EXECUTIVE OVERVIEW

PRESIDENTS MESSAGE

It is with pleasure that I present the 94th Annual Report for SLSQ Point Danger Branch. Season 2017/2018 has provided us with a number of interesting outcomes, weather wise this season was vastly improved on the previous season and yet beach visitations were down by approximately 7%, one reason for this may have been the pre-games advertising regarding the likely disruption caused by the 2018 Commonwealth Games. On the flipside of the fewer numbers attending our beaches we had many more swimmers both between and outside the flags and the number of craft users increased significantly. It is therefore very pleasing to note that our Beach Patrols performed 95 rescues throughout the season in comparison with 205 rescues in 2016/2017, hopefully this indicates that safety messaging and preventative actions are gaining in effectiveness as we continue to maintain a safe environment for beach visitors in Point Danger Branch. I take this opportunity to thank each and every one of our remarkable volunteers for the time, energy and commitment that they provide to our Clubs.

Although overall member statistics were down by 104 members this season it is very pleasing to see that our active membership continues to grow. The information and numbers outlined in this report are but a snapshot in time and only go so far in charting the dedication and hard work undertaken by our Clubs and their members in delivering such valuable service to our community. Thank you also to the Branch office bearers for your support and assistance, especially given that your services at Branch are in addition to your Club commitments, Point Danger Branch can only continue to improve and grow through your diligence and enthusiasm.

We should also recognise and commend the efforts of Kerrie Barnes and our other staff members, Carole, Rachael, Gabby and Courtney for their outstanding work in maintaining Branch operations, administration services and carnival support all of which are integral to the success of our Clubs.

As always, we would not be able to deliver services to our Members were it not for the continued assistance of our Patrons, Sponsors and Supporters, thank you for your backing in helping Point Danger Branch fulfil our mission as we strive to be one of the most efficient and effective Branches in SLSQ.

SIGNIFICANT ACHIEVEMENTS

Policy

In an ever-changing social environment Point Danger Branch has been working towards continuous improvement and identified areas whereby current policy and constitutions are silent on. As such, in response to continuing challenges at clubs, the Branch Executive Committee continues to research major issues as identified at club level or otherwise. In conjunction with the Branch Council two new policies – Children in the Workplace and Gender Identity have been approved and implemented

IRB Water Safety Crews

In recent seasons, the number of suitably qualified and experienced IRB Drivers and Crews for carnival water safety duties has decreased. As such the Branch considered these issues and have commenced a program whereby individual drivers and crews can nominate to attend carnivals as part of the water safety. The clubs are charged an IRB levy – the monies from this is then paid to the clubs who have drivers/crew in attendance. This has been a great fundraising option for clubs and especially IRB Racing Teams and assisted in the formation of qualified drivers and crews for events.

LIMSOC Training Portal

Feedback from active members and clubs has indicated that there is a need for a training portal for the LIMSOC online Patrol Statistics system. Point Danger Branch has been liaising with IT experts towards having this system built for our member's benefit. This will be uploaded on the Point Danger Branch website for use by all the members

MANAGEMENT OF FISCAL POLICY

The financial status of the Branch is positive with a consistent income stream. With the finalisation of the new roof there is only more major item to be completed – a ceiling and additional storage to be built. Futuristically, minor repairs and maintenance will be necessary for the building.

This season we have seen an \$14339.00 deficit which can be attributed to \$9193.00 in depreciation, \$4579.00 in fixed assets that have been written off, \$5335 in repairs and maintenance to building and \$3278.00 in employee provisions (long service leave)

The Branch is currently in its second year of a four-year funding agreement with the Gold Coast City Council (\$65000.00 per annum).

The Branch is proactive in applying for grants as they become available – in season 2017/2018 \$30013.00 (excluding the annual QFES Payment) in grants were successfully gained to aid in the operations of the Branch.

MEMBERSHIP

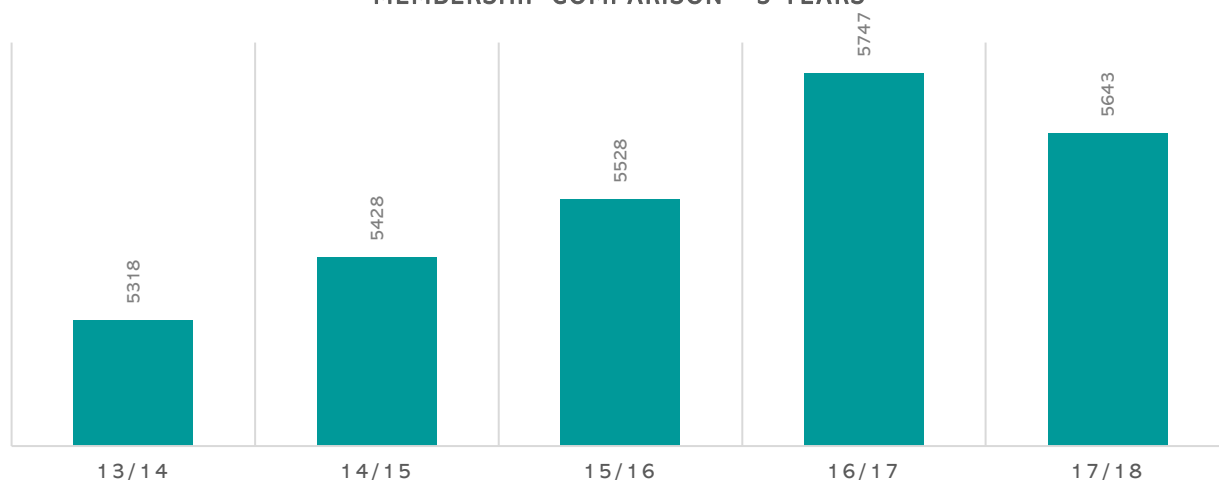
After three years of consecutive growth across the Branch, peaking in season 2016/2017, the Branch has experienced a slight decrease of -1.81% in total membership.

In total we finished the season with 5643 members (-104 on season 2016/2017).

The largest decrease occurred in the Past Active category (-17.28%) followed by Associate Members (-6.52%). The decrease in Associate members can be attributed to the decrease in nipper numbers (noting that at least one parent joins with the nippers).

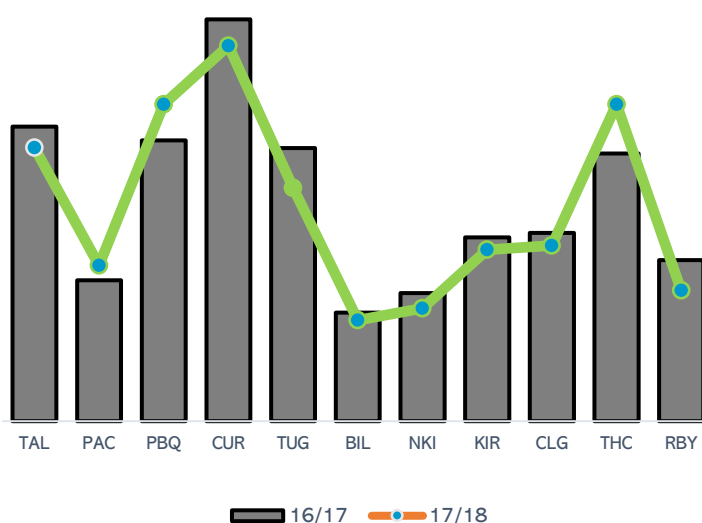
A large increase has been noted in the Honorary membership category of 52.94% (27 in 2016/2017 to 51 in 2017/2018).

In season 2017/2018 the Branch has experienced the exact reverse of the previous season. Three (3) clubs have experienced an increase (compared to 8 last season) and eight (8) have experienced a decrease (compared to 3 last season).

Tweed Heads & Coolangatta SLSC experienced the largest increase (18.85% which equates to 119 members) – this is the third season that the club has posted an increase. Other clubs with an increase are Palm Beach SLSC (+17.52%) and Pacific SLSC (+10.54%).

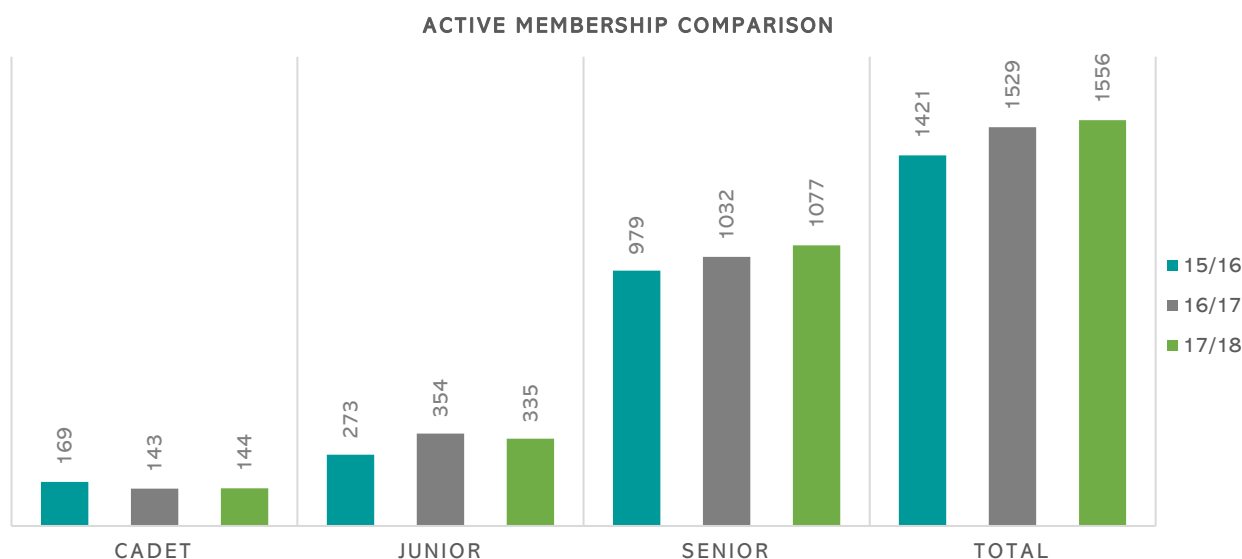
The largest decreases were recorded by Rainbow Bay SLSC (-18.94%) and Tugun SLSC (-14.75%).

