In my opinion the two most important indicators of our success in season 2018/2019 go hand in hand, firstly the growth in active membership and secondly and more importantly, this season the active members completed 108 rescues which is an outstanding achievement. The Branch's Vision and core responsibility is the maintenance of the safety and security of our beaches for our members and visitors alike and once again this season we have truly delivered on that vision.

Point Danger Branch has an extensive and proud history of not only achieving results, but also in being innovative and working proactively to improve the delivery of life saving and club services in both our Branch and other regions. To this end many of our members also represent our Branch, our clubs and members on State Committees and Panels, this cooperative approach has led to a number of improved outcomes for both clubs and members throughout the season and we look forward to continuing this collegial approach into the future.

This annual report showcases our recent accomplishments, however it is almost impossible to convey the amount of time and effort undertaken by our Clubs and their members in delivering such valuable service to our community, so to you all, many thanks for your commitment and dedication, as it is your hard work and selflessness that helps to maintain the iconic status of the Surf Life Saving movement in Australia.

Thank you also to the Branch office bearers for your support and assistance throughout the year, thanks also to Kerrie Barnes and our other staff members, Carole, Rachael, Gabby and Claudia for keeping us all in line and maintaining Branch administration services and carnival support all of which are integral to the success of our Clubs.

As always, were it not for the continued assistance and generosity of our Patrons, Sponsors and Donors, Point Danger Branch's continued success would be significantly more difficult, thank you for your backing in helping Point Danger Branch fulfil our mission.



SIGNIFICANT ACHIEVEMENTS

Office Renovations

The Branch was fortunate to receive \$24385.00 in funding from the Gambling Community Benefit Fund to renovate the office space. This included sheeting and painting the walls, updating electrical and lowering the ceiling with added storage.

The renovation is the culmination of a 10-year project of updating and renovating the office space. Apart from some aesthetic items to be completed the renovation of the office is complete. Routine maintenance and repairs will continue as required and in line with regular City of Gold Coast inspections.

SLSQ Trainer, Assessor and Facilitator (TAF) Manual

SLSQ Point Danger Branch has been tasked to write the TAF Manual on behalf of SLSQ. This will be based on the same concept as the SLSQ Patrol Operations Manual and will act as a guide for Clubs, Chief Training Officers, Trainers & Assessors. We have carried out stakeholder engagement with the SLSQ Education Panel, SLSQ Admin and IT Committee, Trainers, Assessors and Administrators of the Branch. Chapters will include information on Policies, Award Structure, Junior Education, How to be a Trainer, Assessor or Facilitator. RPL/Credit Transfer and Award Processing Procedures

LIMSOC Training Portal

As reported last season – Point Danger Branch clubs had indicated the need for a LIMSOC Training Portal for new and current members. SLSQ Point Danger Branch took this initiative forward and a LIMSOC training portal was built and is run by PDB. All Branches within Queensland have been provided with their own passwords for the clubs to use this tool to better educate members in patrol statistical reporting.

Support of SLSQ

Child Youth Risk Management Portal: the online induction that Point Danger Branch created three seasons ago continues to be used by all clubs and Branches within SLSQ. Each month we provide SLSQ Membership Services with a whole of state snapshot and also individualised reports to each Branch for their attention.

Sports Participation Statistics: The Branch has been tracking SLSQ Championships statistics for the last five years to show comparisons to our own participation. We have since provided this information to SLSQ for their use and met with staff about future gathering of these statistics and what items need to be considered for the whole of state.

Terms of Reference: SLSQ Point Danger Branch was tasked to write the Terms of Reference documents for a working group for Specials Needs Programs/Use of Beach Wheelchairs. Point Danger Branch has taken this a step further internally and has met with Volunteer Services Australia towards creating programs within the Branch that the clubs can run. Further work will be done on this throughout season 2019/2020.

Workcover Discussion Paper : based on the analysis the Branch has conducted internally, additional research was done relative to the need for change in the current SLSQ Procedures – namely encouraging a Return to Work/Suitable Duties program for members. The Branch considers that a structured and supported Return to Work program should be our obligation and not our option. A discussion paper was provided to SLSQ for their comment and consideration.

Volunteer Services Australia Awards

SLSQ Point Danger Branch was named as a finalist in the Volunteer Services Australia Gold Coast Awards in the Community Organisation of the Year category. Whilst we did not win the category – it was pleasing to be named as one of three finalists of volunteer organisations on the Gold Coast. Further, the Branch was asked to speak at this event about volunteering on the Gold Coast. Our thanks to Ken Clark for doing this on the Branch's behalf.

Youth Handbook

At the commencement of season 2018/2019 the Branch wrote a Youth Handbook for the information of Clubs and Youth Officers. This outlines all of the available programs and activities for the youth members.



Member Injury Report : 20 Years

This season the Branch finalised and presented a 20-year analysis on Workcover Claims within the Branch. This was presented to the Club Presidents for their information and attention. The report showcases the Branch and Club's history with claims over a 20-season period.

In this time period - 285 claims have been lodged through the Branch Office showcasing an average of 14.25 claims per season and 25.91 claims per club. The top activities at the time of injury were IRB Life Saving, Surf Boats, Competition and Patrols.



MANAGEMENT OF FISCAL POLICY

The management of the finances of the Branch continues to present a challenge with ever increasing costs to support the needs of our Clubs and Members coupled with maintaining the Branch building and equipment.

To this end the Branch is always proactive in applying for funding from external sources and running some fundraising initiatives to complement the relatively static income from Government, Council and SLSQ that we receive.

Futuristically, Point Danger Branch will be making changes to the Oceans 38 partnership with South Coast Branch. This will mean that the ownership of the event will sit solely with Point Danger Branch and assist in increasing our annual income.

This season we saw a deficit of \$7510.00 which can be attributed to employee provisions and the write off of fixed assets.

CORPORATE AND OPERATIONAL GOVERNANCE

Club Manual : the Branch is currently researching and writing a Club Manual which will incorporate general information for committees and members in all the areas that need to be considered in running of the Club including but not limited to Finances, Administration, Governance, Education, Operations and government requirements. It is intended that this will be a live document as a reference point for our clubs. There are also plans to have this complimented with an online induction for office bearers.

Grievance/Judiciary Workshop : the Branch ran a workshop relative to Grievance and Judicial procedures. This is one area that continues to cause issues within the Clubs and there is genuine confusion in relation to the procedures relative to both systems. The Branch continues to provide support in this space and will be running further workshops in season 2019/2020

Future Plans : with the bulk of the building renovations completed the Branch will be concentrating its future funding efforts (grants) towards updating IT within the Branch – this will include a revamp of the Branch website, building of a Branch App and online officials sign on program.

Club Workshop : the Branch is planning a Club Workshop at the commencement of season 2019/2020 with a focus on governance (Surf and Supporters clubs), City of Gold Coast compliance, life saving operations, education and insurance/financials.

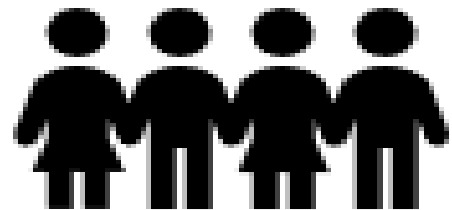

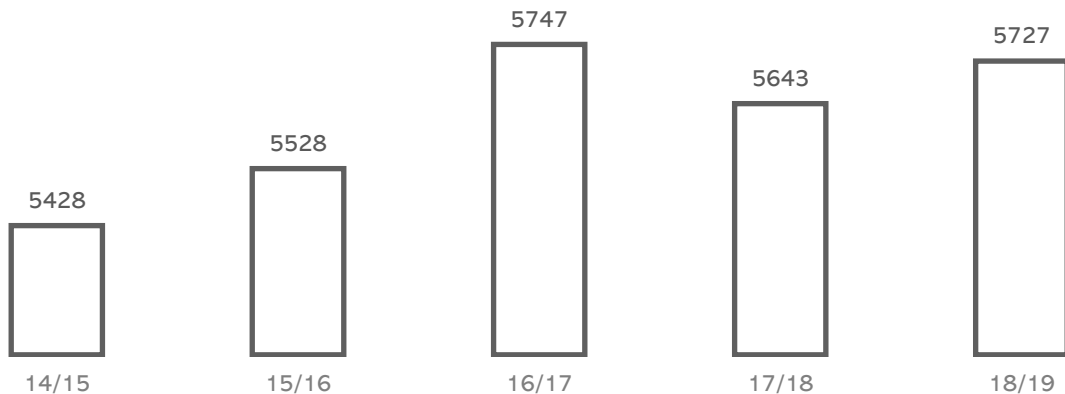

MEMBERSHIP

In season 2017/2018 the Branch experienced a decrease in total membership numbers (after 3 years of growth). This season the membership numbers are again increasing, with a 1.49% increase in total membership (5727 members compared with 5643 in 17/18).

In season 2018/2019 five (5) clubs experienced an increase in total membership (compared to 3 clubs last season).

