Surf Rescue Championships are the smallest event on the surf sports calendar but continue to gain momentum with increases in competitors each season over the last 5 years. Whilst we experienced an increase of 19% this season, there was a clash with the Royal Life Saving Pool Rescue Championships which prevented some competitors from attending. SURF SPORTS FUNDING



OFFICIALS

Officials are an integral part of the surf sports program – giving up countless hours to assist in the running of the many events held throughout the season. The Branch continues to host a number of courses per season to ensure that the clubs and members have the opportunity to identify and develop new officials.

In total 64 Members attended courses this season - 36 Level One and 28 Level Zero. This was an increase of 10.34% increase on season 2015/2016. The completion rate for officials this season has been positive with 61.11% of Level One Officials and 53.57% of Level Zero Officials completing the course requirements. The completion rates for season 2016/2017 exceeded the rates for season 2015/2016 (48.27% Level 1 and 41.37% Level Zero). Members have twelve months to complete their accreditation

JUNIOR ACTIVITIES

Surf lifesaving is an amazing activity for growing a child's confidence, knowledge and skills in the beach environment. Not only will the children have fun and meet new friends they will become part of an iconic organisation that has served the Australian community for over 100 years.

The program is focused on play, participation and fun. It offers an educational pathway through the delivery of the Junior Development Resource Kit which is designed to ensure children have fun at the beach while participating in lessons that will develop them to become a knowledgeable participant in both lifesaving and sport.

Before the start of the Junior Activities season each child is required to complete a Preliminary Skills Assessment designed to ensure that they can demonstrate a standard of competence in an aquatic environment.

Our Junior Clubs have again had a successful season – completing all required tasks in a timely manner and developing young life savers through education, life saving and surf sports pathways.

MEMBERSHIP

Nipper membership has shown an increase from 2015/2016 of 1948 to 2003 in season 2016/2017. This is an overall increase of 2.82%, which is pleasing to note after a 1.06% decrease in the previous season.


Seven clubs experienced an increase in membership (compared to three clubs the season prior)

JUNIOR EDUCATION

The education and award framework for Junior Activities continues with key learning outcomes for each age group. Over time, these activities have grown and developed along with the changing surf lifesaving culture, changing community expectations, and changing expectations of members.

The content and format of Junior Development Resources has been revised based on feedback, consultation and contribution from clubs and states. It has been designed to deliver positive learning and experiential outcomes for every 5 – 13-year-old who joins a surf lifesaving club. It incorporates three strands: knowledge, skills and competition. It emphasises fun, play and participation.

In season 2016/2017 1765 nipper awards were gained (+116 on last season). The Under 14 nippers gain a Surf Rescue Certificate as part of their development as patrolling members. In season 2016/2017 – 124 Junior Activity Members gained a Surf Rescue Certificate (+31 on season 15/16).

AGE MANAGERS

An Age Manager takes responsibility for the care, safety, wellbeing and development of junior surf lifesavers in their care. That responsibility involves facilitating the development of surf lifesaving and personal skills. Age Managers play a fundamental role in the delivery of a learning program that encourages and develops young surf lifesavers.

Point Danger Branch works with the clubs to ensure that all Age Managers are appropriately qualified and awards processed. In season 2015/2016 we commenced the Junior Activity Committee review which gives the clubs actions items to work on inclusive of Age Manager development. Further we send regular reminders to Junior Activity Chairpersons and Clubs in relation to the required documents to be submitted so we can process Age Manager awards.

In season 2016/2017, 51 members gained the Age Managers Award – an increase of 5 awards on season 2015/2016. We now have a total of 335 qualified Age Managers in the Branch.





Season 2016/2017 is the third season that JAAO's have been available to assist in the assessment of the nippers. This role was introduced to allow another level of volunteers who can sign off Junior Competencies and Age Awards, in order to ease the load on existing assessors, as well as providing a pathway to the role of Assessor.