ACTIVE MEMBERSHIP

Despite a decrease in overall membership – there has been an increase in Active Membership of 1.89% (Cadet, Junior and Senior). This is a positive trend within the clubs – showcasing that they are turning existing members into Active Members. Overall, Active Membership has increased for four consecutive seasons.

The membership statistics of the Branch are monitored monthly, with updates being sent to the Clubs to assist them in tracking their recruitment and retention. These are also collated annually and forwarded to the Clubs for inclusion into their annual reports.

Active Cadets experienced a 0.69% increase, Active Juniors a 5.63% decrease and Active Seniors a 4.36% increase.



Active members are not only confined to the above categories – there are other supporting categories that are also able to patrol.

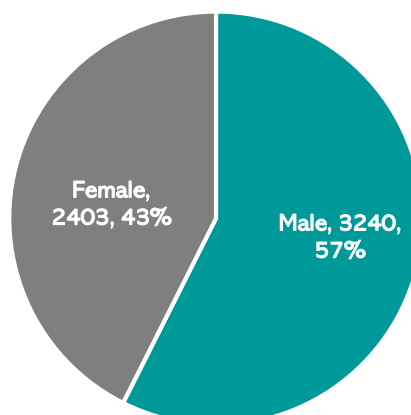

MEMBERSHIP BY GENDER

There has been a decrease in both genders throughout the season in line with the overall membership decrease – in total female membership has decreased 2.59% and male membership has decreased 1.21%

Females have the majority membership in Award and Associate membership categories.

In total Females make up 43% of the membership (+.07% on season 2016/2017)



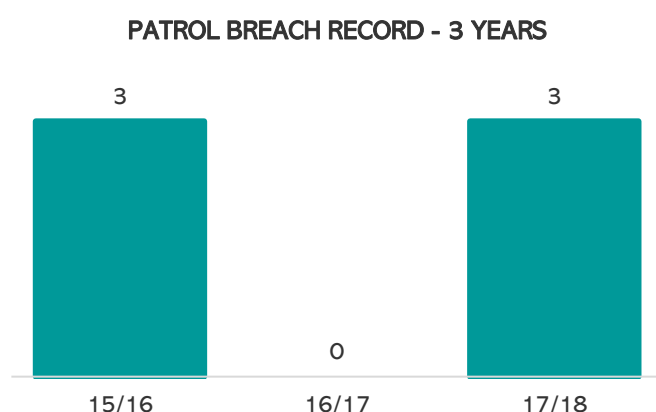
OPERATIONS

The 94th season of surf lifesaving in Point Danger Branch has come to a close with no lives lost between the flags. Point Danger Branch lifesavers continue to protect the patrolled beaches from Rainbow Bay to Tallebudgera, coupled with support from SLSQ Operations Support assisting to patrol the coastline with Jet Skis and Helicopters.

The importance of a professional customer service to patrols should never be underestimated and the Branch works each year to assist in the support of clubs and members in this regard.

In a constantly changing and challenging environment our clubs continue to excel in their provision of service to the beach going public.

PATROL SERVICE CONTRACTS & PATROL OPERATIONS MANUAL



With the inclusion of the Commonwealth Games on the Gold Coast – some changes to Patrol Service Contracts for Kirra, Coolangatta, TH&C and Rainbow Bay occurred. The four (4) clubs were required to provide extended patrols (surveillance) during the period directly before, during and after the Commonwealth Games. This saw the clubs with a presence on the beach from 6am – 6pm to ensure that the additional visitors to the Gold Coast were protected. Our thanks to the clubs for their additional commitment in this regard.

Additional changes were also made to the Rainbow Bay SLSC Patrol Service Contract to allow the club to perform an open patrol during the Quiksilver/Roxy Pro.

This season three patrol breaches were recorded – two of these related to insufficient members on patrol and one relative to a patrol being packed up early. These were dealt with via the Point Danger Branch Patrol Breach Policy and necessary correspondence and liaison was carried out with the clubs.

PATROL GAP CALCULATOR

This tool has been advantageous to the clubs and Branch and allows us an overall snapshot of the status of patrols relating to registration of members, blue cards and awards.

The Patrol Gap Calculator is completed twice a year with feedback and action items provided to the clubs to ensure compliance to the Patrol Service Contract and also identify patrols and members that require additional training/skills.

Some of the major items identified this season were expired driver's licences and the need for Beach Management and IRB Drivers on patrols.



PATROL STATISTICS

Visitations

For the second consecutive season there has been a recorded decrease in visitors to our beaches. Overall 468690 people visited our beaches (-7.10%). The highest recorded visitations were in January (106155). Rainbow Bay posted the highest number of visitors -112182 (23.94%)

Again, for the second season there has been an increase in swimmers outside of the flags (+5.53%). With the provision of roving patrols and SLSQ Operations Support services the clubs are able to monitor these swimmers; however it is still a significant risk.

Rescues

In season 2017/2018 the clubs posted 95 rescues in total – a decrease of 110 rescues on season 2016/2017.

Rescue Boards have again proven to be the most popular piece of rescue equipment with 37 rescues (38.94%) carried out with this item. The IRB was also used for a lot of rescues – posting 29 rescues (30.53%). Rescue Tube was the least used equipment with 11 rescues (11.57%).

December has posted the largest number of rescues – 20% of the total rescues performed (19 in total). May and September posted the smallest number of rescues – 3.15% (3 rescues per month).

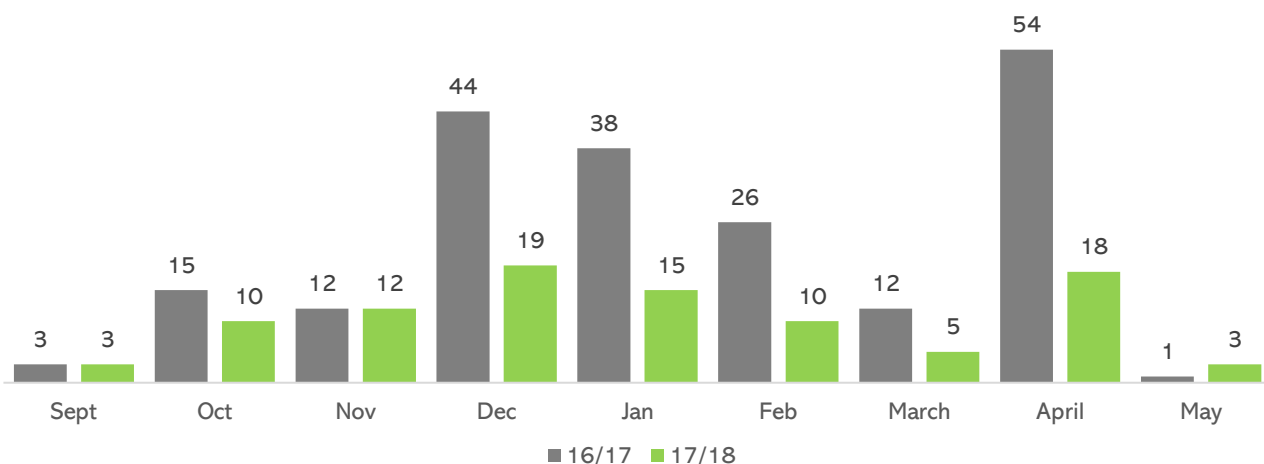
83.15% of rescues were performed outside the flagged area (an increase of 3.15% on season 2016/2017). 48.4% of the rescues outside of the flags were done within 100m of the flagged area. It is disappointing to note that not all beach goers are utilising the flagged area, but the skills of our lifesavers have kept them safe regardless of their choice.

Tallebudgera SLSC recorded the highest number of rescues – performing 20 in total (21.05%) with Kirra SLSC posting the second highest number of rescues – performing 17 in total (17.89%). Bilinga SLSC posted the smallest number of rescues for the season – 1 (1.05%).

Males were rescued more often than females – making up 67.36% of the total rescues and the 11-15 age group made up 21.05% of total rescues.

Swimming (64.21%), Surfing (15.79%) and Body Boarding (10.52%) made up the top three activities that beach goers were undertaking at the time of rescue.

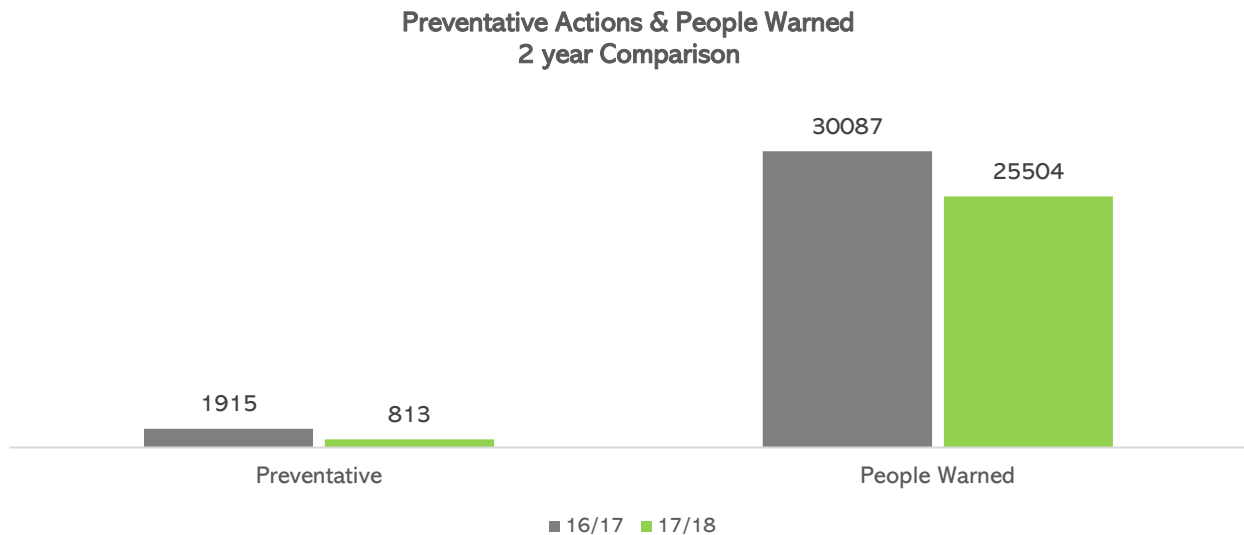
Rescue Monthly - 2 year Comparison



PREVENTATIVE ACTIONS AND WARNINGS

Preventative actions and warnings are the cornerstone to the safety of the beach going public. These actions have assisted in the decrease of rescues required on the beaches.