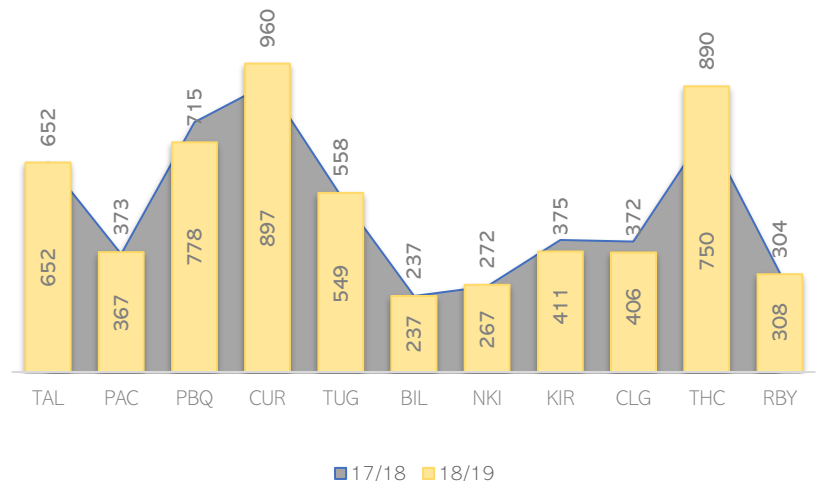
Tweed Heads & Coolangatta SLSC again experienced the highest membership increase of 18.66% (= 140 members) and is the 4th season that the club has posted an increase.

Other clubs with an increase are

- Pacific SLSC (1.63%)
- Currumbin SLSC (+7.02%)
- Tugun SLSC (1.64%)
- North Kirra SLSC (1.87%)

Four clubs experienced a decrease in total membership – Palm Beach SLSC (-8.09%), Kirra SLSC (-8.76%), Rainbow Bay SLSC (-1.23%).

Tallebudgera SLSC and Bilinga SLSC's membership remains static with no change from the previous season.

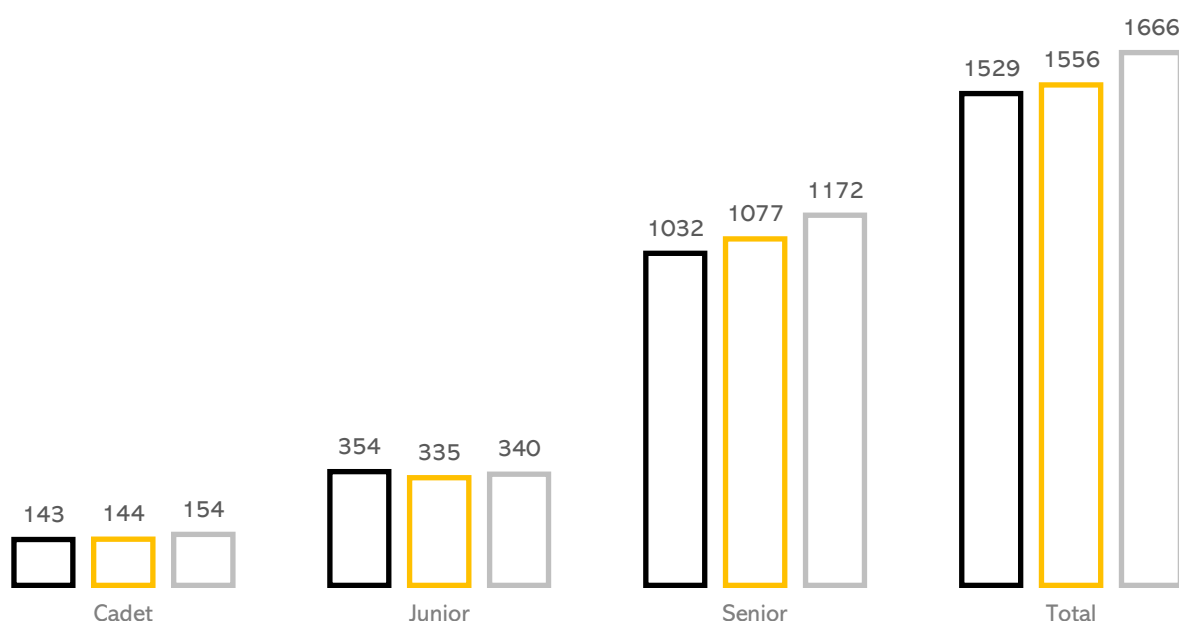
ACTIVE MEMBERSHIP

Active Membership continues to increase and season 2018/2019 saw the 5th consecutive season of growth in the Active Membership categories (Senior, Junior and Cadet). It is pleasing to note that whilst the total membership growth has not been significant – the Clubs are converting exsiting members into active life savers who are patrolling our beaches.

Active Cadets experienced a 6.94% increase, Active Juniors a 1.49% increase and Active Seniors a 8.82% increase. In totality this is a 6.86% increase in Active members on our beaches.

Supporting Categories of Award, Reserve Active and Long Service have also experienced some fluctuations. Both Award and Reserve Active have experienced decreases (0.8% and 10.53% respectively) with Long Service posting an increase of 2.12%

Active Membership Comparison



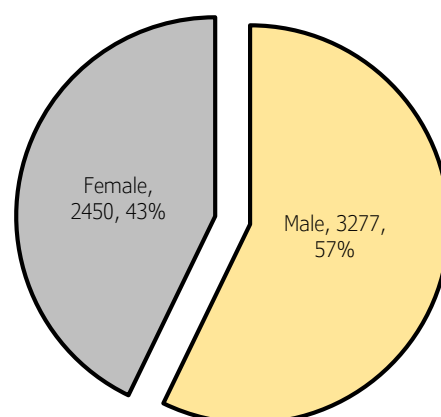
MEMBERSHIP BY GENDER

First Aid

Saving lives is at the core of our club operations. The clubs and members provide an essential service delivery to the community. These critical services are provided to mitigate the exposure of the beach going public to coastal hazards and risk whilst enjoying the beach and its surrounds.

Point Danger Branch clubs have a strong focus on preventative actions and warning people to enable safer participation in water activities. This is reflected in the reported beach statistics from the Clubs throughout the season.

Our clubs and members continue their pursuit towards safer beaches and season 2018/2019 has been another exceptional season with no loss of life on our beaches.

PREVENTATIVE ACTIONS AND WARNINGS

Our volunteers play an active role in preventing potentially life-threatening situations through the many preventative actions and warnings that are issued throughout patrols.

Preventative Actions are paramount to our success on the beach in ensuring that the beach going public not only remain safe but are also surf aware.

Overall there has been a decrease in People Warned – 25504 in 17/18 to 21802 in 18/19 (14.52% decrease overall). Conversely, we have seen a significant increase in Preventative Actions from 813 in 17/18 to 1344 in 18/19 (+65.31%).



FIRST AID TREATMENTS & MARINE STINGS

On top of rescues and preventative actions and rescues our volunteer life savers are regularly called upon to administer first aid for a variety of incidents including abrasions, marine stings, breaks/sprains and spinal/resuscitations.

In season 2018/2019 there were 318 first aid cases (27.89% decrease on 17/18) and 5151 Marine Stings (113.12% increase). This included the treatment of 318 cuts/abrasions.

Rainbow Bay SLSC has again treated the most first aid treatments and marine stings

The highest number of First Aid cases were treated in January (91) with the lowest number in September (6).

VISITATIONS

After two seasons of recorded decreases in beach visitations there has been an increase of 29.16%. A total of 605389 visitations overall were recorded in season 2018/2019, January has again posted the highest number of visitations (107783).

For the third consecutive season we have seen an increase in swimmers recorded outside of the flags (an overall increase of 20.9%). This is a worrying trend on our beaches and necessitates additional vigilance and service by our members. With the ever-increasing development on the Gold Coast there are more dwellings/infrastructure between our patrolled areas. Though, on a positive note the number of swimmers inside the flags has also increased.

RESCUES

In season 2018/2019 the Branch has posted an increase in rescues for the first time in four seasons. 108 rescues were recorded across the Branch (compared to 95 in season 17/18).

80.55% of rescues were performed outside the flags with January showcased as the busiest month for rescues (30.55%) with September as the quietest month with no recorded rescues.

Males were rescued more often than females – making up 56.48% of total rescues and the 6-10-year old were the age group rescued most often (24.07%).

Again – Swimming, Surfing and Body Boarding were the top three activities participated in during the rescue.

Coolangatta SLSC performed the highest number of rescues (25) and Bilinga SLSC the lowest number (1).