This season twelve (12) members gained this award, taking the total to 57 across the Branch. We will work with the clubs in season 2017/2018 identify more members to gain this award.

The Branch continues to monitor this award in conjunction with the clubs and ensure endorsed members are inducted and provided with information and resources so they can carry out this role.

JUNIOR SURF SPORTS


The skills needed to compete in junior surf sports events are taught through specific lesson plans within the Nipper Development Programs depending on the age and level of skill progression. Surf Sport skills are also taught through the internal coaching and development programs at each individual club.

Point Danger Branch runs a number of events per season to cater to all age groups within Nippers including three events for U8-U10 age groups and one for U11- U14. In season 2017/2018 Point Danger Branch will add an additional event to the calendar – Gold Coast Youth Titles.

In season 2016/2017 the Branch conducted the following four junior events

- **PDB U8-U10 Teams Carnival**
- Little Dudes U8-U10 Carnival
- PDB U8-U10 Carnival
- PDB U11-U14 Youth Championships

Participation in junior events has remained consistent in recent seasons. In season 2016/2017 we saw an increase in participation at the first two events of the season – U8-U10 Teams Carnival and Little Dudes. However, we saw a decrease in attendance at the Branch Championships – 3.69% in U8-U10 Carnival and 12.88% in U11-U14 Youth Championships. It should be noted that the Youth Championships clashed with other State and Regional Sporting Championships which took a number of competitors away from the event.



OFFICIALS

The Branch held five courses throughout the season – two Level One courses and three Level Zero Courses. The Level Zero course is a four-hour course and officials who complete this can only officiate at Junior Surf Sports Events as marshals, starters, recorders or judges.

In season 2016/2017 – 28 members attended the Level Zero course with 15 finalising their award. As some of the members who attended the course hold multiple roles in their club, they will be able to finalise the award in season 2017/2018 keeping within the 12-month timeframe for award completion.

The Level One Course is designed for members to officiate at Senior Events and in higher roles. Of the 31 members that attended the Level One Officials course – 21 are involved in Nipper Activities.

YOUTH CHAMPIONSHIPS – GOLD MEDALLISTS

Point Danger Branch has been proactive in the promotion of youth activities. In season 2016/2017 our clubs and members participating in a number of Branch, State and Australian based programs.


TEAM X-TREME

INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION TOUR

Surf Life Saving Australia often distributes Expressions of Interest for International Training Opportunities. In season 2016/2017 an opportunity arose for members to assist with training life savers in Korea. Congratulations are extended to Ken Clark – Pacific SLSC on being chosen for this program.

Ken spent 10 days in Korea assisting the candidates from the Koran Lifeguard Association – who were existing pool lifeguards and wanted to become ocean lifeguards under ILS requirements. With existing skills in CPR and Frist Aid, the squad were trained and assessed in current techniques in surf awareness, surf skills and rescue practices.

SLSA CLUB OF THE YEAR

Each season, Branches and States vote on and choose their annual Club of the Year. At the end of season 2015/2016 Pacific SLSC was selected as the Branch Club of the Year. The club later went on to win the SLSQ Club of the Year and was later named the Australian Club of the Year at the SLSA Annual Awards in October 2016.

The club submission noted some impressive achievements in season 2015/2016 including a 35% increase in total membership, highest participation in surf sports in 25 years and implementation of a 5-year strategic plan. The club also introduced a number of training and development opportunities for members including youth programs (both internal and participation in external


VALE

CLUB REPORTS – TALLEBUDGERA SLSC

Tallebudgera SLSC's patrolling groups have been busy during the 2016/2017 season with a high influx of visitors (28135) to the beach. A record number of dangerous rips formed along the East facing beaches between Palm Beach and Tallebudgera Creek during the season. With more and more people utilising the dog beach north of the flagged area it was no surprise that most of the 36 rescues were performed close to there.