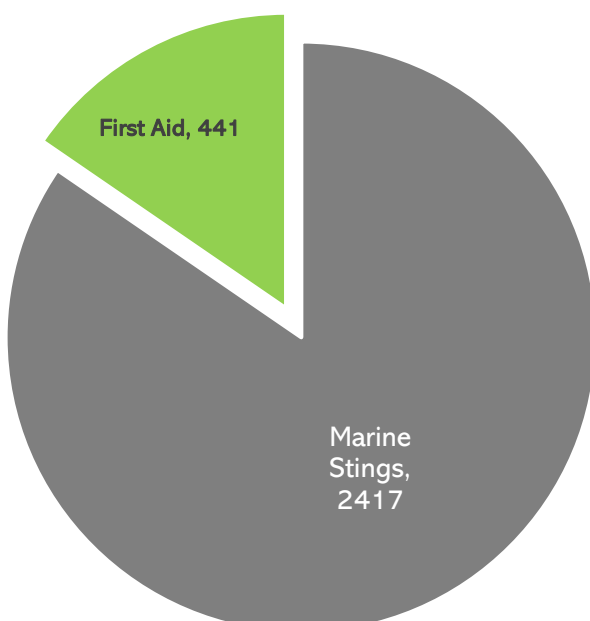
Overall there has been a 57.88% decrease in Preventative Actions/Public Relations (813 in total in 2017/2018). People Warned has also seen a significant decrease of 20.38% (30087 in 2016/2017 compared to 23956 in 2017/2018).



FIRST AID TREATMENTS & MARINE STINGS

After a significant increase in marine stings in season 2016/2017 (due to prevailing weather conditions) – there has been a 44.92% decrease this season (4388 to 2417).

First Aid treatments have also experienced a decrease of 13.02% (-66 in total). January was the busiest month with first aid treatments (94 in total) and September was the quietest month (4 in total).



Rainbow Bay treated the most first aid incidents (43.5%) and experienced the highest number of marine stings (30.91%) in the Branch.

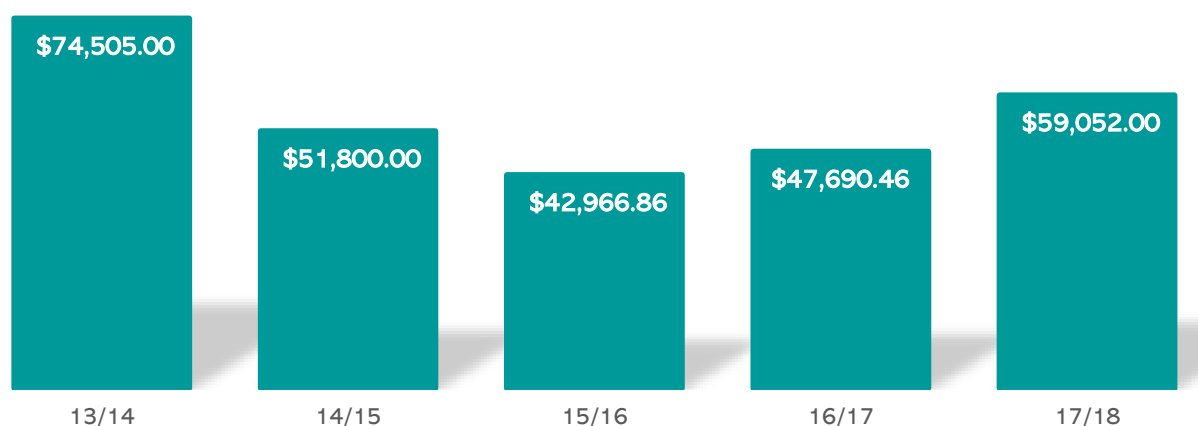
QFES/SUSTAINABILITY FUNDING

Queensland Fire and Emergency Service (QFES) Department provides annual funding to our clubs through the SLSQ/QFES Sustainability Funding Program. Point Danger Branch clubs are proactive in applying for this funding to support their active patrols and volunteers.

PATROL CLUB OF THE YEAR

The Point Danger Branch Patrol Club of the Year (in its current format) in its 12th season. There have been some changes made along the way in consultation with the Board of Life Saving or through recommendation by the clubs.

In the latter part of season 2017/2018 it was identified that the position of Club Supervisor was not being utilised to its full potential. The Club Supervisor position is a traditional position and is not as relevant as in previous years. Their main role at present is patrol inspections.

As such a by-law change has been implemented and Club Supervisors have been removed and replaced with a Patrol Inspection Committee. This will include the Director of Life Saving, Deputy Director of Life Saving and a committee of six (6) members including current Assessors, former Assessors (who are still Bronze proficient) and Club Captains.

The scoring of the Patrol Club of the Year includes

- φ Patrol and First Aid Room Inspections
- φ Ontime submission of Patrol Logs & Statistics
- φ Attendance at Board of Life Saving meetings
- φ Recognition of members through the annual awards.
- φ Participation in Surf Rescue Championships

These items as listed showcase the strength of the clubs through operational, administrative and participative areas.

This award would not be possible without the generous support of State Member for Currumbin – Jann Stuckey MP.

PATROL HOURS

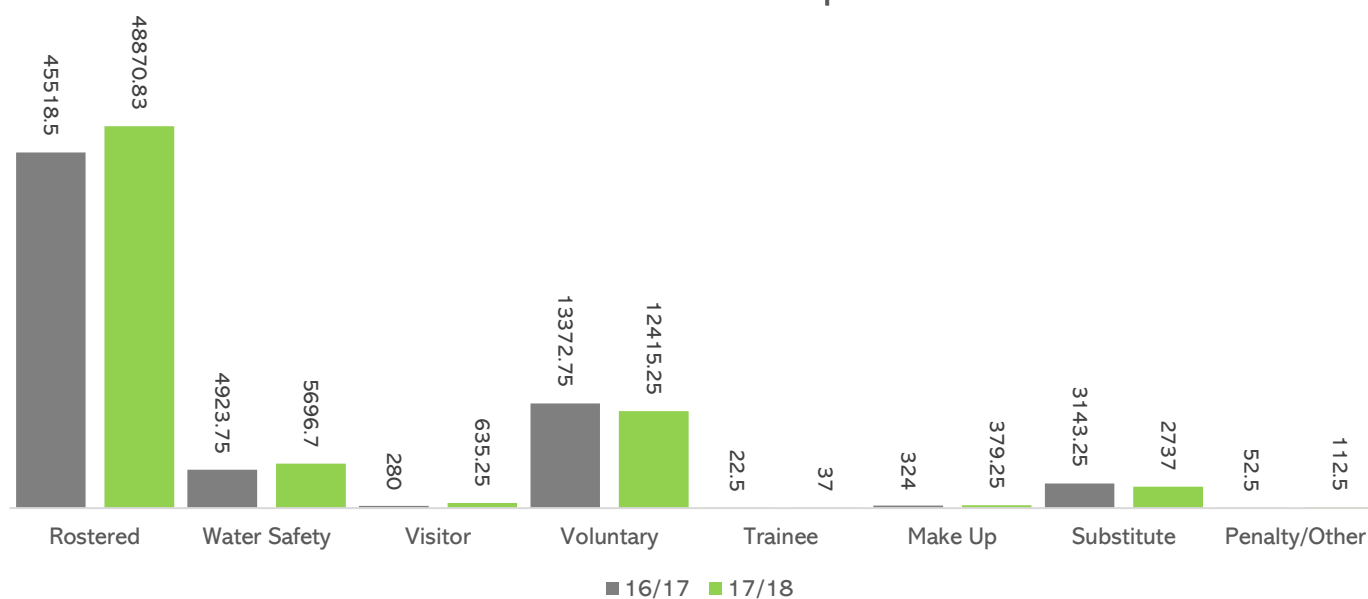
Clubs have recorded an increase in patrol hours this season compared to season 2016/2017 – overall an increase of 2108.53 hours (excluding Operations Support hours).

TRAINING & EDUCATION

Surf Life Saving training and education courses are designed to build practical and professional skills for members to compliment and support their pursuits to keep the beaches and bathing public safe.

The Branch continues to run a full calendar of courses to ensure the members have opportunities to enhance their skills. In season 2017/2018 the calendar included

- φ 6 First Aid Courses
- φ 6 Advanced Resuscitation Techniques (ART) Courses
- φ 6 Beach Management Courses
- φ 5 ART upgrade courses
- φ 3 Observers Courses
- φ 3 Marine Licence Courses

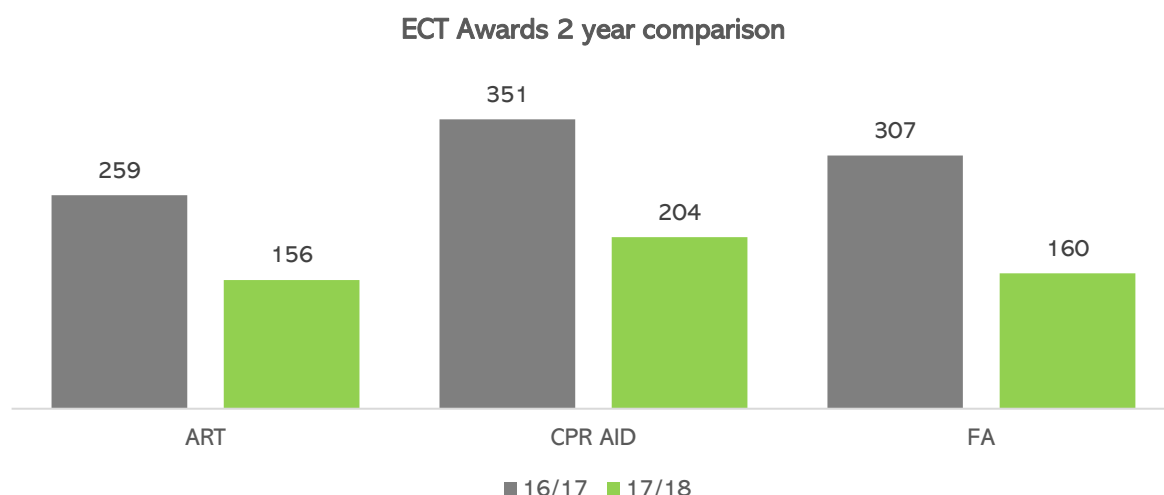
This season there was also extensive Trainer and Assessor Workshops held – 5 for assessors (in conjunction with SLSQ) and 3 for Trainers.