The Rescue Board continues to be most popular piece of rescue equipment used by Clubs and Members – making up 37.96% of total rescues, followed by Tube 28.70% and IRB (23.15%)



QFES/SUSTAINABILITY FUNDING

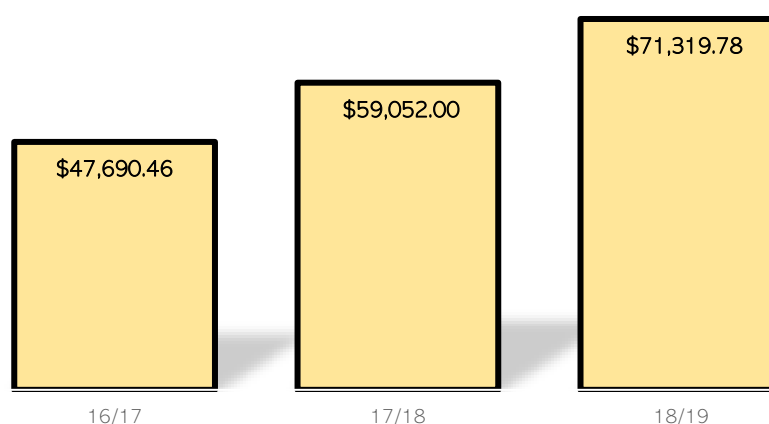
SLSQ Point Danger Branch clubs have again been proactive in applying to SLSQ under the QFES Sustainability Funding Program. These funds are used by Clubs to complement their patrol resources through the purchase of equipment or funding of existing expenditure i.e. fuel costs.

In season 2018/2019 \$71319.78 was gained by the Clubs and Branch through this program (an increase of \$12267.78 on season 17/18).

PATROL CLUB OF THE YEAR

As reported in the 2017/2018 Annual Report, Point Danger Branch made a significant change to the By-Laws to remove the Club Supervisors and include a Patrol Inspection Committee. Changes have also been made to the Patrol Inspection score sheet to ensure that all relevant updated items for patrols are included. This is a continual work in progress and any required changes will be discussed in the off-season.

The Patrol Inspection Committee format has ensured that all clubs have an equal number of inspections completed towards an increasingly consistent approach.

In conjunction with the Board of Life Saving - a further review will be carried out in the off season in relation the Patrol Club of the Year pointscore

The Patrol Club of the Year award (in its 13th year in the current format) is still proudly supported by Jann Stuckey MP (Member for Currumbin) with the provision of a ¾ Rescue Board for use by the winners each season.

Congratulations to Currumbin SLSC on winning in season 2018/2019.

PATROL SERVICE CONTRACTS

All Patrol Service Contracts were produced and endorsed this season with little change for any of the Clubs. Due to some events throughout the year including the Quiksilver/Roxy Pro and the moving of the Australian Championships – minor patrolling requirement changes were made as required in consultation with Clubs and the Gold Coast Life Saving Coordinator.

Two alleged patrol breaches were investigated however the actions of the clubs on the days ensured that these were not substantiated, and patrols continued as required.



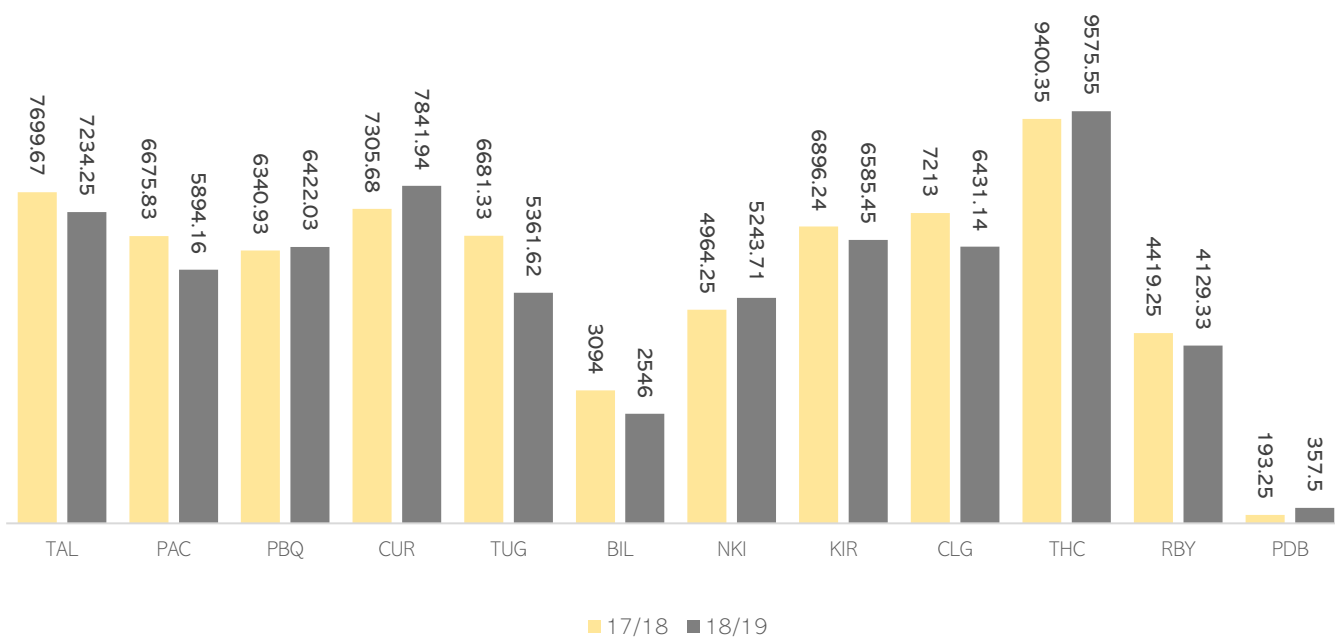
PATROL HOURS

TRAINING & EDUCATION

Point Danger Branch, through the 11 clubs and large number of Trainers and Assessors continue to deliver training and education opportunities for members. The Trainers and Assessors maintain a high standard of quality training whilst giving up many volunteer hours to achieve great results in this area.

The clubs are responsible for the delivery of Surf Rescue Certificate, Bronze Medallion/Certificate II, IRB Crewman, IRB Drivers, Radio Operators and Vehicle Inductions.

The Branch provides courses in Beach Management, Observers and Gold Medallion (Advanced Life Saving).

We also rely on SLSQ to provide courses in Emergency Care including CPR, Advanced Resuscitation and First Aid. To this end the Branch provides a full calendar of courses available to our members to ensure they have the necessary skills for patrols.

In season 2018/2019 the Branch ran the following

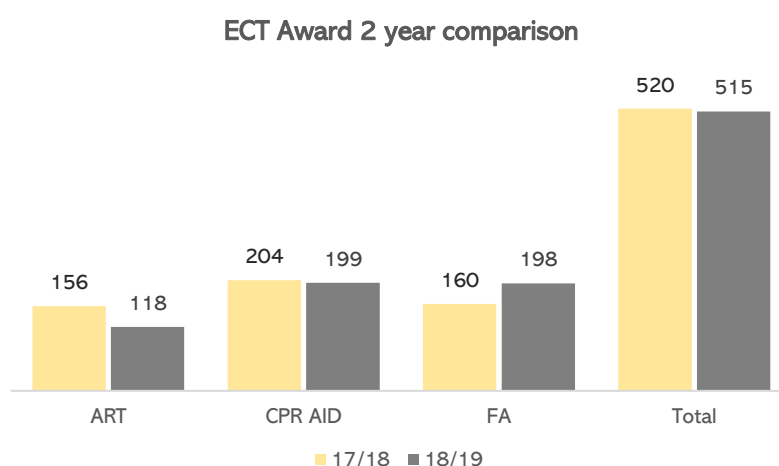
Overall the Branch has experienced an 4.58% increase in total Life Saving awards gained (1658 in 17/18 to 1734 in 18/19). This showcased a tremendous turn around by the Clubs and Trainers after experiencing a decrease of 41.05% from 16/17 to 17/18.

EMERGENCY CARE AWARDS

Emergency Care courses continue to be supported well by the members – noting that some changes in the eligibility for these courses changed in the latter half of season 18/19 whereby only patrolling members or members enrolled in a Bronze Medallion/Certificate II course can attend the courses for free.

A slight decrease of 0.96% in total Emergency Care Awards was reported throughout the season.

Advanced Resuscitation Techniques and Resuscitation Certificate showcased a decrease (24.36% and 2.45% respectively). First Aid awards experienced an increase of 23.75%.



VEHICLE AWARDS

In season 2018/2019 the ATV Operator Induction award experienced a name change to the SSV (Side by Side Vehicle) Induction. As such all members who held the ATV Operator Induction award, a current drivers licence and completed the annual skills maintenance were upgraded to this award. In total 713 members upgraded to the SSV Induction award and 94 new awards were processed.

Overall there was a 10.43% decrease of vehicle awards gained including a decrease of SSV Inductions of 19.65% (-23 awards), a 126.66% increase in 4WD Induction (+9 awards) and a decrease of 20.41% in Tractor Inductions (-20 awards).

OPERATIONAL AWARDS

The Branch focuses on six (6) main awards required for operational patrols including Bronze Medallion, Surf Rescue Certificate, Radio Operators Certificate, IRB Crewman, IRB Drivers and Beach Management.

After experiencing a decrease of 44.05% from season 16/17 to 17/18 – the clubs have made a significant turnaround in season 2018/2019 posting a 16.21% increase in operational awards gained.