It is rewarding to see Tallebudgera SLSC continue to build with an overall membership increase of 8.6% this season. The Nipper membership was strong at 290 members, an increase of thirty-two



Nippers compared to season 2015/2016. A strong Nippers program leads to a stronger club with more Nipper parents becoming involved – especially by gaining their Bronze Medallion and assisting our patrol groups. This year will see most of the Junior Activities Committee move on. Tallebudgera SLSC is appreciative of the professional approach to the way Nippers was run. The new committee is looking forward to the 2017/2018 season; already making impressive plans for the oncoming season.

The Tallebudgera SLSC Summer Surf Girl entrant this year represented the club well, helping raise essential funding. It was encouraging to see how the whole club supported her throughout the program. Our Surf Girl, whilst a little disappointed with the result, was happy to see the Palm Beach entrant win the overall competition.

This year the club again made measurable improvements in the surf sports section. Hopefully the structure and continued backing with competitors and parents will continue throughout the coming seasons. The Open Women's boat crew represented Australia in Trans-Tasman battle with New Zealand bringing back the trophy.

The training and educational team continues to grow with the Chief Training Officer able to call on several qualified trainers to assist. The role of the trainer is not an easy job and it has been reassuring as a Club to see more people taking on that role.



CLUB REPORTS – PACIFIC SLSC

Season 2016/17 marked Pacific's 70th season, and was one of the most outstanding in the club's proud history. Pacific SLSC received 5 major awards at the Point Danger Branch Annual Awards, including Club of the Year, Youth Development Club of the Year, U18 Junior Lifesaver of the Year, Rookie Coach of the Year and the Silver Clive Hammond Medal. At the SLSQ Awards of Excellence the Club was awarded SLSQ Club of the Year and Youth Development Club of the Year, as well as the Gold Clive Hammond Medal. Rachael Clark was also awarded a Medal for Outstanding Resuscitation. Pacific represented Queensland at the SLSA Annual Gala Awards. The club was awarded the DHL Australian Surf Life Saving Club of the Year — a recognition that each member can be so proud of.



As with last season the Management team again set out their goals based on the club's five-year Strategic Plan, focusing on connecting with members and community, sustainable growth, governance, maximising the recognition of the club and members' achievements to continue to deliver great outcomes in all facets of surf lifesaving.

This season the patrol members increased from 104 to 114 and completed 6618 hours of patrol. Overall membership saw a slight increase from 331 to 332 in line with our strategic plan and KPI's. Through great leadership by the Club Captain and Chief Training Officer, Pacific SLSC continues to set high standards with beach patrols and the level of skill needed to maintain proficiency. This season the club completed 32 rescues and saw awards increase by 81.5 %.

Pacific's financial position is very healthy and is attributed to not only record amounts of donations and sponsorship, but the ongoing strong fiscal management of the club and its resources. The club is fortunate to have a Supporters Club that generates a significant amount of revenue. The Finance Committee has been able to generate successful grants and sponsorship for vital equipment and club renovations. The club has also been able to engage a paid Surf Coach and Office Manager for the first time.

Continued development of nippers by a strong Junior Committee has provided valuable impetus in creating an environment that has increased the number of young lifesavers coming from this valuable nursery. Pacific's increased results in surf sports for juniors was evident particularly in the water events which in previous seasons were greatly overshadowed by beach results.

Youth Development is vital in the Club's on-going sustainability and success. This season the club sent young members to Camps as well as having members in the PDB Team X-Treme program. Four members completed the YIPs Gold Award. Two members were awarded the Point Danger Branch Youth of the Month during the season.

The results in surf sports go from strength to strength with record participation at all levels including Branch, State and National Championships. Highlights included successful Masters results, nippers and being Branch champions at the Surf Rescue Champs for the third year running. The highlight of the year was the reintroduction of the clubs first Senior March Past Team in 25 years.

A defining moment for Pacific this season came in the last two weeks of the season with the introduction of the Seahorse Program for children with special needs. The implementation of this program is a clear indicator of Pacific SLSC commitment to connecting with the community.