In season 2016/2017 Point Danger Branch experienced a large increase in awards (46.65% overall). As such it was expected that there most likely would be a decrease in awards gained in season 2017/2018, and coupled with a decrease in membership, this occurred. In season 2017/2018 – 1658 senior lifesaving awards were gained in total (compared to 2813 in 2016/2017).

EMERGENCY CARE AWARDS

In season 2017/2018 the Branch continued to offer a large number of Emergency Care Courses (ART, First Aid and CPR) for our members. In conjunction with the Australia Life Saving Academy Queensland – these courses which are nationally recognised and are offered free of charge to our members.

Overall the Branch has experienced a 43.47 % decrease in Emergency Care awards gained. In total 520 have been gained by the members in season 2017/2018. The highest number of awards were gained in the second quarter of the award season (August – October).



VEHICLE AWARDS

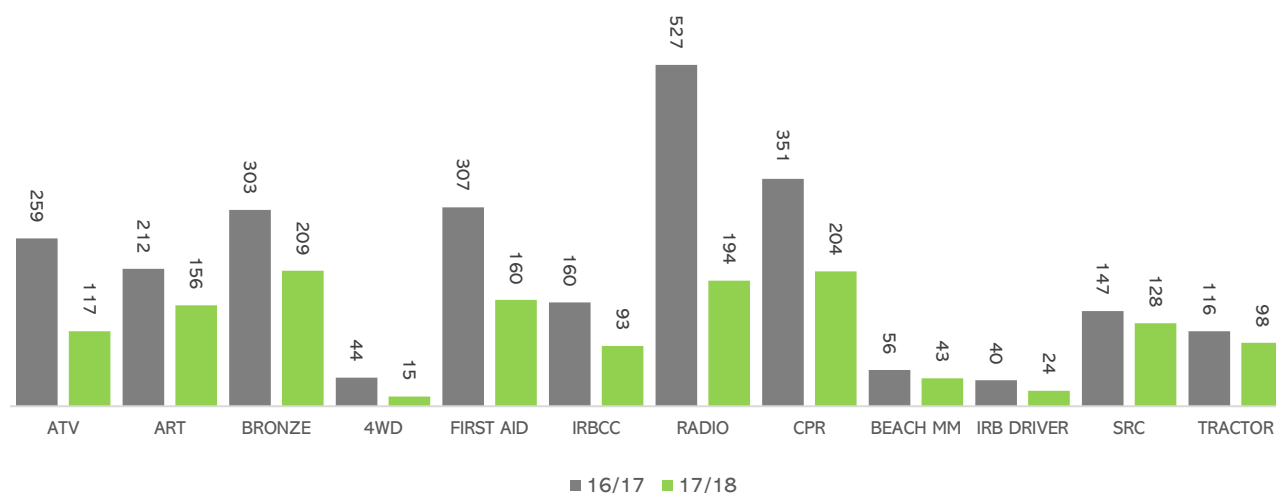
In season 2016/2017 there was a large focus on vehicle inductions in line with the patrol gap calculator – in total 371 awards were gained. Again, in season 2017/2018 vehicle inductions were identified as a needed award for patrolling members. In total 230 awards were gained in season 2017/2018 – a decrease of 38.01% on season 2016/2017 (-142 awards in total). A number of clubs are adding this to the learning outcomes with the Bronze Medallion and members are gaining this award directly after becoming patrolling members.

OPERATIONAL AWARDS

We continue to focus on twelve operational awards (including vehicle and ECT awards) – these are reported on monthly, quarterly and annually. For the purposes of operational patrols, we focus on six awards – Bronze Medallion, Surf Rescue Certificate, Radio Operators, IRB Crewman, IRB Drivers and Beach Management (Patrol Captains award). Overall, we have experienced a significant decrease in operational awards of 44.05%.

COURSES

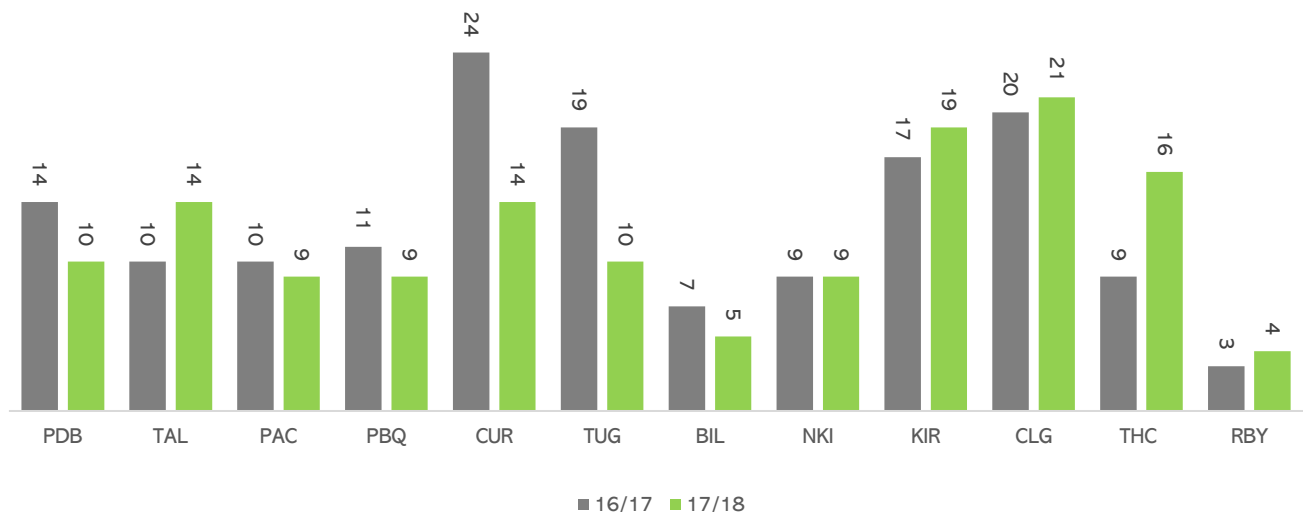
The Branch tracks all operational lifesaving award courses run by the clubs each season via the PDB RTO Database (excluding ECT courses). This record includes the noting of any errors or omissions that occur (in line with PDB Policy #2 -TAF Error Register). In season 2017/2018 140 courses and 30 upgrades were run between the clubs and Branch (a decrease of 13 courses on season 2016/2017).

The error rate for season 2017/2018 was 4.12%. This is a decrease of 3.74% on season 2016/2017. It is pleasing to note that the errors in relation to paperwork have decreased. The support provided to the clubs – including paperwork packs and pre-assessment emails/checklists seem to be assisting the clubs in the compliance relative to the requirements of the RTO.

Certificate 2/Bronze Medallion was the most popular course held making up 32.85% of total courses held – the least popular was 4WD Induction (2.14%) – noting that not all clubs own a 4WD.

Coolangatta ran the highest number of courses (21) and TH&C ran the highest number of upgrades (7). The lowest number of courses was held at Rainbow Bay SLSC (4).

CLUB AWARDS

Each club has shown a decrease in operational awards gained this season (compared to last season whereby 10 clubs posted an increase).

It would be expected that in season 2018/2019 the number of awards gained will show an increase again in line with new members joining. It is noted that active membership did increase (even with a decrease in membership) which means that existing members are transitioning into active members.

The largest decrease in awards gained was posted by Currumbin SLSC (-66.03%).



TRAINERS AND ASSESSORS

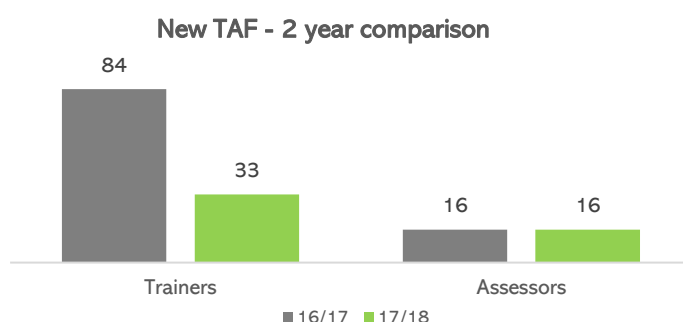
This season saw some changes to the annual Trainer, Assessor and Facilitator (TAF) proficiency. SLSQ oversaw the proficiencies for the Assessors this season and any member who was not current in the necessary units of competency and the lifesaving award was not deemed competent as an assessor. The Branch was able to run Trainer's proficiencies as per normal procedure.

The SLSQ IRB Panel opted to run separate proficiency days for the IRB Trainers and Assessors. This did put additional pressure on already time poor members however the feedback was largely positive. This ensures our clubs have current Trainers and Assessors.

In season 2018/2019 – the Branch and SLSQ will be working together to run the TAF proficiency days – one of which will include an upgrade for the Certificate 4 (Workplace, Training & Assessment) holders.

In the past it has been up to the Branch to track and process Trainer and Assessor awards, however due to the RTO status of SLSQ, this is now a task that SLSQ will oversee. Point Danger Branch has been vocal in ensuring that as a Branch we are able to contribute to this process.