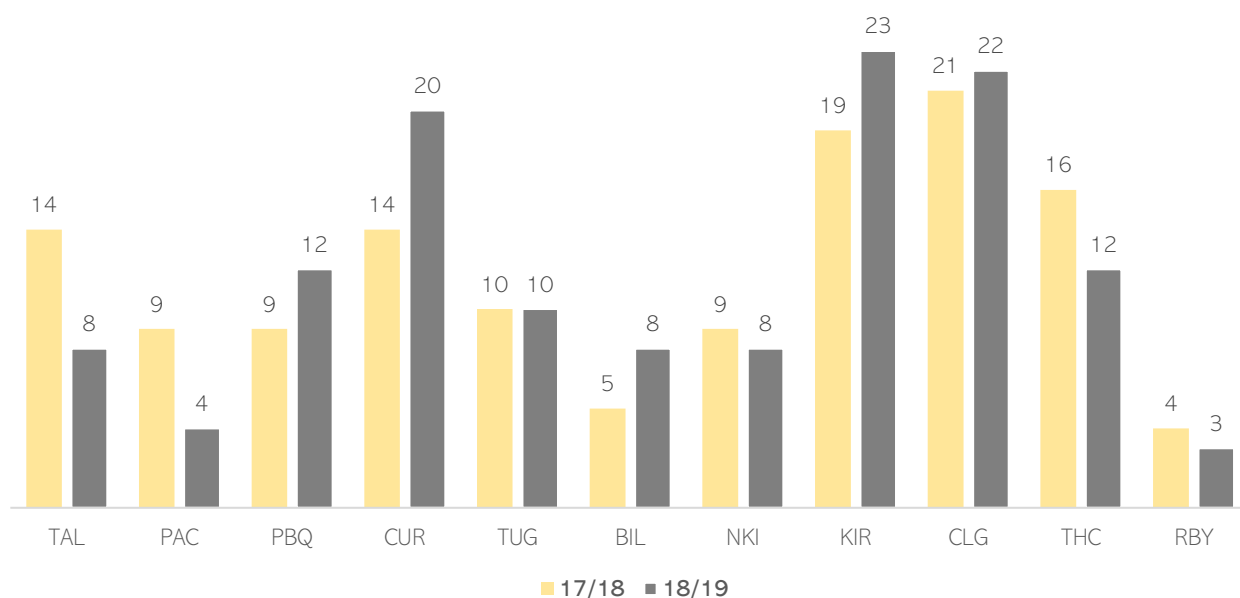
COURSES

In season 2018/2019 the clubs ran 140 courses and 39 upgrades (excluding ECT Courses). Courses are on par with season 2017/2018 (140) and upgrades run have increased from 30 in season 17/18 to 39 in 18/19. The Branch has been pro-active in ensuring all members hold the current Certificate II and relevant IRB Units of Competency. As such the number of upgrades have increased.

SLSQ Point Danger Branch records the status of the club's courses run and any paperwork errors in the Award/RTO Database. The error rate for season 2018/2019 was 4.46% (+0.34% on season 17/18). The Branch continues to support the Clubs and Trainers/Assessors with paperwork, follow up emails and retraining when needed.

An increase was noted in Bronze Medallion, 4WD Inductions, IRB Crewperson, SRC and Observers Courses. A decrease was noted in SSV Induction, IRB Drivers and Tractor Induction.

CLUB AWARDS

Five clubs have posted an increase in operational patrolling awards (compared to season 17/18 whereby no clubs posted an increase).

Clubs that have posted an increase are Currumbin SLSC (+102.48%), North Kirra SLSC (+48.84%), Kirra SLSC (+27.03%), TH&C SLSC (+11.41%) and Rainbow Bay SLSC (+4.44%).

Decreases were noted at Tallebudgera SLSC (-24.48%), Pacific SLSC (-31.21%), Palm Beach SLSC (-13.94%), Tugun SLSC (-36.07%), Bilinga SLSC (-9.09%) and Coolangatta SLSC (-16.93%).

Overall there was a combined increase of 5.76% in operational awards gained.

TRAINERS AND ASSESSORS

Due to Federal Government changes – there has been some significant upgrades required this season for Trainers, Assessors and Facilitators.

Members with a Certificate IV are required to hold a specific unit of competency (UOC) – TAEELN4111 -Address Adult language, literacy and numeracy skills. Eight members attended a full day upgrade course to gain this accreditation.

All members involved in assessments must hold specific UOC's including TAEASS502A – Design and Develop Assessment Tools. Assessors have been participating in the upgrades run by the SLSQ Education Team. These upgrades will continue in season 2019/2020.

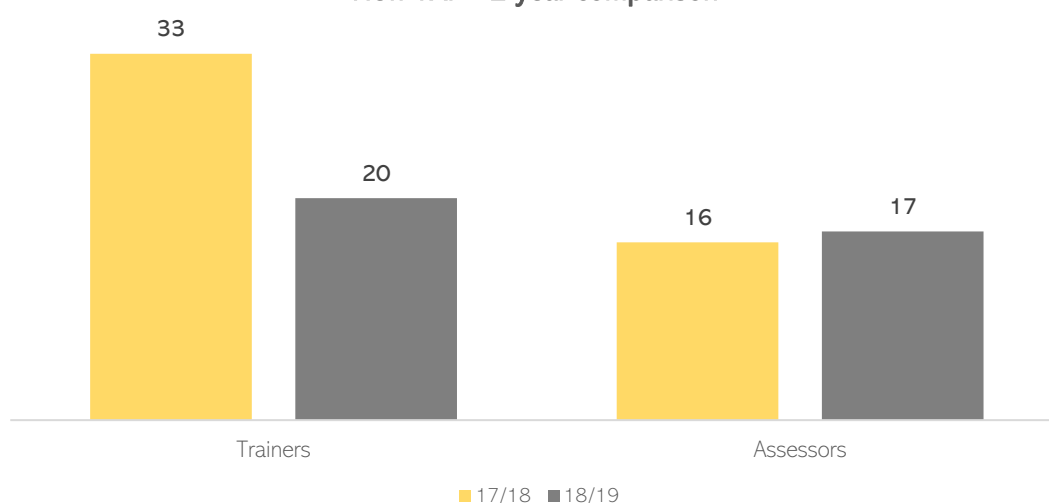
SLSQ, through the Life Saving Academy has been proactive in campaigning the government in relation to the Affect these changes will have on surf lifesaving as we will lose some volunteer Assessors due to the onerous requirements of the upgrade (a 3 day course).

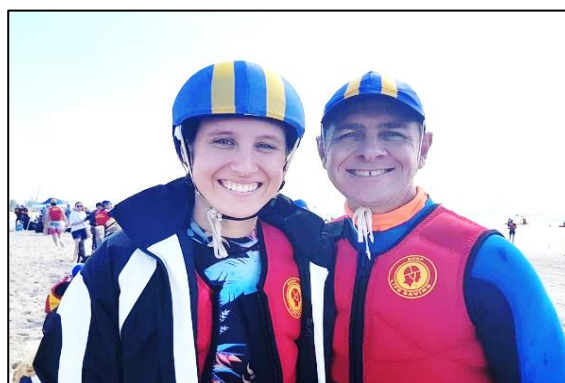

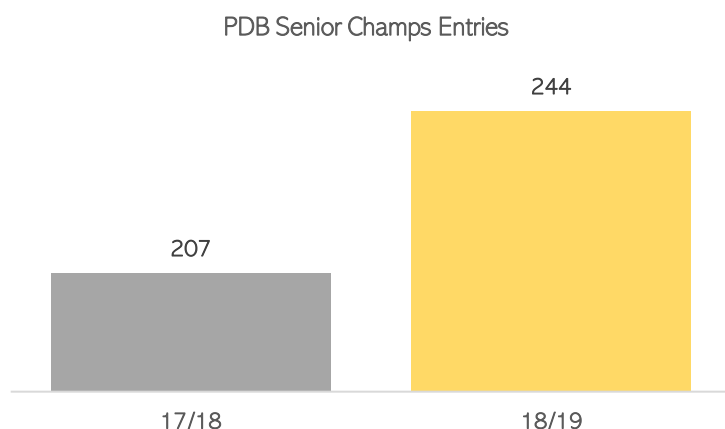


PDB SENIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

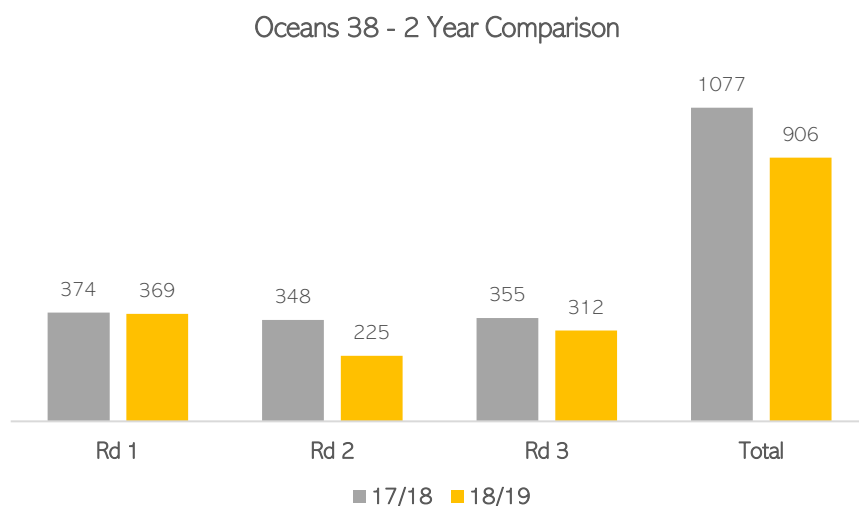
Overall there was a 19.61% increase in competitors from 2017/2018 (+37 members)