Pacific SLSC will continue to deliver on the clubs mission of a proactive and effective surf lifesaving club leading the way in providing lifesaving service, education, sport, beach and water safety advocacy and community leadership.

CLUB REPORTS – PALM BEACH SLSC

The season of 2016/2017 Has been another big year for Palm Beach SLSC, it was another enjoyable season with great support from all the members, but especially the office bearers of the club and Management Committee.

Palm Beach SLSC continues to move forward in leaps and bounds with an increasing number of members volunteering their time towards all aspects of the club. The club still continues to show three core elements that Palm Beach SLSC prides itself on

- One Club
- One Team
- One Family

The Red and Yellow of Palm Beach SLSC continues to pride itself on a fatality free season. Thank-you again to all members who volunteer their time to keep the beaches safe. This season the club experienced an increase in membership across all areas – posting an impressive 26.81% increase in Active Membership.

Training and Education has been a priority at the club this season and there has been an overall increase of 67.87% in operational patrolling awards throughout the season. This includes a big increase in Bronze Medallions (+26 on season 2015/2016).

In the competitive ranks of Palm Beach, numbers continue to grow with more members putting on the Palm Beach colours. Through dedication, training and a never say die attitude all members from the

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youngest nipper to master represented the Club in true Palm Beach spirit. The results at Branch, State and Australian (Juniors and Seniors) Championships shows that the club has set a benchmark for competition through results and participation and will continue to strive to ensure that Palm Beach is represented at carnivals. Big congratulations go to all of the medal winners at these carnivals.

The biggest club achievement this year would have to go to Palm Beach SLSC's very own Summer Surf Girl Shelley Roberts. What an absolute amazing achievement to be crowned the 2016/2017 Summer Surf Girl Winner. Congratulation's to Shelley and the Surf Girl committee on a great achievement.

In season 2016/2017 Palm Beach SLSC was proactive in applying for grants and to this end the club has been granted \$100000.00 from QLD Sport and Recreation for an upgrade of club amenities and storage areas.

CLUB REPORTS – CURRUMBIN SLSC

It is hard to fathom that it has again come time to prepare a report paying tribute to and reflecting upon the 2016/2017 season. It was a season to remember!

This year Currumbin assisted members to achieve a record number of awards – 506 Senior awards in season 2016/2017 in total. 59 new Bronze Medallion holders joined the Lifesaving family this season and 28 new SRC award holders qualified ready to tackle their Bronze in the coming season. Currumbin SLSC proudly boasted 947 SLSC Members including 291 Active Members. 7859.50 volunteer patrol hours were completed by the patrolling members, contributed to by the qualified volunteer Surf Lifesavers. And of course, the number which means more than any



other - there were again zero preventable deaths at Currumbin beach in the 2016/2017 season.

The club was proud to support members ongoing involvement in the PDB Team X-Treme Program and various Youth Development activities and camps facilitated by SLSQ as well as internal activities designed to foster club spirit, build culture and support both the development and enjoyment of our young members in lifesaving activities.

It was a competitive season to remember. Currumbin SLSC achieved 2nd at the 2016 World Lifesaving Championships - the Club's best ever result and can boast two World Champion Teams and one Individual World Champion. The Club achieved 2nd at the 2017 Australian Championships for the second year running. Currumbin SLSC retained the 2016 Australian Pool Rescue Championships as first in the point score and also assisted five athletes to compete in the Kellogg's Nutri Grain Iron Series, another Club record. The Club had four members selected to represent International Teams - Australia and NZ at Rescue 2016. The IRB Racing Team is back and building into a very competitive unit.

It was another very successful year for the Supporters Association with very solid trading figures being posted despite some significant weather challenges. This season was a period of consolidation, as the Club prepares to undertake a major renovation to ensure the facilities continue to attract record crowds to this unique location. Facilities aside, our shining asset was again our staff who deliver such incredible hospitality day in and day out. This ongoing support and hard work allows the SLSC to expand its operations and continue to grow and achieve its strategic goals.