PDB SENIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

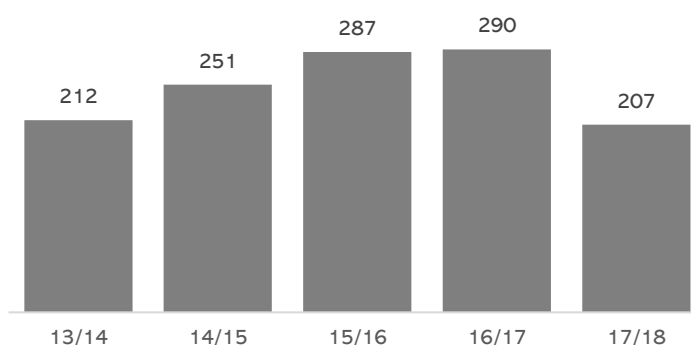

PDB Senior Champs Entrys



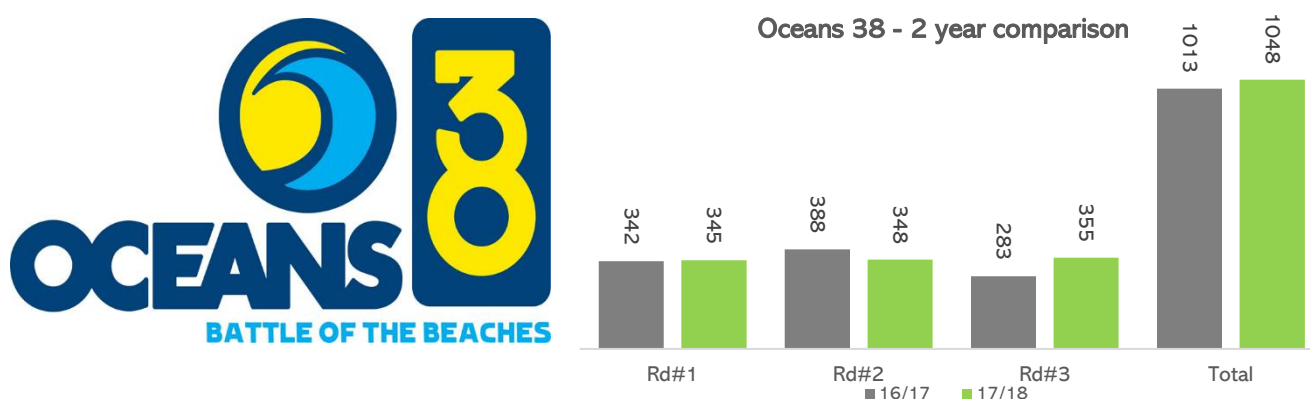
OCEANS 38 PREMIERSHIP SERIES

The event is one of the few open events on the calendar for clubs to patronise and as a result the entries to this event have increased slightly this season. Overall there has been a 3.45% increase in participation from 2016/2017. The one-day format that was introduced in 2016/2017 has proven to be popular amongst clubs

Under 15 competitors made up 40.74% of the total competitors throughout the season.

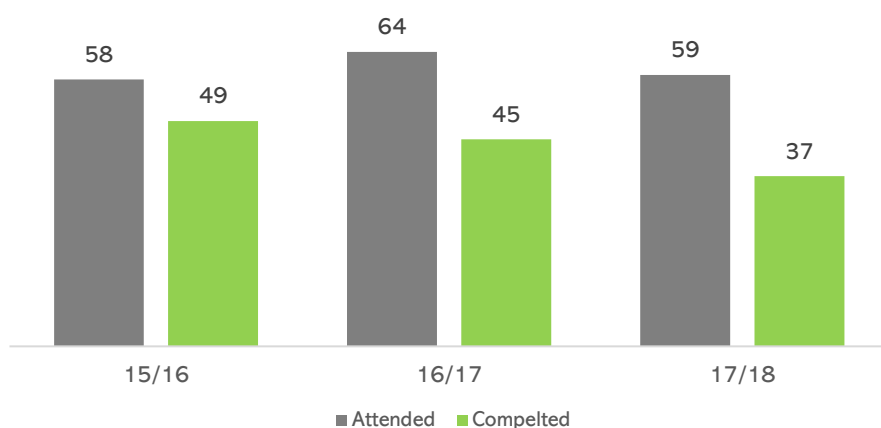
SURF SPORTS OFFICIALS

There has been a significant change to officials' courses in season 2017/2018 with the introduction of online learning options. This has significantly cut down on the required face to face time for members. There has also been a change to the name of the Officials. Level 0 is known as Core Official, Level One is a Technical Official and Level Two is a Senior Official.

JUNIOR ACTIVITIES

This year marks a significant milestone in Junior Activities – with the celebration of 50 Years of Nippers. Point Danger Branch was instrumental in the induction of nippers into surf lifesaving.

The Nipper Program exists to educate and develop children in an ocean environment. Our main focus is play, participation and fun. Participants learn about what makes up beach conditions, sun safety, surf awareness, surf skills and recognition of people in an emergency situation. Nippers are an integral part of the viability of clubs.

MEMBERSHIP

Nipper Membership has shown a slight decrease – finishing the season with 1938 nippers which is a 3.24% decrease on 2016/2017.

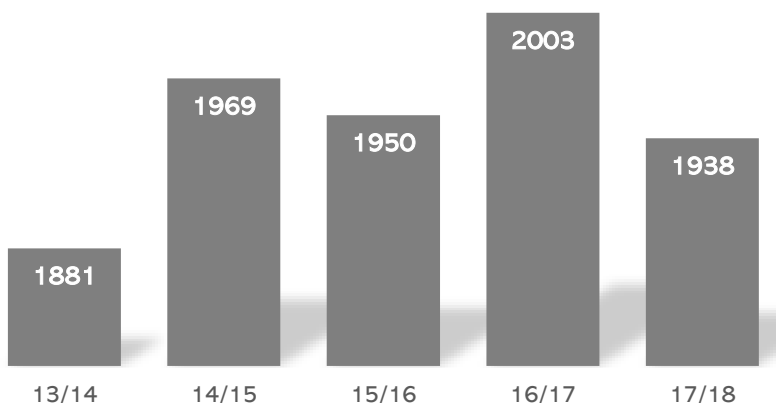

NIPPERS

HOW IT ALL BEGAN

The foundation meeting to form the Nipper Association was held on 26th August 1967 at Kirra SLSC. Point Danger Branch President Mal McNeilly MBE presided over the meeting, which was attended by representatives from Coolangatta SLSC, Palm Beach SLSC, Tugun SLSC, Currumbin SLSC, TH&C SLSC and Point Danger Branch.

It was decided, after much discussion that the Branch form a “little nippers association”. Andy Frizzell OBE OAM from Palm Beach SLSC was elected the first President of the Point Danger Branch Nipper Association.

Palm Beach SLSC, Pacific SLSC, Currumbin SLSC, Tugun SLSC and TH&C SLSC were the founding clubs with approximately 150 members in 67/68 season. The following year Kirra SLSC & Bilinga SLSC joined nippers.

1968 saw the formation of the Queensland Nipper Association when their inaugural AGM held in August 1968 at BHMP SLSC. The same season the first State Nipper Titles was held at the same beach on 03RD March 1969.

JUNIOR EDUCATION

Nipper Education is a fundamental part of the nipper program – each age group has specific learning outcomes that they must complete. This offers an educational pathway for the littlest members on their way to becoming active life savers.

In total 1664 Nipper Age Awards were gained (-101 awards on season 2016/2017). The Under 14 nippers are required to gain the Surf Rescue Certificate as a pathway to participate in patrols. In season 2017/2018 – 108 Under 14 Nippers gained the Surf Rescue Certificate (-16 on season 2016/2017).

AGE MANAGERS

Age Managers use their experience and enthusiasm for junior activities to mentor Nippers and facilitate fun learning programs that encourage and develop young surf life savers. Their goal is to enrich the lives of Nippers through the delivery of surf lifesaving knowledge and skills in a fun and safe aquatic environment.

Through the introduction of the PDB Junior Committee Review in 2015/2016 we have been able to assist clubs in monitoring their new age managers progress throughout the season to ensure that they can be signed off for this award.

In season 2017/2018 - 75 members gained their Age Managers Award (+24 on season 2016/2017). There are now 355 members who hold this award in total

JUNIOR ACTIVITY ACCREDITATION OFFICER (JAAO)

The Junior Activity Accreditation Officer role continues to be an important role within nippers and assists in taking pressures from the club Assessors in determining the competence of the nippers in both their evaluations and awards.

At the commencement of each season the Branch liaises with the clubs to determine which existing members wish to remain proficient in this award and which members the club have identified as wishing to gain this award. All members are checked for the necessary prerequisites and processed.

Eleven (11) members gained this award in 2017/2018 (-1 on season 2016/2017) which brings the total of members who hold this award to 61.

JUNIOR SURF SPORTS

Our clubs continue to develop the nippers in the surf sports arena – skills lessons are included in their weekly nipper days and clubs also have additional surf sports training days for their members mid week to assist in enhancing their skills and fitness.

Sport is important to allow members to have fun with their friends, to experience a challenge, personal achievement and personal responsibility. It also allows members to improve their skills and work within a team environment.

Point Danger Branch continues to run a number of surf sports events per season to cater for all of the nipper age groups. The events held within Point Danger Branch during season 2017/2018 are as follows

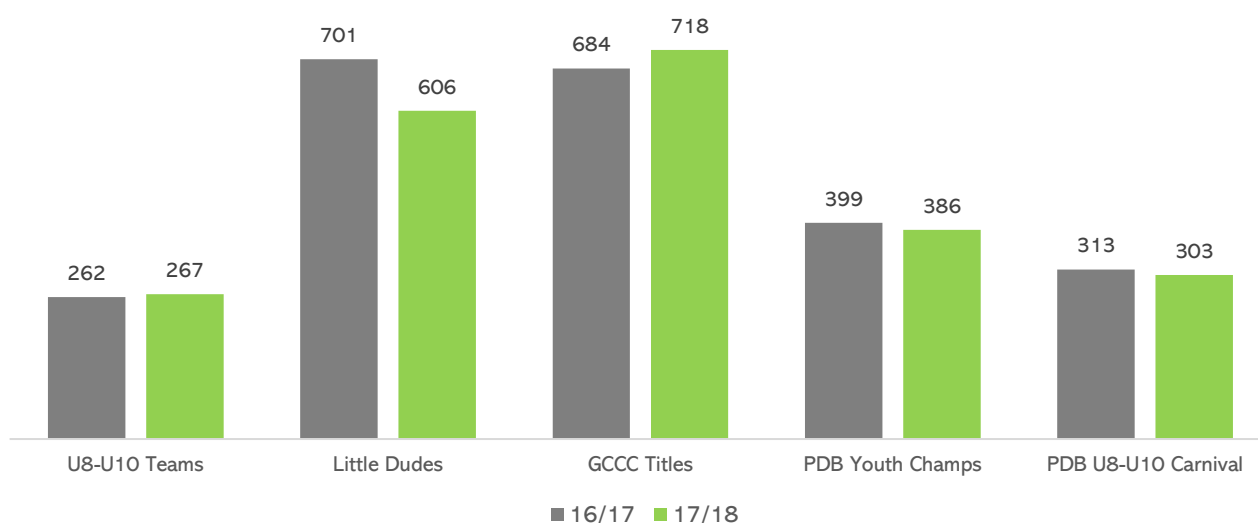

Participation has remained consistent with two of the five events experiencing increases in entries. An increase has been experienced at the PDB U8-U10 Teams of 1.91% and the GCCC Youth Titles of 8.85%. Other events have experienced a decrease including Little Dudes (-13.55%), PDB Youth Championships (-3.25%) and PDB U8-U10 Carnival (-3.19%).