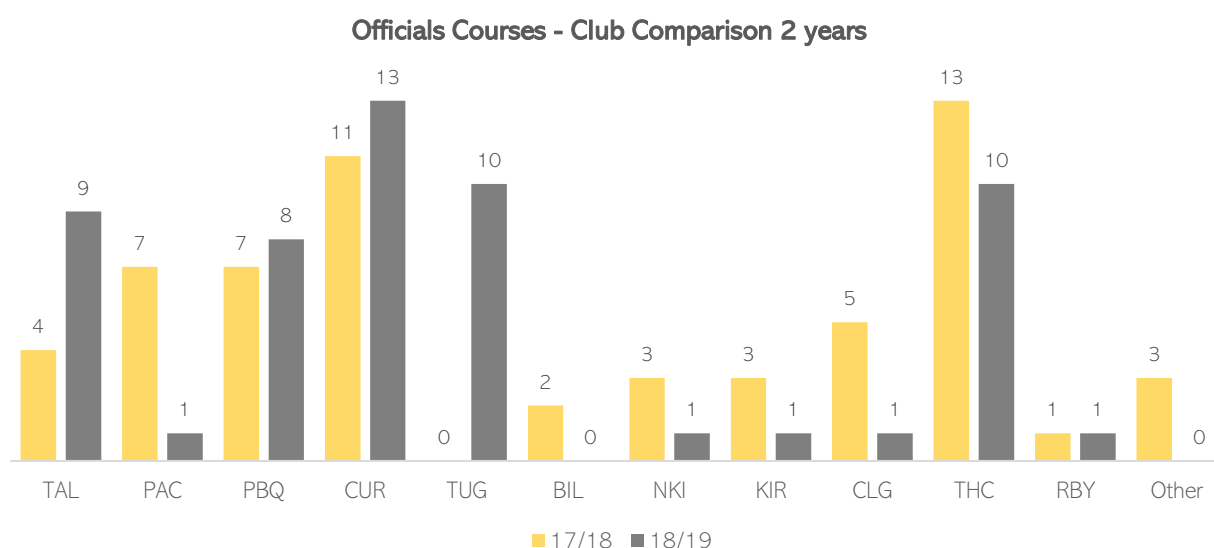

- TH&C SLSC : +27.99% (75 members)

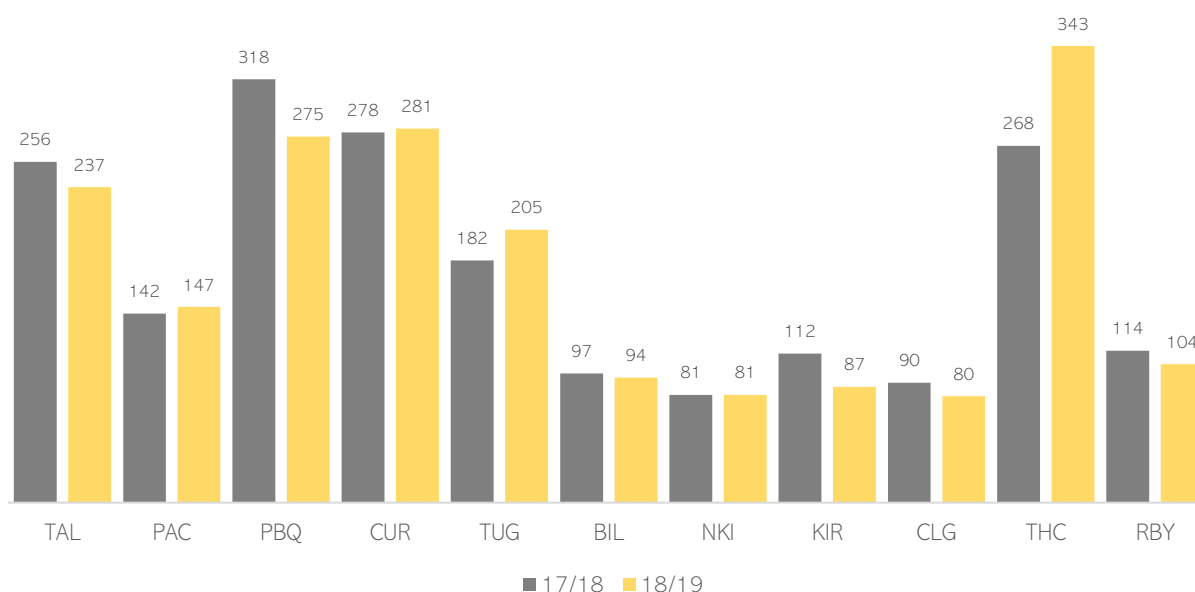

JUNIOR EDUCATION

The clubs continue to educate and develop the nippers in their pursuit to become active life savers.

As part of the Junior Development Activities Programs, nippers are given the opportunity to gain a junior development award each season; each member is encouraged to attain their respective age award. Those wishing to compete in inter-club events must complete their award prior to the close of entries of their respective Branch and/or State Championships

In total 1602 age awards were gained by the Nipper Members. (-62 awards on season 2017/2018).

Under 14 Nippers train for and gain the Surf Rescue Certificate (this is the minimum award required for patrols. In season 2018/2019 – 115 Under 14 members gained the Surf Rescue Certificate (+7 on season 2017/2018).

AGE MANAGERS

Through the annual Point Danger Branch Junior Review database – we track the progress of the Age Managers at each club and provide information to the clubs on a monthly basis to ensure the Age Managers gain the necessary prerequisites and are processed for their award.

Junior Surf Sports continues to be a major component in the development of our nipper's fitness, beach knowledge and surf skills.

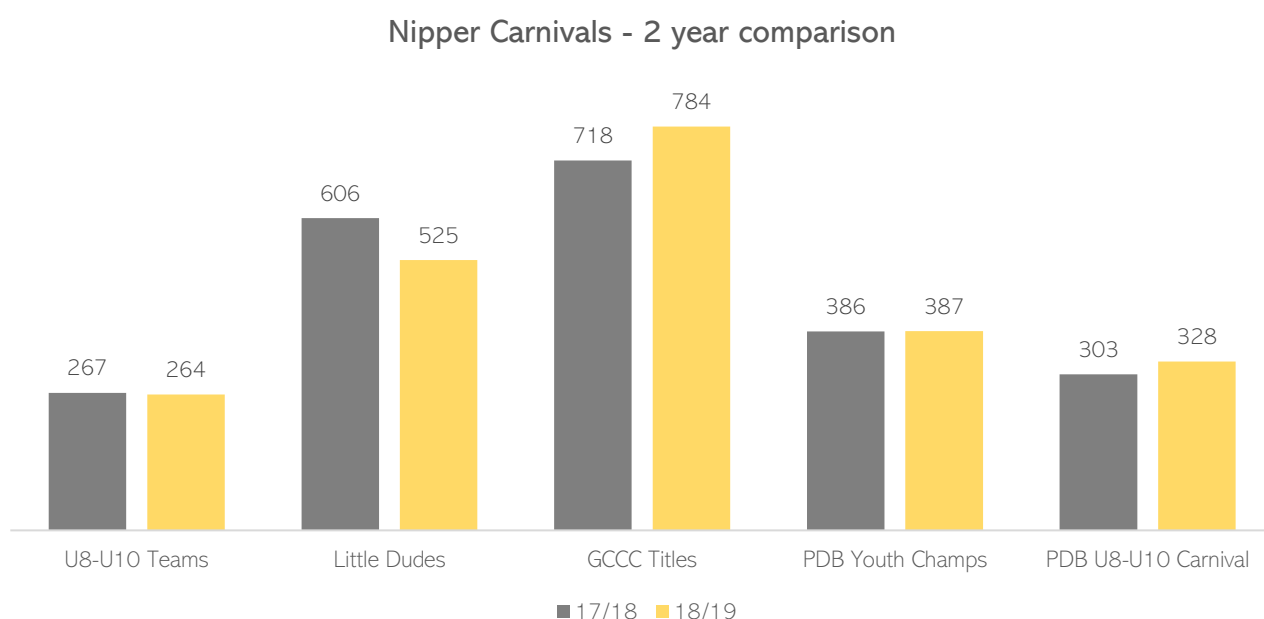

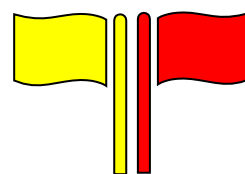

CLUB REPORTS – PACIFIC SLSC

2018/19 marks the 72nd Season that Pacific SLSC has been patrolling northern Palm Beach and the clubs has continued its mission of no lives lost between the flags, continued growth, whilst maintaining the club's family-oriented values and culture.