This season saw the successful integration of Nippers back into the SLSC structure. Currumbin SLSC is finally one Club from top to bottom and not before time! 298 Nippers were registered this season. These dynamos were PDB Champions and Gold Coast City Titles Champions in season 2016/2017 and achieved a very credible fourth at the State Titles. In fact, they went into the last day of competition still hanging on to 1st place on the point score but were overrun in the end. To watch the pride that the committee instil in the little lifesavers about being a Viking and wearing the green and white is inspirational. It can never start too young.

The Active Member Night function attendance was well up on previous seasons and a great cross section of members from Life Members to new Club Members and Nipper families all descended on the Club each month, assisting Currumbin to realise its goal of bringing the diverse sections of the Club together under one banner.

The clubs message for the coming season is this - one of the great dangers is that when things are going well – and there is no doubt that the club is in something of a golden period – complacency is the evil within. It would be all too easy to say "Well, the Club doesn't need me. It's all running well. I'll just do what I did last year." The Club does need you. Each and every one of you. It needs you to give what you can. And it needs you to lend your support to others who have given consistently, again and again. Get involved. Find out what's happening. Take an interest in a little part of the Club that you may not have been involved with before. This is particularly important in this period of growth – expanding numbers means more volunteers are required as officials, age managers and on sub-committees to share the workload.

CLUB REPORTS – TUGUN SLSC

The 2016/2017 season has indeed been a remarkable season for Tugun SLSC. This year with the help of SLSQ the club made the decision to bring in a new constitution with a streamlined Management Committee consisting of six members, designed to make future Management meetings more efficient.

During the year, the Club purchased badly needed equipment for the use in patrols and surf sports. Further, the Club applied for and received a grant from the Bendigo Bank (Tugun Branch) for the full purchase price of a new tractor. The club has also ordered two new



IRB's, the first one is due to arrive within the next few weeks and the second one in several months' time due to a manufacturing back log.

The Tugun Supporters Club generously agreed to put in 50 percent of the purchase price of a new surf boat which arrived around the start of the competition season.

Tugun SLSC applied for and was given the right to host the 2017 Australian Championships Surf Boat events along with the contract for the workforce. This was aimed at bringing in much needed funds to both the Surf Lifesaving and Supporters Club. The event started well, the Masters Competition went over two days and then the Open section was scheduled to follow. Unfortunately, Cyclone Debbie had formed off North Queensland and made its way far enough down the coast to cause the entire carnival to be suspended due to heavy rain and huge seas. SLSA then requested Tugun SLSC workforce to clear the beach of approximately 200 boats parked on it and bring them up onto the grassed areas north and south of the club for safety reasons. This mammoth task was successfully carried out in wind and driving rain in just over an amazing 3-hour period by the Tugun Workforce. Unfortunately, Friday night saw the entire carnival being cancelled due to the deteriorating conditions. Surprisingly however, the Supporters Club was still able to do a fair trade.

This year saw the introduction of CCTV into the boatshed, gym and entry to the showers. This is part of the Harm Minimisation Policy that Tugun SLSC has adopted in line with Blue Card enforcement. The Management committee take security and the care and safety of the membership very seriously.

The monthly Management Committee meetings were well attended which is a true indication that the members who took on positions were always ready to fulfil their obligations and do their best.

Club membership again was on the rise with an increase of 10.46% on total membership. The club had a 82.5% increase across all awards being gained, 219 awards processed in total up from 120 last year.

Fundraising went well, again the club held a Sportsman's lunch and a 200-club function with both being successful and providing much needed funds for club operations. The club again participated in the annual surf safe appeal. The surf club made over \$20,000 clear this year from raffles on Thursday and Friday nights in the bar alone. This is truly an outstanding financial achievement by these excellent club members who turn up every single time without fail.