With ever increasing clashes with other sports and a full calendar – fluctuations in entry numbers are expected. This has been coupled with a decrease in membership and a push for clubs to be more prudent in who they enter.

CLUB REPORTS - TALLEBUDGERA SLSC

Tallebudgera's patrolling groups were kept very busy once again during the 2017/2018 season, and are to be congratulated for all their hard work and dedication to keep Tallebudgera beach fatality free.

It was a busy year with club house renovations commencing. The renovations were made a little more difficult, trying to program construction around the Commonwealth Games, training, and patrols.



This season the boat section grew in number's welcoming new members to the Club. The open Male and U23 Female team's won the QLD Championships. The Open Female team took out 3rd place at the QLD Championships. Tallebudgera managed to send a considerable sized team to Perth to compete at Aussie's.

The Chief Training Officer this season was assisted by new training officers. One of the new probationary trainers successfully conducted an IRB course and the club now has 9 more qualified crew members to assist patrols.

This year the club was successful in obtaining a grant of \$15,000 from the Gambling Community Fund and will be taking delivery of a new Thundercat IRB in early July. The Club also secured \$7500 from the Get Going Clubs Grant to help purchase a second-hand Surf Boat. A new Yamaha ATV was purchased funded mostly by the Supporters Club and an amount from the Beach Safety Equipment Grant.

Tallebudgera SLSC was well represented at the Commonwealth Games festivities. Tallebudgera SLSC had a member in the Queens Baton Relay, an IRB and crew that helped escort the baton to Surfers Paradise beach and a number of Nippers and Parents escorting various country teams into the Stadium during the Opening Ceremony. It was a very proud moment for Tallebudgera SLSC.

The Tallebudgera SLSC Management Committee worked well throughout the season, meeting all tasks and challenges. Without these dedicated volunteers the club would not be as successful. The club is ever grateful for the support it receives from the Supporters Club Committee. Thanks to the Junior Activities Chairperson and committee who have worked hard throughout the year to provide a well-run program.

Thanks to club sponsors for their support once again, without whose help it would be impossible to run the Nipper's and Surf Sports sections and provide vital equipment for the lifesavers. The continued support from local Politicians - Councilor Daphne MacDonald, Karen Andrews MP and Michael Hart MP is necessary for the club to be a success. Thank you for your support.

Finally, thanks to the staff of Point Danger Branch for your guidance and help throughout the year.

CLUB REPORTS - PACIFIC SLSC

Season 2017/2018 marked Pacific's 71st season and again through a strong and dedicated management team, the club continues to set new benchmarks whilst still maintaining family-oriented values and culture.

Member recognition forms a major part of Pacific's Strategic Plan and values. During the off season the club received six awards at the Point Danger Annual Awards, including Youth Development Club and Club of the Year, U18-25 and U18 Life Saver of the Year, Presidents Award and U13 Female Champion Competitor. For the 5th year in a row the club picked up a major award at the SLSQ Awards of Excellence - U18-25 Life Saver of the Year.



Pacific's Management Team is one that continues delivering on goals based on the 5-year strategic plan, focusing on connecting with members and community, sustainable growth, governance, and maximising the recognition of the club and members achievements to continue to deliver great outcomes in all facets of surf lifesaving.

The members are and will always be the most valuable resource of any club, and at Pacific it's no secret that the members are very dedicated to achieving club goals. This season active members increased from 103 to 119 a 15.53% increase and completed 6586 hours of patrol. Overall membership saw a 10.5% increase from 332 to 367 in line with the strategic plan and KPI's.

Through great leadership of the Club Captain and Chief Training Officer, Pacific SLSC continues to set high standards with beach patrols. This season the active members completed 6 rescues, 61 preventative actions, 99 first aid treatments and 141 operational awards.

Pacific's financial position is healthy and can be attributed to donations and sponsorship, totalling \$118252.00, but the ongoing strong fiscal management of the club and its resources. The Finance Committee has been active in generating successful grants and sponsorship for vital equipment and club renovations, including an ATV, IRB, rescue & nipper boards, tents, nipper equipment, air-conditioning for the function room, TV for training room, radios and patrol uniforms. The Pacific Board and its members are extremely grateful to all levels of government and those businesses and individuals that have contributed.

Continued development of the nippers has provided a valuable impetus in creating an environment that has increased the number of young lifesavers coming from this valuable nursery, and an increase 11.8% in nipper numbers from 131 to 142 as well as another successful year in surf sports.

Youth development is part of Pacific's DNA and very important in the Clubs ongoing sustainability and success. This season the Club sent members to Gold Coast and SLSQ Camps, as well as having 5 participate in the successful PDB Team X-Treme Branch program. Pacific again took a contingent of members to the Gold Coast Youth Ball - 4 members completed the Bronze YIP award and 1 Silver YIP award.

Club results in surf sports just go from strength to strength, and again Pacific continues to bat above its weight at most carnivals, as well as record participation at all levels including branch and state.

Pacific continues to be a club that embraces diversity with this season seeing the club becoming part of the Gold Coast City Council beach Wheel Chair Access Program.

To our office manager Gabrielle Kennelly, Kerrie Barnes and her team at Point Danger Branch - a big thank you for all their support, help, and guidance through-out yet another busy season. This is certainly appreciated and a vital cog in Pacific's ongoing success.

CLUB REPORTS - PALM BEACH SLSC

Palm Beach Surf Life Saving Club has enjoyed another successful season, and this is a credit to the dedicated Management Committee and members. The club has worked hard at maintaining the “One Club” approach and this has been evident in the progress and results that Palm Beach SLSC has achieved this year. In season 2016/2017 the club created a five-year Strategic Plan and this season the club increased the focus on the Club Mission. “To Protect, Educate and Develop our Members and the Community “.

The newly created Revenue Committee with members represented from all areas of the club, (Nippers, Seniors, Masters, Surf Boats and IRBs) have done a tremendous job in generating income from sponsorship, grants, and fundraising. This brought the club more engagement with the local community on many levels.

The renovation of the Palm Beach SLSC Clubhouse facilities has commenced. This project has been possible with a \$100,000.00 grant from Queensland Sport and Recreation and some serious fundraising from the committee and members.

Palm Beach SLSC has finished the year with a 17.52% increase to overall membership which includes an increase again in Active Seniors (4%). This ensured that there were more active lifesavers on the beach and a safer public; once again achieving zero preventable deaths on the beach. The active members performed 7 rescues, 117 first aid treatments, 122 preventative actions and warned 2691 people.

Junior Activities at Palm Beach continues to prosper with the club posting 19.54% increase in nipper numbers. This is due to the hard work and dedication of a committed Junior Activities Chairperson and Committee.

Surf Sports at Palm Beach SLSC continues to grow with another great season in competition. The Club has experienced record participation numbers from Nippers through to Masters. Medals were won at Queensland and Australian Championships in Youth, Master's and Surf Boats. Palm Beach SLSC is also competing in IRB Racing for the first time in 20 years.

Palm Beach would like to thank the Branch for all their support during the season, they have been exceptional in their assistance to us. The club would also like to acknowledge the support that our fellow clubs within the Branch give to each other. It is truly inspiring.



CLUB REPORTS - CURRUMBIN SLSC

The 2017/2018 season will always go down in history as one of incredible highs and devastating lows. Currumbin SLSC, as always, is immensely proud of the way that the members handled both.

This was another very successful patrolling season for the Club. No lives were lost on Currumbin beach thanks to the dedication of 274 patrol members who collectively volunteered to provide 6,973.50 patrol hours in order to keep the community safe. It is always exciting to see a new wave of patrolling members coming through and this season the club trained 53 new Bronze Medallion/SRC Award holders to become qualified.



It was a competitive year to celebrate. Currumbin SLSC achieved amazing things across every section of the competitive space. The Pool Rescue team were crowned Australian Champions after a dedicated performance in Adelaide. The Australian Championships held in Perth saw a modest but talented team achieve fantastic results, including the Male Open Taplin winning after a hiatus of some 40 years.

Currumbin Nippers took out the Queensland Youth Championships for the first time since the mid-90s. The Club thanks the Junior Chairperson and Committee for producing such a talented and invested group of kids. The Committee has made winning fun. If culture is a commodity, Currumbin SLSC have it in spades.

Financially, Currumbin SLSC and Supporters Association had a very challenging year. By no means is the Club anything but financially secure. However, the Club did see a consistent trend across the year of more modest profit margins. It is considered that this is probably a result of some serious competition both from other Surf Clubs, who have invested heavily in renovations, and the proliferation of food and beverage outlets in the surrounding suburbs.

The Supporters club are deep into preparations for a refurbishment of the Club and its facilities, including an IT upgrade. Thanks to the General Manager and team for the way in which they have pressed forward despite ongoing challenges and a facility which has fallen behind the competition. The Club and Supporters Committee are dedicated to providing members with the facility and the tools to allow them to do what they excel at – providing amazing service in a world-class venue.

It is not possible to discuss this season without recognising the devastating losses that Currumbin SLSC experienced. The Club lost members who, for a variety of unique and wonderful reasons, can simply never be replaced. It is with profound sadness that the club records the passing of Tony Vitiello, Annie Owen, John Jeffcoat, Bonnie Alchin, Bob Bray and John Munro. Each of these precious people added something unique and irreplaceable to the experience of being a Viking. They led by providing a daily example of the way to behave and contribute. In their own way, each of these individuals taught the membership how to give more, to take less and to love the Club and each other unconditionally. Please remember them fondly and keep them in your hearts and your minds when it comes time to consider why members dedicate time and spirit to the Club. We stand on the shoulders of those who have gone before us. What lofty standards they have set!

Currumbin SLSC is always grateful for the way in which the CEO, has led the club through a very challenging season. The Club would not be in its current position without the CEO's dedication and love for this Club. The committee provided the CEO with extra challenges this year - now responsible as CEO for both the Surf Club and Supporters Association operations. History will show that the Club could not have navigated these challenging waters without the talent and leadership of the CEO at the helm.

CLUB REPORTS - TUGUN SLSC

Tugun SLSC has had another productive season with a band of willing and conscientious committee members who have assisted in the daily operational activities of the club.