Membership recognition is a vital part of Pacific's strategic plan. During the off season, Pacific was again successful at the Point Danger Branch awards gaining awards including, U14 Life Saver of the Year Milly Beikoff Smart, Andy Frizzell OAM OBE Service to Junior Activities - Michelle Slattery, Trainer of the year Rachael Clark, Earle Smith Youth Service Award- Jessica Slattery, Clive Hammond Silver Medal - Jared Clark, Youth Development Club of the Year, and Patrol Club of the Year. At the SLSQ Awards of Excellence the Club picked up two major awards U14 Life Saver of the Year and Trainer of the Year. Late in the season Greg Bowers and Paul Mowbray received the McPherson award for their dedication and commitment to the community.

The Management team continues to deliver on the goals that are based on the club's five-year strategic plan, focusing on connecting with members & community, sustainable growth, governance, and maximising the recognition of club and member achievements and to deliver good outcomes in all facets of Surf Life Saving.

Membership of a club will always be the most valuable resource, and again this season Pacific SLSC has recorded growth in most areas with total membership now at 373 from 363 last season and Nippers at 146 up from 142. Importantly, since 2015 the Club has had an amazing increase of 152% on total membership from 245 to 373.

Through the fantastic leadership of Club Captain and Chief Training Officer, the club continues to set high standards with beach patrols and the level of skill need to maintain proficiency. This season the Club completed 5776 hours of patrol, an additional 424 Operational support hours, 8 rescues ,47 prevented actions and 110 Life Saving awards.

Pacific's financial position continues to be solid, This season the club through donations and grants secured \$110000 that was invested back into rescue equipment, building renovations, and equipment for the training room. The Pacific Board and its members are extremely grateful to all levels of government and individuals that have contributed in some way.

The nipper program continues to provide a valuable impetus in creating an environment that still continues to increase the number of young life savers coming through this valuable program. The Club had another successful year in nipper surf sports at all levels,

Youth development continues to be part of the clubs ongoing success. The Club send sent members to Gold Coast and SLSQ Camps and a number of youth members attend the Gold Coast Youth Ball.

Results in surf sports continue to go from strength to strength which seen the club again produce results way above its weight. The club competed and medaled at all levels at - Branch, State and National as well as hosting the PDB U8-U10 Teams Carnival and Surf Rescue Championships.

The challenge as a club is to keep on delivering and ensure that there are resources and foresight to keep on exceeding member and community expectations.

CLUB REPORTS – PALM BEACH SLSC

Palm Beach Surf Life Saving Club has had another very strong year thanks to the passion that the committee and members have for the Club. Palm Beach SLSC has continued to operate from the Strategic plan and invoke the club Mission statement - "To Protect, Educate, and Develop our Members and The Community" in all decisions made.

This season saw a 24.58% increase in beach visitations to Palm Beach SLSC, however rescues have been kept on par with season 2017/2018 due to increased vigilance which have seen the preventative actions rise by 25.42%.

Palm Beach Active Members also provided 12 patrols to Rainbow Bay SLSC - which they thoroughly enjoyed doing. Palm Beach SLSC is also thankful to all the clubs who have provided the club with assistance throughout the season. Our lifesaving community is something to be loved.

Through the dedication of the Director of Surf Sports and Coaches – the Palm Beach Surf Sports program is going from strength to strength from Nippers through to Masters.

The Palm Beach SLSC nippers finished the Queensland Youth Championships in a significantly higher position than previous years. The Masters team came in sixth in the Queensland Masters Championships continuing on the strong growth path. The team carried this through to the Australian Championships with the team bringing home more medals.

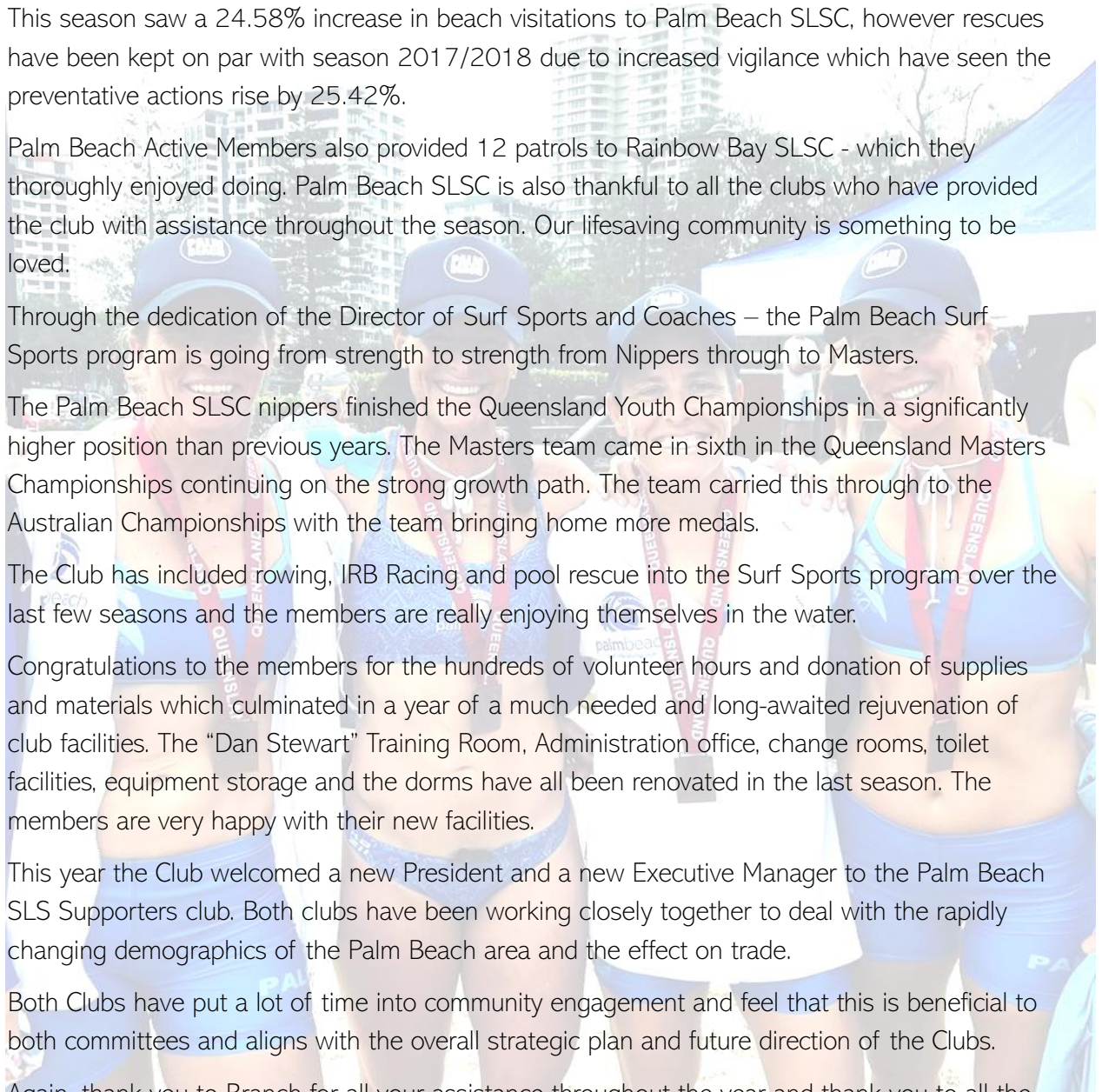
The Club has included rowing, IRB Racing and pool rescue into the Surf Sports program over the last few seasons and the members are really enjoying themselves in the water.

CLUB REPORTS – CURRUMBIN SLSC

It was another year of growth and success for Currumbin SLSC. First and foremost the Club again achieved its number one goal and purpose of zero fatalities at Currumbin Beach. In doing so the members contributed 7641 volunteer lifesaving patrol hours across the season with 37 rescues and first aid treatments performed with 2063 further preventative actions undertaken.

The Club achieved an overall membership increase of 7 per cent this season and an increase of 102.5 per cent in new lifesaving awards gained with 47 new Bronze Medallion and 38 new SRC members joining the patrolling ranks. The Club trainers and assessors have done a tremendous job this season in up skilling the volunteers and ensuring that the patrol strength continues.

Currumbin SLSC had another successful surf sports season, taking out the overall point score at the Australian Pool Rescue Championships for the fifth year in a row and finishing runner up Club on the overall point score at the 2018 Lifesaving World Championships. In addition to this the Club also took out the Handicap Pointscore for the Queensland Surf Rescue Championships and Board Riding Championships - showcasing the depth in surf sports across multi-faceted programs.