CLUB REPORTS – BILINGA SLSC

The season 2016/2017 highlighted to Bilinga SLSC members that even being a small club with a normally safe beach to patrol that you must be prepared for the unexpected and be vigilant. During the season there were two occasions that lifesaving practices and skills were called upon. The first occasion two young members had to rescue an elderly male on 31 December 2016 during beach surveillance. The gentleman was swept out in a rip and was in trouble in very treacherous surf. Both members (Bronze/SRC) carried out an exceptional rescue with the assistance of other members from the Club.



On the other occasion, it was the last day of patrol (1 May) when the volunteer patrol had to perform CPR on a 70-year-old male who had collapsed on the grass in front of the club, he was unconscious and unresponsive. After 30 minutes of CPR and with assistance of the QAS the male regained a pulse and was taken to the Gold Coast University Hospital. The patient has recovered and has been in contact with the Club to pass on his appreciation for the assistance provided to him on the day. On both occasions Bilinga SLSC members worked as a team and utilised their training to achieve the best outcome.

Apart from the two incidents this season the patrolling members once again performed a commendable service to the community on and off the beach. It was noted that nine members had performed 100+ hours with one member completing 163 hours of patrolling service, an exceptional commitment and dedication by the members. Another successful season for Bilinga Surf Life Saving Club.

With an appointed CTO and a committed Bilinga SLSC Training Team, a live in Bronze/SRC Course was facilitated during the September school holidays with 12 members receiving the Bronze/SRC awards with great support from many parents who made the week a success. During October, the club facilitated an IRB crewperson course which increased numbers within the power craft area. Bilinga SLSC's ongoing commitment to provide training and courses to increase patrolling numbers is paramount for the club. The patrolling membership has maintained stability over the past seasons with no significant increases and this area needs addressing in season 2017/2018.

There are plans in the off season to engage young members with training for Champion Lifesaver to compete in the Point Danger Branch Surf Rescue Championships next season.

Bilinga SLSC continued to improve conditions and amenities for members and visitors. The bar area had a \$35,000 refurbishment which will enhance earning capacity in providing improved amenities for functions and room hire. The male toilet/shower amenities are at present being refurbished with tiling, fittings and shower compartments. The work was overdue and Bilinga appreciates the support of funding from Karen Andrews MP, Federal Member for McPherson to improve member amenities.

The club this season has again been supported by the Point Danger Branch Patrol Group and Brisbane Lifesaving team. We appreciate their ongoing support. Bilinga SLSC acknowledges the assistance we receive from Point Danger Branch Office in all areas.

The clubs appreciation is extended to North Kirra SLSC and Tugun SLSC for their ongoing support in assisting in training, patrolling and in particular assistance provided to the patrols during the resuscitation incident on the 1st May.

CLUB REPORTS – NORTH KIRRA SLSC

Junior Activities grew this season to 103 members, especially in the younger age groups thanks to an asserted membership campaign at the beginning of the season. The membership drive and focus on upskilling and educating each individual junior member was undertaken by a very capable Junior Activities Committee. With consistent efforts over forthcoming seasons, the club is confident that the nippers program will continue to flourish especially noting that *all* children, regardless of skill level, are provided the opportunity to be an active participant in the junior program.

The Club Captain led patrols ensuring that North Kirra SLSC's obligations were met at all times. The Club has been working hard to improve the number of patrolling members in order to reduce the workload on each individual. A full education roster was prepared at the beginning of the season with numerous courses run back-to-back every weekend. This has helped strengthen the patrolling base with a continued effort next season required to ensure stability over forthcoming seasons. Thanks, are extended to both Currumbin and Kirra SLSCs who assisted by patrolling at North Kirra beach throughout the season. The comradery between Point Danger Branch clubs is to be admired.

The Club also had good representation at various Branch and SLSQ carnivals. North Kirra SLSC had 40 members compete in the Branch Championships (over all age groups) and 15 members competed at the Queensland Junior and Senior Championships, including Pool Rescue and Surf Board Riding events. Special thanks to Team Managers, ensuring all competitors were ready for marshalling and all equipment was organised for each carnival.