The volunteer patrol members have surpassed themselves in their dedication to the Club and patrols with quite a few travelling from Brisbane to patrol and ensure the general public are safe.

On the competitive season the Club has had some good results. The Club has teams in the boat, water, beach and nipper section who have all represented the Club with pride. A small team attended the Australian Championships in Perth accompanied by volunteer officials.

Tugun SLSC has also hosted a number of events again this season including an ASRL event and Oceans 38. The Tugun SLSC Volunteer workforce for events is a highly effective unit, envied by all other clubs. The workforce have been responsible for the success of carnivals at Tugun SLSC – they are also instrumental in the day to day operations of the Club.

The Tugun SLSC Nippers have enjoyed a successful season under the guidance of a new Junior Activities Chairperson and Committee. The club has healthy numbers in the Nippers and the kids have gained good results at carnivals throughout the season.

CLUB REPORTS - BILINGA SLSC

During the season Bilinga SLSC once again performed a commendable service to the community on and off the beach with limited patrolling members. Gratitude is expressed to the Point Danger Branch Patrol Group and Brisbane Lifesaving who assisted in providing patrols to complement the patrol roster. Without their valued support Bilinga SLSC would have struggled to meet our commitment in providing a presence on the beach.

Over the past season the Club continued the trend with a decrease of 36.23% in operational awards. The overall total membership declined from 256 to 237 (7.4%) and the Nipper population decreased 9.3% (107 to 97). The active members had a slight fall from 42 to 41 members.

The Bilinga SLSC membership is strong in participation and involvement but being the smallest club in the Point Danger Branch and on the Gold Coast the overall growth does not exceed that enthusiasm. It is a concerning issue of declining membership which needs addressing by the club for long-term longevity.



The Club celebrates 80 years in season 2018/2019. In February 1938 at the Committee Room of the Railway Institute a General Meeting was held and the club was formed and was known as the Bilinga Railways Surf Club with Mr Les Duggan as President. On Saturday 20 October 2018, Bilinga SLSC will hold a function at the club to celebrate the 80th year anniversary.

This season the Club gained funding through various grants which enabled a refurbishment to the male bunkrooms with new floor coverings, painting and additional walls. The outside exterior wall has been fitted with a weather screen and the female bunkrooms have had a screen wall which provides a secure entry and exit from the amenities to

inside the club. The front exterior wall is to be painted to improve the street appeal of the club. It is envisaged that all improvements to the club will provide a more serviceable facility to the membership and visitors.

During the Commonwealth Games Bilinga SLSC received national exposure with the Channel 7 Sunrise Show utilising the upstairs deck for their coverage of the Queens Baton Relay. The club contributed to the Queens Baton Relay by providing an IRB crew which was part of the escort of the Queens Baton out at sea off Broadbeach and Surfers Paradise.

The club extends our appreciation to the Point Danger Branch team who have provided support to the club during the season. In addition, thanks to neighbouring clubs – Tugun SLSC and North Kirra SLSC for assistance during the season of 2017/2018.

Such comradery between clubs is highly respected and North Kirra couldn't have covered patrol requirements without this additional assistance.

In the Surf Sports arena, North Kirra SLSC is very proud to have won the overall pointscore for the Point Danger Branch Surf Rescue Championships in January. Whilst this is a smaller carnival, the members did a wonderful job displaying the skills they have achieved and to beat every other Club in the Branch is quite an achievement for North Kirra SLSC. There were also some strong results in the junior ranks in their carnivals throughout the season and the seniors had the chance to show what they were made of at their Club Championships held again this season after a break last season.

This year the Club saw the introduction of a Handicap Surf Swim in honour of one of Life Member - Bumper Kermond. It was great to see the interest from the club members along with the weekly banter, fun and friendship that prevailed.



The season ahead will no doubt be a busy and challenging time again. The Committee is focused on membership growth to increase patrolling member numbers and ease the burden on a few, heavily committed patrolling members. With a continued strong nipper program, the introduction of an extensive cadet program and further courses and training for our patrolling members, North Kirra will begin to reap the rewards.

A final thankyou must go to Kerrie Barnes and all at Point Danger Branch for their dedication and assistance throughout the season, and once again the Committee would like to recognise the significant contribution made by club members in all facets of North Kirra's operations.

CLUB REPORTS - COOLANGATTA SLSC _____

Coolangatta SLSC can proudly boast again that there were no lives lost on Coolangatta beach throughout the 2017/2018 patrolling season. The dedicated Lifesavers put in a massive 6,785 hours patrolling Coolangatta beach. In total the active members performed 5 rescues, 64 preventative actions, 278 First Aid Treatments and warned 2,128 people about possible dangers that helped to keep the beach safe. When you take into account that there were 29,682 visitors to Coolangatta SLSC - these figures are very impressive.

At the conclusion of the formal cap presentations, the gathered members and guests remembered the Fallen Lifesavers and family members who had passed away this season. A large number of Coolangatta SLSC members dressed fully in their patrol uniforms along with the distinguished guests stood in line at the water's edge and watched on as IRB's and the Westpac Lifesaver Helicopter placed wreaths at sea. This event was broadcast on all local TV channels and has certainly given Coolangatta SLSC a lot of fantastic, positive publicity.

Coolangatta's Chief Training Officer has again achieved some great results for the club – training new and existing members in essential lifesaving skills - with 25 ART, 17 ATV, 25 Bronze, 34 First Aid, 31 Radio, 34 CPR, 5 Beach Management, 35 Tractor, 8 SRC, 20 IRBC and 7 IRB awards completed.

Overall the Supporters Club is running very well under the guidance of a new Manager. Unfortunately having the Commonwealth Games Volley Ball Stadium next door to the club did not help trading figures, with numbers drastically down from previous years.

Finally, thanks to Point Danger Branch officers and staff, Manager Kerrie Barnes and President Ken Hunter for all your help and assistance throughout the year.

Currently the club has \$50,000.00 worth of grants applications lodged and are waiting on an outcome.

The Building Committee have been busy behind the scenes trying to acquire the land at the back of the club for storage.

This is an ongoing project and the club is hopeful for a positive outcome. The club is grateful to the "Old Boys" for their commitment to fundraising and support of the Club in general.

TH&C SLSC has experienced a very successful season in Surf Sports competing in events such as Boardriding, Champion Lifesaver, R&R, Pool Rescue, Belt Races, Surf Boats as well as normal carnival events. The club has a dedicated team of Officials, Team Managers and Coaches who all assist in the surf sports competition and the club is thankful for their dedication.

The club had members chosen in various representative teams. Sol Sheining-Cruz and Tarkyn Boucher were members of the Point Danger Branch Team. Leah Jones and Lisa Ferguson representing Victoria, Mariah Jones was chosen as an Australian Representative at the World Games in Poland, the New Zealand National Pool Rescue Titles, the German Cup and the Orange Cup in Holland. Mariah has recently been named in the Australian Lifesaving Team to compete at the World Titles in Adelaide

The Supporters Club Committee have provided continual support of the Surf Club through the provision of patrol food, raffle prizes, maintenance around the Club and loan repayments. The club is in a good position for the future.

Lastly, the club would like to thank Kerrie Barnes and Point Danger Branch for all their help in so many areas.

The Chief Training Officer does an exceptional role in training the new SRC and Bronze members ensuring that the patrols have new members to patrol the beach.

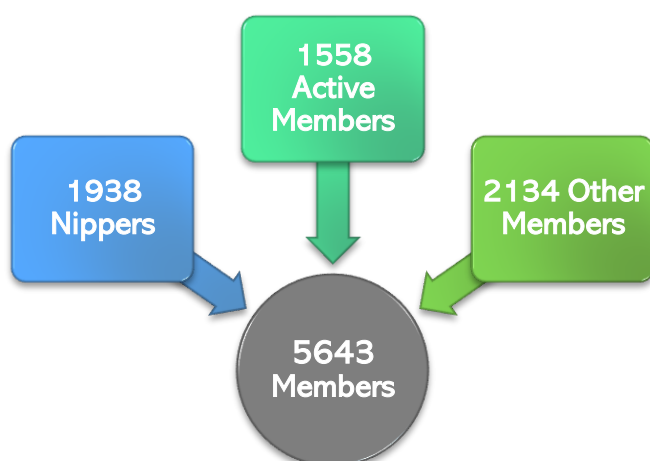
The Treasurer and Junior Activities Chairperson will be standing down after long terms in office – the club is appreciative of their efforts in their respective roles.

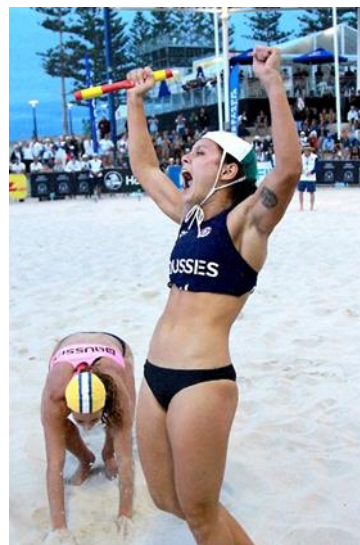

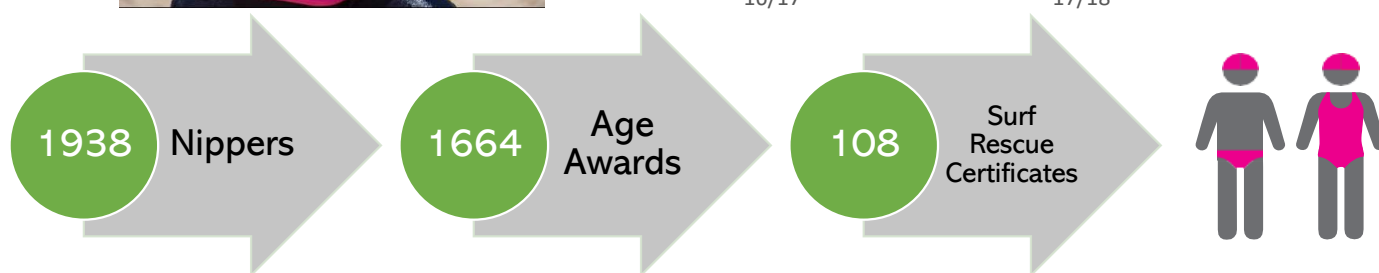
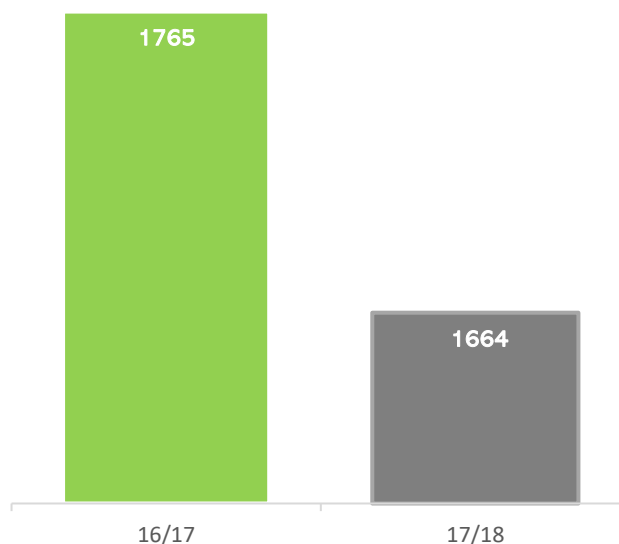