This season saw the delivery of another hugely successful nipper program with the nippers and youth members again winning the Queensland Youth Championships, defending the title the Club in 2018. Nippers are the future lifesavers and competitors and it is important that the club harnesses the potential that lies in this area of the Club.

The Club reinvested in the Supporters Club in 2019 with the licensed venue receiving a major upgrade prior to the end of the 2018/2019 financial year. These works were undertaken to enhance the facilities and service provided by our Supporters Association, whose profits are solely used for the purpose of funding the Surf Lifesaving Clubs training and education, lifesaving programs and activities.

The Club continues to look for ways to be financially sustainable with a diversification strategy at the forefront of the latest Strategic Plan. A number of business plans have been tabled and discussed at Club Council and General Meetings throughout the season. The options presented have been targeted at utilising strengths and skillsets already incorporated within our core competencies as a Club through our staff and membership base.

The Club was fortunate enough to receive a number of grants in season 2018/2019 to assist with upgrading Club facilities and delivering lifesaving programs.

Without doubt the sustained and ongoing success of Currumbin SLSC is attributed to the sound direction set by the Club Council, the dedication of the clubs staff members and the support shown by volunteer Club members and Supporters Association members. The Club is again in a strong position heading into our milestone 100th season!

CLUB REPORTS – TUGUN SLSC

The 2018-2019 season has been another eventful year at Tugun SLSC with numerous carnivals and events keeping the club and members busy.

The Club's Board of Directors have showcased tremendous commitment and energy in the day to day running of the club, working tirelessly behind the scenes all season to ensure the Club meets its commitments and requirements.

Many thanks to Tugun SLSC members and volunteers, a number of whom travel from Brisbane and other regions to patrol Tugun beach.

Tugun SLSC Volunteer lifesavers have completed approximately 5000 volunteer patrolling hours and without these members Tugun SLSC simply would not exist as a club. Across the Club, the volunteer's efforts enable the Club to fulfil all required commitments to SLSA, SLSQ, Point Danger Branch, Gold Coast City Council and the community.

It was extremely pleasing to see the Nippers significantly increase the membership numbers this season by 13% - one of only four clubs in the Branch to post an increase in Nippers.

The Nippers have had their best season for many years showcasing excellent results both on and of the beach. Without the dedication of the Junior Committee and help from the ever-growing nipper family of volunteers, Tugun SLSC would not have been able to achieve half of what was achieved this season.

From the number of parents completing their Bronze Medallions, enabling them to patrol Tugun beach, to the large group qualifying for the Officials Accreditations was notable. The results being achieved by the Nippers at surf sports events over the season has been impressive and provides the Club with a positive outlook for the future.

It is great to see the growth of surf sports again at Tugun SLSC, particularly in the Nipper and master's Competitors. The Senior Water Section had a positive season with training numbers growing and making finals at State and Australian Championships, including the Open Male Taplin. It was pleasing to have the Tugun SLSC Masters competitors come away with medals at the Australian Championships.

The growing interest in the beach section across the nippers and master's areas of the Club has been extremely positive this season. The Tugun Surf Boat section has had another successful season, with the Open Women's team winning the point score for both the Queensland Navy series and Queensland Cup, and the 260+ Boat crew picking up the silver medal at Australian Championships.

On the Administrative front, the Surf Club has been working closely with the Supporters Club to renew the sub-lease and have commenced the process for installation of lifts at the Club. A new Club Office Manager was employed this season, who officially commenced in September 2018.

On behalf of the Club – thanks to Point Danger Branch for all their patience and support of the Club and the new administrator over the season.

CLUB REPORTS – BILINGA SLSC

In season 2018/19 Bilinga SLSC celebrated 80 years of saving lives on the 20 October 2018. The day witnessed over 120 members, past members, family and friends enjoying the 80th year anniversary. From the humbled beginnings in February 1938 when the Club was known as the Bilinga Railways Surf Club, Bilinga has survived many trials and tribulations over the years, but the clubs are continuing to provide lifesaving presence on the beach at Bilinga.

Bilinga SLSC has a total membership of 236 members - a small club compared to other clubs within our Branch and the South Coast Branch. In the past, the membership issue is a concern but at the end of the day it has been accepted that this is Bilinga and as a Club and Executive, Bilinga SLSC is providing a place in the community for the 236 members - young and old lifesavers that participate in the life saving activities, Nippers and parents to enjoy the beach, teach surf awareness and safety and provide a safe environment for the community who choose to visit Bilinga SLSC beach. Bilinga is a strong traditional family club.

Statistically the past season the club continued the trend with a decrease of 9% in operational awards. The overall total membership was 236 compared to 237 (7.4%) and the Nipper population decreased 3% - 97 to 94. The active members had a slight fall from 41 to 39 members.

Bilinga SLSC patrolling members performed a commendable service to the community on and off the beach this season. The Club is fortunate to have dedicated support from the Point Danger Branch Patrol Group and Brisbane Lifesaving in providing the extra numbers to complement the patrols roster and allow the club to comply with the Patrol Service Contract. Gratitude is extended to both groups in their valued support in providing a presence on Bilinga beach.

The season 2018/2019 saw Bilinga successful in attaining several grants to improve the amenities at the club. Through the continued support from Hon Karen Andrews Federal Member for McPherson the club received a significant grant under the Safer Communities where we can install a CCTV/Security System, replace the front main entry glass doors and install a security screen. In addition, a Volunteer Grant was received which will allow the club to purchase a TV for training purposes, portable PA, cupboards and general kitchen equipment. It is envisaged that all improvements to the club will provide a more serviceable and safer facility to membership and visitors.

Bilinga SLSC hosted several carnivals during the season from Ocean38, Little Dudes and by default due to weather conditions the Queensland Surf Rescue Championships which was transferred from Mermaid Beach which was a busy weekend for the club. All carnivals highlighted that Bilinga SLSC has the capability to hold carnivals within the Branch and State.

Appreciation is extended to the Point Danger Branch team who have provided support to the club during the season. In addition, thanks to neighbouring clubs – Tugun SLSC and North Kirra SLSC for assistance during the season of 2018/19.

CLUB REPORTS – NORTH KIRRA SLSC

The highlight of the season was the 70th Anniversary celebration in May to acknowledge this milestone. It was truly remarkable to see so many past and present members attend to recognise the club's history, to celebrate the contribution and dedication of so many members over the decades and to reinforce the current success of the Club.

Junior activities member numbers were consistent this season, but the smiles on the nippers faces prove that the clubs small, supportive and encouraging environment works. The nippers are to be congratulated on their enthusiasm and effort and it is great to see them always representing North Kirra with pride. The club has had some great results this season.

Once again this season, a handful of members achieved an exceptional amount of patrol hours. This season there was a large improvement in the total awards that were assessed which goes a long way to supporting future patrolling requirements. With 18 new Bronze members and a few more IRB drivers, the Club now has 11 patrol groups and the addition of a 12th group in season 2019/2020. Special thanks to the Club Captain in ensuring that patrol obligations were met at all times. Thanks are extended to Kirra SLSC for their patrol assistance over the season, helping out with Sunday afternoon patrols. Their continued assistance again this season is testament to the lifesaving community particularly in the Point Danger Branch.

Thanks, must also go to the Club Chief Training Officer. Training is such a crucial role that involves a lot of time.

In the Surf Sports arena, for the 2nd year in a row, North Kirra was the overall Points Champion for the Point Danger Branch Surf Rescue Championships. This carnival truly represents what lifesaving is all about and tests those valuable skill. Whilst there wasn't a lot of other competition involvement from our Seniors and Masters this season, the Club had a number of great results from nippers at Branch and State level. The Club looks forward to seeing the growth of these competitors next season and hope the coaching opportunities that were introduced at the Club this year will continue to assist in this area.

Overall, the Committee are really proud of what the Club is achieving. Like all clubs there are committed members who turn up each week and give their time voluntarily. But further to that, the club has a Patron who is always supportive and is the glue to the history of the club.

North Kirra has a relaxed and fun atmosphere with members who want to be here – whether they are involving themselves in the banter of the Bumper Kermond Handicap Surf Swim, catching up with fellow members at socials or bringing their kids to nippers. North Kirra SLSC also have strong financial viability based on many years of responsible management. It is rewarding to have the opportunity to reinvest in not only the future of the Supporters Club as the major financial supporter but also in our members and the facilities we have available to them.

Thanks are extended to the current members and those that came before us for their contribution to North Kirra SLSC. The Club continues to grow in all facets and the committee have worked tirelessly to this end.

CLUB REPORTS – KIRRA SLSC

Kirra SLSC's 103rd Season has been one of ups and downs, but more importantly mostly ups.

With the Clubs history and architecture of the 83 year old Gold Coast Icon – Surf Life Saving has evolved immensely since 1936 and the building cannot meet the Clubs current or future needs. The club has been in discussion with the Gold Coast City Council and they have offered to take a green field approach to the existing area and see if a reconfiguration would be better suit the clubs needs for now and into the future. In December 2017 extensive works were carried out on the structure of the club courtesy of the City of Gold Coast.