Following the renovations which were completed in September 2015, the Surf and Supporters' Clubs both remain in a very stable financial position which continues to improve. The Club has regenerated its free cash flow with well over \$100,000 already in the bank. This is noting that no loans were required to undertake the renovation and the Club remains debt free. Additionally, the Club has been successful in achieving numerous grants for an ATV, Education Resources, Resuscitation Manikins, Kitchen Renovation and Tents. North Kirra SLSC had a busy season of fundraising with the Branch Youth, Queensland and Australian Championships all held at North Kirra. Unfortunately, the Aussies

were cancelled due to cyclonic weather events which unfortunately minimized the financial benefit to the Club. The Club Treasurer was exceptional in the organisation of the fundraising events ensuring income and expenditure was tightly controlled.

The employed Club Management continues to perform above and beyond every expectation which has resulted in clear improvements in all facets of both the Surf and Supporters Club operations.

The Club is exceptionally proud of the efforts that each member injects in to North Kirra SLSC and the committee is confident that the Club will continue to improve and succeed under the guiding hand of the respective committees, staff and volunteers.




CLUB REPORTS – KIRRA SLSC

As with all clubs the key focus for the season is providing a safe and vigilant patrol for the beaches. This season Kirra SLSC have continued to see growth in the patrolling membership and the Club Captain and Vice-captain have done a tremendous job in



ensuring that patrols have been first class and the quality of service is second to none. The hard work put into establishing key members as patrol captains and building patrol groups around these members has ensured that our patrolling numbers have been strong throughout the season.

On the side of Surf Sports Kirra continued to over achieve and excel in areas not thought possible. Whilst Kirra SLSC may not have the resources of other clubs, there is a core group of committed members that continue to represent Kirra and take the blue and yellow to the top of the podium. The Pool Rescue team walked away from the Australian Pool Rescue Titles with a swag of medals and should be proud of what they achieved for such a small team. This season saw Kirra take home its very first World Lifesaving Title with the IRB Team taking home Gold in the Open Mass Rescue at the ILS World Titles in Noordwijk, The Netherlands. This was an amazing achievement for Kirra SLSC and was fantastic to receive well wishes from all of the clubs within PDB.

As Kirra SLSC finalized the season is would be remiss of the club not to mention the amazing support Kirra receives from the Branch. Ken and Kerrie have gone above and beyond again this season to ensure the survival of our great club. I cannot speak highly enough of the time and effort that they provide Kirra SLSC and without their assistance in every area the club would all be much poorer.

Thanks to all of the members of Kirra SLSC for the efforts put in throughout the season and look forward to an even bigger and better things next season.

CLUB REPORTS – COOLANGATTA SLSC

Coolangatta SLSC can proudly boast again that there were no lives lost on the beach throughout the 2016/2017 season. The Clubs dedicated Lifesavers put in a massive 6,134 hours patrolling Coolangatta beach completing 33 rescues, 135 preventative actions, 278 First Aid Treatments and warned 2696 people about possible dangers to keep the beach going public safe. Considering, 36,080 people visited Coolangatta beach these figures are very impressive.

A major highlight for Coolangatta SLSC is the annual "Bronzies Day" combined with the Lifesaving Memorial Day. This is a very special day where members gather together to congratulate and honour new Bronze recipients. Bronzies Day is now an integral and important day in Coolangatta SLSC's culture and future.

Coolangatta SLSC enjoys great support from the Coolangatta SLSC Supporters Club and thanks are extended to the staff and Supporters Club committee - the patrolling members are very grateful for the food



supplied to each Patrol. Since the renovations the Supporters Club has been going from strength to strength by winning many awards, this year the Supporters Club were again in the running for major awards at the Clubs Queensland Awards for Excellence Night. Coolangatta were finalists in Responsible Service of Alcohol, Outstanding Safety and the Best Club on the Gold Coast. Coolangatta SLSC are very lucky to have such a successful Supporters Club contributing financially to the Surf Club.