Junior Awards 2 Year comparison

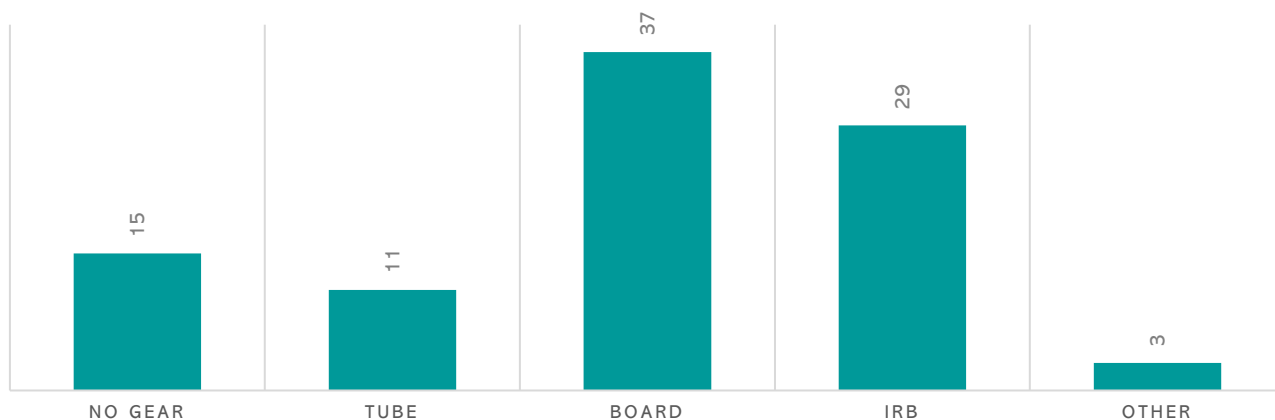

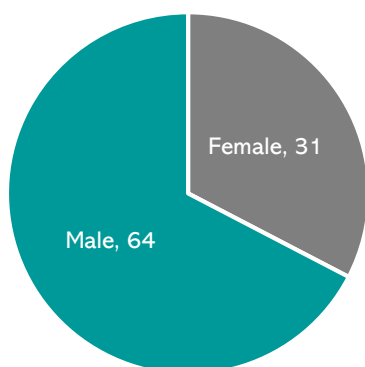

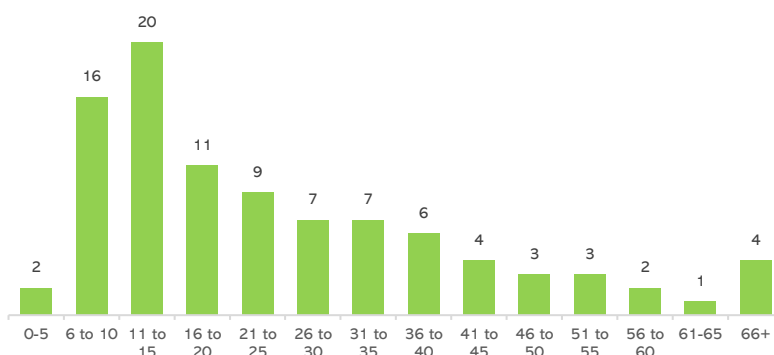
RESCUES PER EQUIPMENT



Rescues - Gender Comparison



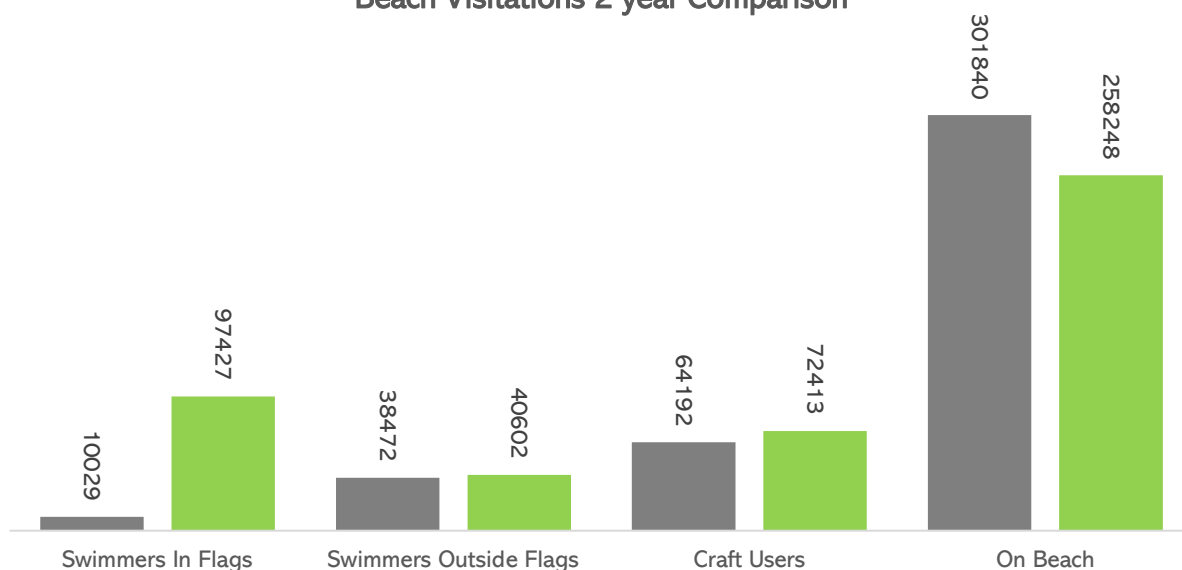
Rescues - Age Group

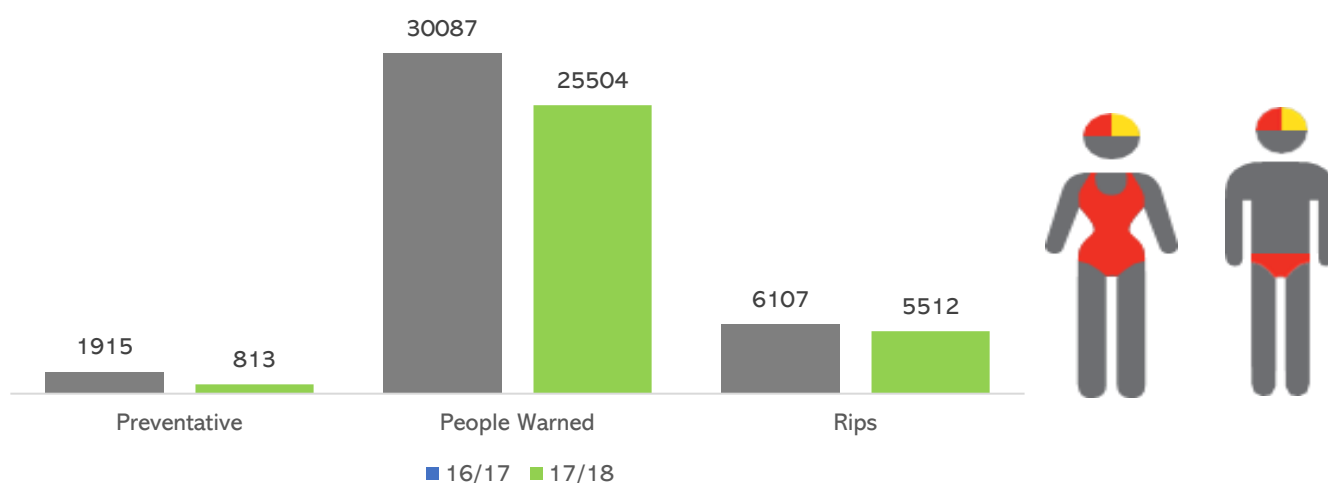
Beach Visitations 2 year Comparison

Notes to the Financial Statements

Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The Management Committee prepared the financial statements of the club on the basis that the club is a non-reporting entity because there are no users dependant on general purpose financial statements. The financial statements are therefore special purpose financial statements that have been prepared in order to meet the requirements of the constitution, the information needs of the stakeholders and for the basis of preparation of the income tax return.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the significant accounting policies disclosed below, which the Management Committee determined are appropriate to meet the purposes of preparation. Such accounting policies are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs unless otherwise stated in the notes. The accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of the statements are as follows:

(a) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Property, Plant and Equipment are carried at cost or at independent or Management Committee valuation. All assets, excluding freehold land and buildings are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the club. Increases in the carrying amount arising on revaluation of land and buildings are credited to a revaluation reserve in members' equity. Decreases that offset previous increases of the same asset are charged against fair value reserves directly in equity; all other decreases are charged to the income statement. Each year the difference between depreciation based on the revalued carrying amount of the assets charged to the income statement and depreciation based on the asset's original cost is transferred from the revaluation reserve to retained earnings. The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the Management Committee to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the asset's employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted in determining recoverable amounts.

(b) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities on the balance sheet.

(c) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which, for floating rate financial assets, is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Revenue recognised related to the provision of services is determined with reference to the stage of completion of the transaction at the reporting date and where outcome of the contract can be estimated reliably. Stage of completion is determined with reference to the services performed to date as a percentage of total anticipated services to be performed. Where the outcome cannot be estimated reliably, revenue is recognised only to the extent that related expenditure is recoverable.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(d) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Tax Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the balance sheet are shown inclusive of GST.

(e) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the liability for employee entitlements arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related costs.