The club is immensely proud of the members who have not only patrolled but represented the Club in the Surf Sports arena There has been a number of members and teams who have won Branch, State and Australian Titles over the past season. The Club has also had members chosen to represent Queensland in the State IRB Development Team. Congratulations are extended to all of the members who have proudly represented Kirra SLSC in the varying disciplines.

Kirra SLSC has a small but dedicated group of Nippers and the focus in season 2019/2020 will be a rebuilding phase for the Nippers with a view to increasing numbers for the Club.

With the Clubs diversity, the members come together as a strong and supportive community that provide an essential community service. The club is looking forward to its 104th season and to see Kirra SLSC reach new heights of achievement.

CLUB REPORTS – COOLANGATTA SLSC

Coolangatta SLSC can once again proudly boast that there were no lives lost on our beach throughout the 2018/19 patrolling season.

Coolangatta Lifesavers put in a massive 6,528 hours patrolling our beach over the summer period. The members completed 25 rescues, performed 72 preventative actions, 23 First Aid Treatments, treated 421 people for Marine Stings and warned 3,364 people about possible dangers that could have easily ended up becoming a rescue.

Total membership was down again this year with 372 overall members; of these there were 80 Nippers, 179 Patrolling members and 59 Associate members. The Club will endeavour to promote and build Coolangatta Surf Life Savings Club's good name again this coming season and hopefully attract more new members to the club.

Bronzies Day is combined with the Annual Fallen Lifesavers Memorial Day. This very special day was held on the morning of the 5th May and is becoming bigger and bigger every year recognising the new Bronze holders of Coolangatta SLSC and remembering fallen lifesavers and family members who have passed away this season.

Coolangatta's Chief Training Officer has again achieved some fantastic results for the Club with 28 Bronze Medallions, 26 ART, 18 SSV, 32 First Aid, 26 Radio, 30 CPR, 12 Beach Management, 17 Tractor, 8 SRC, 10 IRBC and 4 IRBD awards completed. Thanks to all Club Assessors and Trainers who assisted with training, assessments and proficiencies throughout the season.

The Supporters Club is running the best it ever has under the guidance of a new General Manager and the Supporters Club Committee. This season joint committee meetings have been held every three months and this has proven to be very successful and will continue in the future.

A team of 32 competitors competed at the Australian Championships with some great individual achievements including a host of medal winners. The Club competed in a wide number of events including Surfing, Surf Boats, Champion Lifesaver plus all of the normal carnival events.

Congratulations and thanks must also go to the TH&C SLSC board and committee members both Junior and Senior as that have contributed towards the operations of the Club. Through the efforts with Grants and Fundraising TH&C SLSC have also been able to purchase an ATV, Surf Boat and trailer, 2 x IRB Motors, 1 x IRB, 9 new long boards, 14 new short boards and a ski plus the latest training equipment.

Thanks, must go to the incredible TH&C Old Boys for their continual support with a willing workforce whenever needed and also financial support with the purchases of some of our equipment.

TH&C SLSC is grateful for the relationship with the Greenmount Surf Club and sincerely thank them for their efforts and professionalism in supporting the club. The Club is also grateful of the support that is received from local members at Council, State and Federal level.

Thanks also to Ken Hunter, Kerrie Barnes and her team who are always there for us when we need them at Point Danger Branch.

There is no off season for the Club this year and the Club is excited to announce that the Building Committee have been successful in securing a Federal Grant to the value of \$107 000.00 to assist in building new storage at the rear of the club soon.

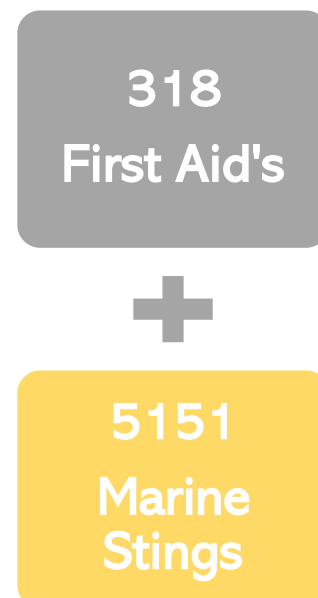
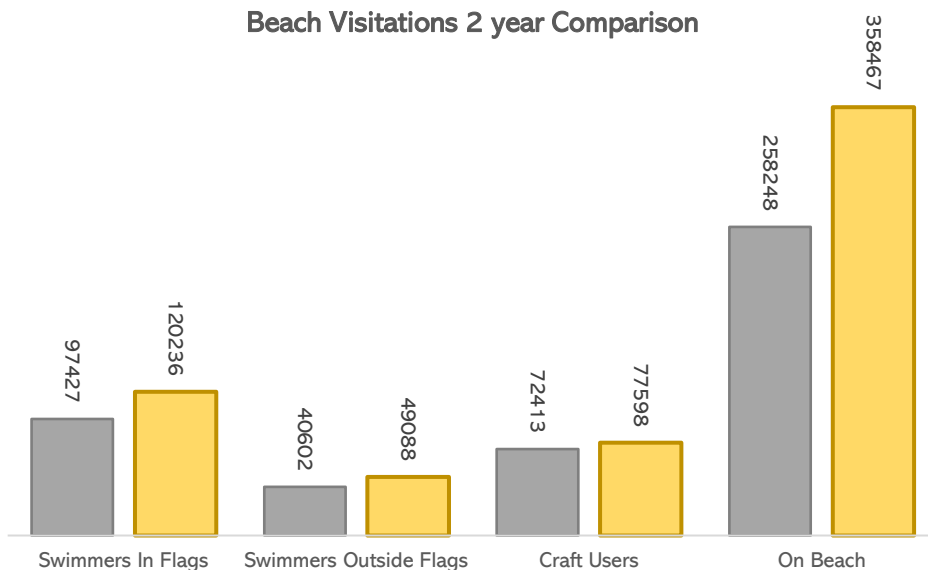
Rescue Monthly - 2 year Comparison

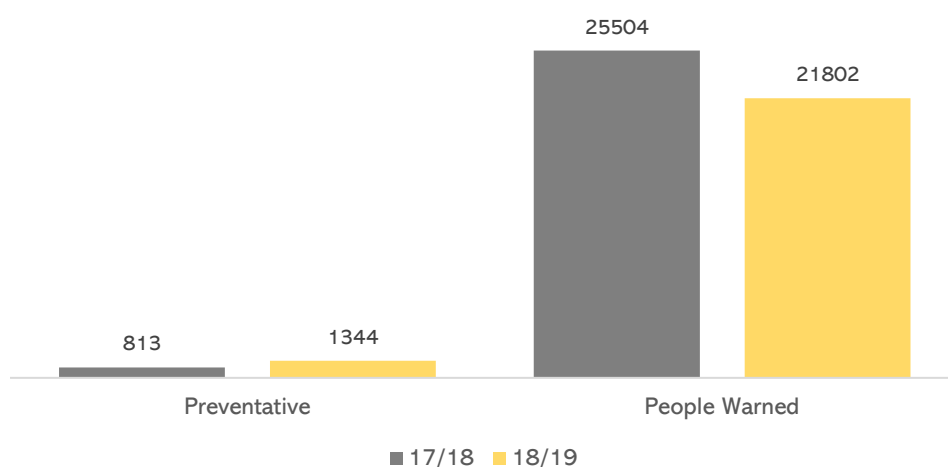
Beach Visitations 2 year Comparison

Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The Management Committee of the Club prepared the financial statements of the club on the basis that the club is a non-reporting entity because there are no users dependant on general purpose financial statements. The financial statements are therefore special purpose financial statements that have been prepared in order to meet the requirements of the trust deed, the information needs of the stakeholders and for the basis of preparation of the income tax return.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the significant accounting policies disclosed below, which the Management Committee of the Club determined are appropriate to meet the purposes of preparation. Such accounting policies are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs unless otherwise stated in the notes. The accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of the statements are as follows:

(a) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Property, Plant and Equipment are carried at cost or at independent or Management Committee of the Club valuation. All assets, excluding freehold land and buildings are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the trust. Increases in the carrying amount arising on revaluation of land and buildings are credited to a revaluation reserve in shareholders' equity. Decreases that offset previous increases of the same asset are charged against fair value reserves directly in equity; all other decreases are charged to the income statement. Each year the difference between depreciation based on the revalued carrying amount of the assets charged to the income statement and depreciation based on the asset's original cost is transferred from the revaluation reserve to retained earnings. The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by ***Please enter Trustee details in 'Notes to the Financial Statements' screen.*** to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the asset's employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted in determining recoverable amounts.

(b) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities on the balance sheet.

(c) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which, for floating rate financial assets, is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Revenue recognised related to the provision of services is determined with reference to the stage of completion of the transaction at the reporting date and where outcome of the contract can be estimated reliably. Stage of completion is determined with reference to the services performed to date as a percentage of total anticipated services to be performed. Where the outcome cannot be estimated reliably, revenue is recognised only to the extent that related expenditure is recoverable.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(d) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Tax Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the balance sheet are shown inclusive of GST.

(c) Employee Benefits