Another fantastic initiative that Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Club has run for the past few seasons is the Bluebottles program. This very popular program is designed to help children and adults with special needs enjoy the beach and surf under the safety and guidance of Surf Lifesavers. This fantastic program is proving to be even more popular each year. Thank you to all members who assist with this for their dedication to the program this season.

Coolangatta SLSC is still actively running a successful membership drive that has proven to boost total members in all areas of the club. This season the club had a total of 444 members compared to 344 the previous year – an increase of 32.93%. The goal is to build membership numbers to at least 500 for the 2017/2018 season. The Club has maintained the lower membership fees again for this coming season. Coolangatta SLSC needs to secure its future and attract more members to the Club.

It is of ultimate importance that the club focus on an increase in Nippers and then that will eventually flow on to all other areas of the club. By bringing new members to Coolangatta SLSC, the club will be able to boost Nipper squads and senior competitor and patrolling numbers; this will also enable all age levels to have enough members to compete in team events. Another positive aspect the club is starting to see more of now is the number of families that are joining as part of the Nippers and parents then go on to gain their Bronze Medallion and assist with patrols.

The Club Chief Training Officer has again excelled in this role and this is shown by the large number of new awards that were gained by members.

The Clubs is thankful to the Management Committee whose support, assistance and dedication to Surf Lifesaving is second to none. At present the club has a very strong and stable committee with each committee member putting in many hours of volunteered time working hard to ensure that Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Club is given the best possible management to maintain and grow the club.

- The team of five girls, Mariah Jones, Leah Jones, Rachelle King, Lisa Ferguson and Marina Macartney for their outstanding efforts at the World Titles, finishing 12th overall in the Club Championship Pointscore. The highlight being a third in the Open Oceanwoman Relay;
- = 140 years Woman's Surf Boat − winning State and Australian Titles;
- ≡ Ruth Kemp an outstanding achievement in winning her 50th gold medal from the Australian / World Titles;
- Nadene Hennessy-Rasmussen, Charisse Cormack, Renee Hogben and Lisa Ferguson great results in Aussie pool rescue including two golds and two Australian records.

Notes to the Financial Statements For the year ended 30 April 2017

Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The Management Committee prepared the financial statements of the trust on the basis that the club is a non-reporting entity because there are no users dependant on general purpose financial statements. The financial statements are therefore special purpose financial statements that have been prepared in order to meet the requirements of the trust deed, the information needs of the stakeholders and for the basis of preparation of the income tax return.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the significant accounting policies disclosed below, which the Management Committee has determined are appropriate to meet the purposes of preparation. Such accounting policies are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs unless otherwise stated in the notes. The accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of the statements are as follows:

(a) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Property, Plant and Equipment are carried at cost or at independent or Management Committee valuation. All assets, excluding freehold land and buildings are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the trust. Increases in the carrying amount arising on revaluation of land and buildings are credited to a revaluation reserve in shareholders' equity. Decreases that offset previous increases of the same asset are charged against fair value reserves directly in equity; all other decreases are charged to the income statement. Each year the difference between depreciation based on the revalued carrying amount of the assets charged to the income statement and depreciation based on the asset's original cost is transferred from the revaluation reserve to retained earnings. The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the Management Committee to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the asset's employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted in determining recoverable amounts.

(b) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities on the balance sheet.

(c) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue. Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which, for floating rate financial assets, is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Notes to the Financial Statements For the year ended 30 April 2017

Revenue recognised related to the provision of services is determined with reference to the stage of completion of the transaction at the reporting date and where outcome of the contract can be estimated reliably. Stage of completion is determined with reference to the services performed to date as a percentage of total anticipated services to be performed. Where the outcome cannot be estimated reliably, revenue is recognised only to the extent that related expenditure is recoverable.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(d) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Tax Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the balance sheet are shown inclusive of GST.

(e) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the liability for employee entitlements arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related costs.

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
